## CLARKSON RETURNS to ACTION with SIGHTS SET on TOURNAMENT CROWN

After a 19-day break for exams and the holidays, the **Clarkson University Hockey** team will return to action on December 30 with hopes of claiming its first holiday tournament championship since 1995. The **Golden Knights** will battle three highly competitive teams at the **Sheraton/TD Banknorth Tournament** at Gutterson Fieldhouse in Burlington, VT in the final weekend of the 2005 portion of the schedule. Clarkson will faceoff against College Hockey America power Bemidji State in opening round action on Friday, beginning at 4:00 p.m. In the other semifinal game, the host Catamounts of the University of Vermont from Hockey East will take on former **ECAC Hockey League** rival Dartmouth College at 7:00 p.m. Winners of the first round will meet in Saturday's championship game at 7:00 p.m., after the consolation game at 4:00 p.m.

Enjoying its best start since the mid-1990s, Clarkson entered the break with a 10-5-1 overall record and has gained the recognition of the national polls with a top-15 ranking. The Golden Knights closed out the first half of the ECAC Hockey League schedule tied for fourth in the standings with a 5-2-1 conference mark. Guided by third-year head coach **George Roll**, associate coach **Greg Drechsel** and assistant coach **Jean-Francois Houle**, the Knights are ranked 15th in both the December 19 **USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll** and **USCHO.com/CSTV Division I Men's Poll**.

In their last action before participating in the Sheraton/TD Banknorth Tournament, the Knights split a pair of non-league games in Ohio. On December 9, Clarkson overcame an early 3-0 second-period deficit to Bowling Green to gain a 6-4 victory. The following night, the **Green and Gold** took a 1-0 lead over Miami, but eventually fell to the number-two ranked RedHawks 2-1 in Oxford.

Led by senior captain **Chris Brekelmans** (London, ONT) and assistant captains, senior **Jeff Genovy** (Kalamazoo, MI) and sophomore **Nick Dodge** (Oakville, ONT), the Knights have developed into one of the more surprising teams in the country this season.

Clarkson has relied upon a balanced offense, stingy defense and improved specialty teams play as it has shown a marked improvement from last year's 13-23-3 team. Ten different Knights have reached double figures in the scoring column. Dodge leads the way with 19 points, including a team-high 12 assists. One of the top rookies in the country, freshman **Shea Guthrie** (Carleton Place, ONT) helps to pace the Clarkson offense, which ranks first in the ECACHL in overall scoring (3.75 GPG), with 17 points on six goals and 11 assists. Genovy also chips in 17 points, including a team-high five power-play goals.

Defensively, the Knights, who regularly play three freshmen and a sophomore on the blueline, are allowing 2.88 GPG, fourth best overall in the conference. Clarkson has been backboned by the steady goaltending play of junior **Kyle McNulty** (Wakefield, RI) and sophomore **David Leggio** (Williamsville, NY). McNulty has started nine games and posts a .913 save percentage and a 2.36 goals against average en route to a 6-3 record. Through seven starts, Leggio holds a .895 save percentage, a 3.24 GAA and a 4-2-1 mark.

The Knights boast the third-best power play in the ECACHL, which is clicking at 21.6% (24-111). Along with Genovy, sophomore **Steve Zalewski** (New Hartford, NY) helps power the unit with four man-advantage markers. Dodge and sophomore **Shawn Weller** (South Glens Falls, NY) have chipped in three power-play goals each. Clarkson's penalty kill, which has snuffed out 41 of 43 opponent power plays over the past seven games, is ranked third in the league at 86% (106-123).

Last year's CHA champions, the **Beavers** from **Bemidji State** have steadily improved since making the move to Division I in 1999-2000 and came very close to knocking off eventual national champion Denver in last year's NCAA Tournament, falling to the Pioneers 4-3 in overtime in the Northeast Regional Semifinal. Guided by fifth-year head coach **Tom Serratore**, Bemidji State is once again pushing for national recognition with a 9-6-1 overall record and a second-place 4-2 conference mark. After starting out with a 7-1 record, Bemidji State has cooled off with just a 2-5-1 mark since mid-November, including a four-game winless skid (0-3-1) heading into the break. In their last action before the tournament, the Beavers dropped a weekend home-and-home series against 10th-ranked North Dakota on December 16-17. In the first game, Bemidji State held a 35-30 shot advantage, but the Fighting Sioux were able to overcome an early 1-0 deficit to gain a 2-1 victory in Bemidji. The next night, North Dakota relied upon strong specialty teams play en route to a 5-1 win over the Beavers in Grand Forks.

The **University of Vermont** is certainly making its presence felt during its first year in Hockey East after competing in the ECAC Hockey League since the 1974-75 campaign. Guided by third-year head coach **Kevin Sneddon**, the **Catamounts** are ranked fifth in the nation with an 11-4-1 overall record. The Cats stand in fourth place in their league with a 5-3-1 HEA mark. In its last action before the break, UVM suffered its third loss of the season at home when former ECACHL foe St. Lawrence gained a 2-1 victory at Gutterson on December 17, halting a three-game unbeaten streak (2-0-1) by the Catamounts.

After struggling with a 0-4 record to start the season, the **Dartmouth College Big Green** are beginning to live up to their lofty expectations. The lone team in the tournament to enter the weekend with a win its last game, ninth-year head coach **Bob Gaudet**'s squad is coming off a very convincing 5-1 triumph over Harvard in Hanover on December 16. Dartmouth owns a 5-7 overall record and is one point behind Clarkson in the ECACHL standings with a 5-5 conference mark. The Big Green are 5-3 since November 12 with a 4-0 shutout over the Golden Knights at Cheel Arena included in that span.

#### — THE SERIES: —

Clarkson and Bemidji State have played just four times with the Knights holding a 2-1-1 advantage. The Beavers won the opening game of the series with a 2-1 victory at Cheel Arena on November 22, 2002, but the Green and Gold have gone 2-0-1 in the last three encounters. In their last games, Clarkson skated to a 4-2 win at Bemidji State on November 18 and then tied the Beavers 1-1 on the Hohn S. Glas Fieldhouse ice the following night. **Jeff Genovy** is the only current Golden Knight to have scored a goal against Bemidji State. This will be the teams first meeting on neutral ice. George Roll is 1-0-1 against Bemidji State, while coach Tom Serratore is 1-2-1 against Clarkson.

Clarkson holds a commanding 52-24-2 lead in the series against Vermont, which began with a 5-3 win for the Knights on January 13, 1971 in Potsdam. Clarkson is 2-1-1 against the Catamounts over the last two seasons after going 1-3 against UVM in 2002-03. The Cats hold a slight 7-6-1 advantage in the 2000s. In their last meeting, the Knights, behind two goals from **Nick Dodge**, rallied for a 3-2 win in Burlington last February 11. Clarkson and Vermont also skated to a 1-1 tie in Potsdam on November 13 of last season. **Mike Sullivan** is the Green and Gold's leading scorer against the Cats with three points (1-2). The Knights own a 22-10-1 record all time at Gutterson Fieldhouse. George Roll is 2-1-1 against Vermont, while Kevin Sneddon, who coached for five years at Union prior to coming to UVM, is 4-7-3 against Clarkson.

The Knights lead Dartmouth in their overall series, which began with a 4-1 Clarkson win on February 4, 1929, 59-19-5. The Big Green, however, have held the upper hand in recent meetings with a 3-1-1 mark since the start of the 2003-04 campaign. In their first meeting this year, Dartmouth handed Clarkson its first shutout of the season, and only it's second of the series, a 4-0 loss at Cheel Arena on November 26. Last season, the Knights' snapped out of a three-game winless skid (0-2-1) against the Big Green with a 4-1 victory at Cheel on November 12. Dartmouth, however, gained a split in the regular-season series with a 5-1 win at Thompson Arena on February 12. **Brodie Rutherglen** has recorded a team-high three points (0-3) against the Big Green. George Roll is 1-3-1 against Dartmouth, while Bob Gaudet, who also coached at Brown, is 8-22-5 against the Knights.

## KNIGHT NOTES:

Beginning with the Sheraton/TD Banknorth Tournament, Clarkson will play 10 of its next 12 games away from Cheel Arena ... The Knights are 3-3 on the road this season ... Clarkson posted a 7-2-1 mark at home in the 2005 portion of the schedule after going 6-6-3 at Cheel for all of the 2004-05 campaign ... The Knights' will play eight games, possibly nine, against teams ranked in the Top 20 of the December 19 USCHO.com poll in their remaining 18 regular season contests ... Clarkson's offense is the most productive overall in the ECACHL and fourth in the nation, averaging 3.75 goals per game ... Clarkson's sophomore and freshman classes have combined to account for 65% of the Knights' offense. The Class of 2008 has tallied 29 goals and 42 assists (44%), while the rookies have totaled 10 goals and 24 assists (21%) ... Assistant captain **Nick Dodge** is perhaps Clarkson's best all around player. He leads the Knights in scoring with 19 points on seven goals and a team-high 12 assists through 16 games. He excels on specialty teams, where he has three power-play tallies and is among the national leaders in shorthanded points with two goals and one assist in man-down situations. Dodge also ranks among Clarkson's top faceoff specialist by winning 56% of his draws and posts a +6 plus/minus rating ... **Shea Guthrie** is the leading freshman scorer in the ECACHL in points per game, both overall and in conference play, and fifth-leading rookie scorer nationally with 17 points (6-11) through 15 games and nine league points (4-5) in eight league contests ... **Jeff Genovy**, who tallied one goal and two assists in the win at Bowling Green, has made a dramatic improvement from last year. An assistant captain this season, he has recorded 17 points on six goals and 11 assists through 16 games after scoring just seven points (3-4) through 25 games last season. He leads the Knights' in power-play goals with five and has recorded 11 of his 16 career goals with the man advantage ... **Shawn Weller** has a team-high 10 goals for the Green and Gold, including a team-high three game-winners. Weller has already equaled last year's point total of 14, which included only three goals through 33 games ... Sophomore **Grant Clitsome** (Gloucester, ONT) leads the Green and Gold in scoring from defensemen with 10 points on two goals and eight assists ... Junior **Michael Grenzy** (Lockport, NY), who picked up his second goal of the season at

Bowling Green, chips in seven points from the blueline. He leads Clarkson in plus/minus at +9 ... Grenzy's defensive partner, freshman **Tyrell Mason** (Dawson Creek, BC) holds a +8 rating ... Clarkson has received solid play from its goaltending duo, **Kyle McNulty** and **David Leggio**. McNulty has started nine games and boasts the second best overall goals against average in the ECACHL at 2.36. He also posts a .913 save percentage en route to a 6-3 record. Leggio is coming off perhaps his best performance of the season when he made 37 saves, including several breakaway stops in the win at Bowling Green. He holds a 3.24 GAA, a .895 save percentage and a 4-2-1 record through seven starts ... Clarkson has killed off 41 of 43 opponent power plays over the past seven games and owns the third-ranked penalty kill in the league at 86% (106-123) ... The Knights are 9-1-0 when leading or tied through two periods ... Former Clarkson standout and NHL veteran **Steve Dubinsky** '93 will serve as a coach for the Israeli women's hockey national team as it prepares for the 2010 Olympics.

## CLARKSON DUO NAMED TO USA OLYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM

Former **Clarkson University Hockey** All-Americans and current **National Hockey League** standouts **Erik Cole** and **Craig Conroy** have been named to the **2006 United States Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team** which will participate in the **XX Olympic Winter Games** to be held February 10-26 in Torino, Italy. USA Hockey announced the 23-player roster for the 2006 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team on December 19, during a National Hockey League broadcast on OLN.

Both Cole and Conroy, who will be making their Olympic debuts, have seen previous action with USA squads in international competition.

Cole made his second appearance for the U.S. in international play when he skated for the National Team in the 2005 International Ice Hockey Federation World Championship on April 30 – May 15 in Innsbruck and Vienna, Austria. He also participated with the 1998 U.S. National Junior Team. Conroy skated with Team USA in the World Cup of Hockey 2004.

A left wing from Oswego, NY, Cole is on track to post career highs in goals, assists and points for the Carolina Hurricanes this season. Through 32 games, Cole, 27, has recorded nine goals and 16 assists for 25 points to help lead a surging Carolina team to the top of the Southeast Division of the Eastern Conference.

Conroy's impressive play this season for the Los Angeles Kings put him on the Team USA radar. A native of Potsdam, NY, Conroy, 34, agreed to terms on a four-year contract with the Kings in the summer of 2004 after helping to lead the Calgary Flames to Game 7 of the 2004 Stanley Cup finals. Through 34 games this season, Conroy has recorded 32 points on 12 goals and 20 assists along with posting a plus/minus rating of +18. Conroy earned NHL.com Three Stars of the Night honors after scoring one goal and two assists in LA's 4-1 win over Phoenix on December 17.

A 1999 All-America at Clarkson, Cole played three seasons for the Golden Knights and averaged a point a game with 52 goals and 51 assists through 103 career games from 1997-2000. Cole left Clarkson after his junior season to pursue a professional career. From 2001-04, Cole skated in 214 NHL games with Carolina and recorded 48 goals and 61 assists. He helped to lead the Hurricanes to the 2002 Stanley Cup finals.

During the NHL lockout last season, Cole helped Berlin Eisbären captured their first-ever DEL Championship this past April. He had a two-goal performance in the championship game and was named DEL Playoff MVP as Berlin Eisbären claimed the German title.

Conroy played for the Golden Knights from 1990-94. Among the most honored forwards in Clarkson's storied history, he was runner-up for college hockey's most prestigious honor, the Hobey Baker Award in 1994. An exceptional all-around player with great offensive skills, Conroy finished his collegiate career with 167 points on 63 goals and 104 assists through 140 games.

Conroy has made a big impact for Los Angeles in the first season after the lockout centering the Kings' top line. Los Angeles, which features two prominent Clarkson graduates in the front office – General Manager **Dave Taylor** '77, the Knights' all-time leading scorer, and Director of Player Personnel **Bill O'Flaherty** '71, a former Clarkson player, coach



and athletic director – has been a surprise team in the NHL enjoying one of the best records in the Western Conference throughout the 2005 portion of the schedule.

Conroy, a two-time finalist for the Selke Trophy (1998 and 2002), which is awarded to the best defensive forward in the league, enjoyed a breakout season with the Flames during the 2001-02 season when he registered a career-high in goals with 27, assists with 48, points with 75 and plus/minus with a plus-24 rating. His 75 points were tied for 12th best in the NHL and his 48 assists were ninth best. He also had the NHL's greatest point improvement from the previous season (plus-43).

Originally selected by the Montreal Canadiens in the sixth-round (123rd overall) of the 1990 NHL Entry Draft, Conroy, prior to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, had appeared in 609 career regular season NHL games with the Flames, St. Louis Blues and Canadiens, recording 340 points (118-222=340) and 337 penalty minutes. In 62 career NHL post-season games, he has 25 points (9-16=17) and 36 penalty minutes.

Team USA's roster features six players born in New York, including Cole and Conroy, five born in Michigan and three each born in Minnesota and Massachusetts ... From a collegiate standpoint, both Boston University and Lake Superior State University have three former players on Team USA, while **Clarkson University**, Boston College, and the University of Wisconsin all have two.

The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team will begin its quest for gold on Feb. 15 when it takes on Latvia at 3 p.m. EST. The Americans will be seeking their first gold medal since 1980. They took the silver medal at the 2002 Winter Olympics at Salt Lake City. The United States has won the hockey silver medal six other times and the bronze medal once.

Cole and Conroy will join an illustrious group of other Golden Knights, who have represented their country in the Olympics. **Tom Hurley**, a native of Massena, NY, played for the USA team at the 1968 Olympics Games in Grenoble, France. Liverpool, NY native **Dave Tretowicz** skated in the 1992 Games in Meribel, France for the USA and **Todd Marchant** was with the USA team at the 1994 Olympic Games in Lillehammer, Norway. **Guillaume Besse**, from Louviers, France, played for France in the 2002 Olympics held in Salt Lake City, Utah.

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Just two games involving ECAC Hockey League teams took place over the weekend with Dartmouth and St. Lawrence each claiming victory. The Big Green claimed a league win over Harvard, while the Saints downed Vermont.

It was a scoreless game through 1-3/4 periods of play before the Saints went up 1-0 on a power-play goal by Kevin DeVergilio at 16:32 in the second. Through 15 games, the Raiders are off to their best start since the team posted a 14-1-0 record to kick off the 1962-63 campaign. Brown hopes to play Providence at some point in the tourney and avenge its earlier-season loss to the Friars in the Mayor's Cup.

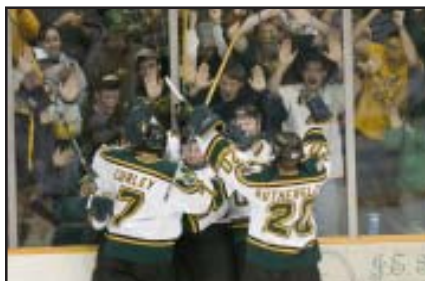

## 2005-06 SEASON in REVIEW - 1st Half

Enjoying its best start since the mid-1990s, **Clarkson** entered the break with a 10-5-1 overall record and has gained the recognition of the national polls with a top-15 ranking. The **Golden Knights** closed out the 2005 portion of the **ECAC Hockey League** schedule tied for fourth in the standings with a 5-2-1 conference mark. Guided by third-year head coach **George Roll**, associate coach **Greg Drechsel** and assistant coach **Jean-Francois Houle**, the Knights are ranked 15th in both the December 19 **USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll** and **USCHO.com/CSTV Division I Men's Poll**.



In their last action before participating in the Sheraton/TD Banknorth Tournament, the Knights split a pair of non-league games in Ohio. On December 9, Clarkson overcame an early 3-0 second-period deficit to Bowling Green to gain a 6-4 victory. The following night, the **Green and Gold** took a 1-0 lead over Miami, but eventually fell to the number-two ranked RedHawks 2-1 in Oxford.

Led by captain **Chris Brekelmans** and assistant captains, **Jeff Genovy** and **Nick Dodge**, the Knights have developed into one of the more surprising teams in the country this season. Clarkson has relied upon a balanced offense, stingy defense and improved specialty teams play as it has shown a marked improvement from last year's 13-23-3 team. Ten different Knights have reached double figures in the scoring column. Dodge leads the way with 19 points, including a team-high 12 assists. Defensively, the Knights, who regularly play three freshmen and a sophomore on the blueline, are allowing 2.88 GPG, fourth best overall in the conference. Clarkson has been backboned by the steady goaltending play of **Kyle McNulty** and **David Leggio**. McNulty has started nine games and posts a .913 save percentage and a 2.36 goals against average en route to a 6-3 record. Through seven starts, Leggio holds a .895 save percentage, a 3.24 GAA and a 4-2-1 mark.

Opportunities were there for Clarkson in its season-opener as the Golden Knights out shot Niagara 52-37, including by a 42-24 margin over the final 40 minutes, but breakdowns in their own zone and solid goaltending by the Purple Eagles cost the Knights a chance for victory. Niagara took the early lead in the first period with a power-play marker at 4:51, but Clarkson battled back and tied it on **Jeff Genovy's** man-advantage marker at 13:14 of the opening frame. The Eagles opened the second period with three straight goals to take a commanding 4-1 lead midway through the stanza. **Max Kolu** and **Chris Brekelmans** also scored for the Knights, while **Brodie Rutherglen** notched three assists. Freshmen **Philippe Paquet** and **Chris D'Alvise** also set up goals to record their first collegiate points.
