TOP STORYLINES

- App State is one of 35 unbeaten teams remaining at the FBS level, and the Mountaineers are 3-0 for the first time since they started 7-0 during a 13-1 season in 2019. That season, they won road games at North Carolina and South Carolina.
- A lengthy delay caused by heavy rain and frequent lightning moved the start time of App State's home game against Charlotte on Sept. 19 from 6 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., and the game ended at 12:32 a.m. It was the latest start to an App State home game in program history but still behind a 2003 road game that began at 6:05 p.m. in Hawaii (or after midnight for fans in Boone).
- Reigning Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week **Malachi Singleton** has completed 70 of 94 passes (74.5 percent, No. 9 FBS) for 889 yards with five TDs and one INT through his first three FBS starts, while DL **Caleb Sandstrom** has 4.0 sacks (T-3rd FBS, behind two players with 6.0 sacks). The Sun Belt leader in passing yards per game (296.3, No. 11 FBS), Singleton appeared in 11 games for Purdue in 2025 and five games as a redshirt freshman for Arkansas in 2024.
- App State's roster features 75 newcomers, including 45 transfers and 30 freshmen. Of the 45 transfers, 42 are from four-year schools and three came from the JUCO ranks. Of the 42 transfers from four-year schools, 26 were at FBS programs last season and 11 were at FCS schools.
- App State's first five games include three home games and two in-state road trips (to ECU and NC State). The Mountaineers will play outside North Carolina for the first time on Oct. 16.
- Before a 66-20 loss at No. 22 Clemson early in the 2024 season, App State's previous eight games against P4 foes had all been decided by seven points or less, and the Mountaineers went 3-5 in those games: 2023 at No. 17 North Carolina (L, 40-34 in OT), 2022 at No. 6 Texas A&M (W, 17-14), 2022 vs. UNC (L, 63-61), 2021 at No. 22 Miami (L, 25-23), 2019 at South Carolina (W, 20-15), 2019 at UNC (W, 34-31), 2018 at No. 9 Penn State (L, 45-38 in OT) and 2017 vs. Wake Forest (L, 20-19).
- App State will face NC State for the first time since the 2006 opener, which was the first game after the Mountaineers captured their first FCS national championship to end the 2005 season. The 23-10 loss in Raleigh was the lone blemish in a 14-1 championship run for App State in 2006.
- App State needed to replace several key contributors from 2005, including standout QB **Richie Williams**, and 2005 playoff hero **Trey Elder** started the 2006 opener at QB in what turned out to be a defensive-minded game. The two teams combined for just 375 yards of offense, and the Wolfpack held a 16-10 lead before capping the scoring on a touchdown with 5:14 left in the third quarter. College Football Hall of Famer **Armanti Edwards** played briefly at NC State, made his first start in Game 3 of that season and went 13-0 as a true freshman starter in 2006.
- In a sport full of exhilarating wins and heartbreaking defeats, App State has produced two of college football's most improbable victories: the Miracle on the Mountain (against Furman in 2002) and the Miracle on the Mountain: Part II (Hail Mary vs. Troy in 2022). In 2002, App State led 14-9 before **Billy Napier** threw a 12-yard TD pass with seven seconds left, and Furman went for two in hopes of taking a 17-14 lead. Instead, DE **Josh Jeffries** intercepted the two-point pass near the line of scrimmage and ran for 12 yards before lateraling the ball to DB **Derrick Black** at the 16. Black avoided two tackles and scored two go-ahead points to lift App State to a 16-15 win.

MORE STORYLINES

- The 2026 season will include the 20-year anniversary of the 2006 FCS national championship team, which was in the middle of a title three-peat from 2005-07. The 2006 squad went 14-1, following a season-opening loss at NC State with 14 straight wins, including a 13-0 mark with freshman **Armanti Edwards** as the starting quarterback. The Mountaineers outscored their opponents 528-223, using a dominant defense to allow just 14.9 points per game. App State held six opponents to 10 points or less and capped a 4-0 run through the playoffs with a 28-17 victory vs. UMass in the national title game, where RB **Kevin Richardson** scored four TDs.
- App State's 8-36-1 record against current ACC teams includes a 7-15-1 mark against Wake Forest, with the other victory coming against North Carolina (in 2019).
- App State's 27-24 win at ECU on Sept. 12 gave the program a 17-7 record in ESPN/ESPN2/ESPNU. The Mountaineers are 45-24 on ESPN/ESPN2/ESPNU.
- Since 2015, when App State became a postseason-eligible FBS member, it's tied for 11th place nationally with 101 wins. The teams ahead of App State on that list are Alabama, Ohio State, Georgia, Clemson, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Michigan, Boise State, Oregon and Penn State.
- App State started 4-2 in 2025. Four of the final five regular season losses were by 14 total points.
- The first full signing class for **Dowell Loggains** was the highest-rated class in App State and Sun Belt history via 247Sports, which had the Mountaineers with a top-60 national ranking on signing day. App State's class ranked higher than 10 programs from Power Four conferences.
- The 2026 coaching staff includes seven new faces: **Mike Anthony** (OC), **Tyler Zielenske** (special teams), **Aaron Fierbaugh** (safeties), **Justin Harper** (WRs), **Antonio James** (DL), **Tyler Kelley** (RBs) and **Ryan Pugh** (OL).
- QB **Malachi Singleton** (offense), LB **Colton Phares** (defense) and DB **Ammo Robinson** (special teams) were voted team captains before the start of fall camp. Phares (LB), **Aiden Benton** (DL) and **Tyriq Poindexter** (OL) received preseason All-Sun Belt recognition from the league.
- App State's defense leads Sun Belt teams in third-down defense (9 of 38 for a 23.7-percent conversion rate, No. 12 FBS) and is tied for first in interceptions (five, T-5th FBS). The Mountaineers are tied for 13th nationally with six takeaways.
- A former safety who moved to linebacker midway through the 2024 season, **Colton Phares** recorded a sack and picked off a pass in his 2026 debut after standing out in 2025 as one of just three FBS players (along with Texas Tech's **Jacob Rodriguez** and Central Michigan's **Jordan Kwiatkowski**) to post at least 100 tackles, 9.0 TFLs and three INTs.
- The 2026 roster has 10 players remaining from the 2024 roster, including scholarship recruits **Kanye Roberts** (App State freshman in 2022), **Colton Phares** (App State freshman in 2023), **Cayden Sweatt** (App State freshman in 2023) and **Nick Campbell** (2024 arrival from NC State). Campbell was a member of NC State's program from 2022-23.
- App State tight end **Luke Douglas**, formerly a prep QB who started his career at Florida State, has a younger brother, **Preston Douglas**, who is a freshman tight end for NC State.
- In 2022, QB **Malachi Singleton** committed to an Arkansas staff that included **Dowell Loggains**, who ended up departing for South Carolina shortly before Singleton enrolled at Arkansas. Loggains was introduced as App State's head coach on Dec. 9, 2024, and Singleton (who had decided to leave Arkansas after the 2024 season) traveled to Boone four days later for the first set of official recruiting visits for the new coach. Singleton instead chose Purdue and played there in 2025 before re-entering the portal, but he couldn't take another official visit to Boone (per NCAA rules). Singleton did visit Tulane, which had just made the College Football Playoff, but he committed to App State this time and has reconnected with Loggains as well as new offensive coordinator **Mike Anthony** (an Arkansas quality control coach from 2020-22) and run game coordinator/TEs coach **Ryan Yurachek** (an Arkansas grad assistant from 2020-21).
- The first official visits for **Dowell Loggains** (four days after his introduction) included **Malachi Singleton** and Arkansas teammate **Davion Dozier**, who chose App State and averaged 22.4 yards per reception during a 2025 season in which he caught 20 passes for 448 yards and five TDs. Dozier transferred to NC State after the 2025 season, and Singleton left Purdue for App State.
- QB **Henry Hasselbeck**, who had a 75-yard TD run on his first collegiate snap wiped out by a penalty vs. Maine, is the son of former NFL QB **Matt Hasselbeck**. Matt played for the Tennessee Titans in 2011-12, when **Dowell Loggains** was their passing game coordinator and QBs coach. Hasselbeck, a four-star lacrosse recruit as a midfielder and three-star football recruit as a QB in Massachusetts, initially committed to Maryland's lacrosse program in 2022 before committing to UCLA's football program the following winter. He spent the 2024 and 2025 seasons at UCLA.
- Of App State's six scholarship running backs, only returner **Jaquari Lewis** didn't deal with a significant injury last season. Florida transfer **Treyaun Webb** dealt with injuries late in the 2024 season and didn't appear in any 2025 games, and Arkansas State transfer **Ja'Quez Cross** suffered a season-ending injury after the 2025 opener. **Kanye Roberts** suffered a season-ending injury in the 2025 preseason after missing the final three App State games of 2024.
- Treyaun Webb** scored App State's first touchdown of the season on his first game carry since Sept. 21, 2024, and it was his first TD since he reached the end zone as a Florida back against Miami on Aug. 31, 2024. **Kanye Roberts**, meanwhile, returned to the field for the first time since Nov. 2, 2024 and gained 19 yards on his first carry against Maine.

Kidd Brewer Stadium stakes claim to being one of the toughest but also most picturesque college football venues in the nation.

After “The Rock” was voted the top Group of Five stadium in the country by CFB Campus Tour in 2023 and 2024, ESPN named Kidd Brewer Stadium one of the top 25 stadiums in all of college football, and The Athletic did the same in 2025.

Now in its 65th season in the venue, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State has a 282-84-5 all-time record at The Rock.

The top five single-season average home attendance marks in App State and Sun Belt Conference history have been those reached by Mountaineer fans at The Rock in 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025.

App State set single-season school and Sun Belt records with an average home crowd of 34,734 in 2023.

With a \$50 million north end zone facility, removal of the track and installation of new turf, The Rock had a new look in 2021, as the end zone facility opened for fans before a 2020 game vs. Georgia State. Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore was also honored before the 2021 opener with a plaza and statue in his name.

Kidd Brewer Stadium’s official seating capacity was 16,650 in 2007, but several expansion projects have almost doubled the capacity.

DOWELL LOGGAINS

A respected offensive play-caller at both the NFL and college levels, Dowell Loggains was named the head coach of App State on Dec. 7, 2024.

Hired at the age of 44, Loggains (pronounced LOGG-ins) became the 23rd head football coach in program history. His five-year contract runs through the 2029 season.

Before serving as South Carolina's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2023 and 2024 seasons, Loggains was an assistant for two years at his alma mater, Arkansas, after spending 16 years in the NFL. That includes his time as an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach for the Tennessee Titans (2010-13), Cleveland Browns (2014), Chicago Bears (2015-17), Miami Dolphins (2018) and New York Jets (2019-20).

During his decade-plus as an NFL coordinator and quarterbacks coach, he mentored the likes of Sam Darnold, Jay Cutler, Vince Young, Matt Hasselbeck, Mitchell Trubisky and Brian Hoyer at quarterback, as well as running backs Chris Johnson, Kenyan Drake and Jordan Howard.

In his head coaching debut, App State won 34-11 against Charlotte in Bank of America Stadium. The Mountaineers started 4-2 and closed the season with a JLAB Birmingham Bowl appearance. After his debut season, he led the efforts for App State to sign the highest-rated recruiting class in Sun Belt Conference history.

Loggains' offense during the 2024 season helped the Gamecocks reach the brink of the College Football Playoff with a 9-3 regular-season record that included wins over Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Missouri and Clemson. South Carolina had the third-best rushing offense in the SEC during the regular season.

He developed redshirt freshman LaNorris Sellers into one of college football's most dangerous dual-threat quarterbacks. Under Loggains' watch, Sellers threw for 2,274 yards with 17 touchdowns while also rushing for 655 yards and seven scores against one of the country's toughest schedules. He ranked 20th nationally in passing efficiency, 14th in yards per attempt, 25th in yards per completion, 28th in total offense and 35th in completion percentage.

Loggains also found success utilizing Raheim "Rocket" Sanders, one of the SEC's best rushing backs, to form a dynamic rushing attack.

In his first season in Columbia, Loggains turned future NFL quarterback Spencer Rattler and a future NFL first-round draft pick, wide receiver Xavier Legette, into one of the most lethal pass-and-catch combinations in the country.

Loggains spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the Arkansas Razorbacks' tight ends coach, earning a reputation as a top-25 national recruiter there.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Loggains graduated from the University of Arkansas with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003 and a master's degree in education in 2005. He walked on to the Razorback football program in 2000 as a quarterback and holder before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games.

Before returning to his alma mater of Arkansas, Loggains served as the New York Jets' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2019 and 2020. During his first season with the Jets, he guided an offense that was among the league's most proficient on opening drives, scoring 40 first-possession points. Darnold's numbers improved from his rookie campaign, increasing his completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating while also lowering his interceptions.

Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that averaged 4.68 yards per rush in 2018, the NFL's ninth-best mark. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20-plus yards.

Loggains began a three-year stint in Chicago in 2015 as the Bears' quarterbacks coach, where he mentored Cutler to a career season.

He worked as the Cleveland Browns quarterbacks coach in 2014 under offensive coordinator Kyle Shanahan. He helped Hoyer to a career season, as the six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards.

Loggains began his coaching career with Tennessee in 2006 and spent eight seasons with the Titans in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for part of 2012 and all of 2013. He joined the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09) before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010 and garner a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains' first professional experience came with the Dallas Cowboys as a scouting assistant in 2005.

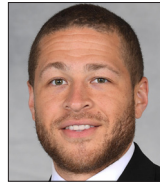

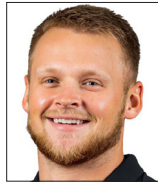

GAME NOTES
App State won its season opener for the seventh time in the last eight years (and the second straight under head coach Dowell Loggains) to move to 54-39-3 all-time in season openers.
The Mountaineers won their home opener for the fourth straight year and improved to 72-21-2 all-time in home openers. The only such loss since 2014 was the 63-61 shootout against North Carolina in 2022.
The 52-point margin of victory was App State's biggest since a 72-7 win against Gardner-Webb in 2018.
App State improved its all-time record against Maine to 1-2 ... There are now no visiting teams that have played more than once in Boone and have an undefeated record. The Black Bears have the only program with a winning record in Boone in more than one visit.
The Mountaineers won against an FCS opponent for the 11th straight time and have not lost such a contest since 2014.
This was App State's 99th win since it became a postseason-eligible FBS member in 2015, tied for the 11th-most nationally in that span.
Attendance for the 16th sellout in the last 18 games at Kidd Brewer Stadium was 33,664.
App State's offense scored its most points since putting up 55 against Georgia Southern in 2023 and compiled its most yards (647) since the 2022 season opener against North Carolina.
In his first collegiate start after playing as a backup at Arkansas and Purdue, Malachi Singleton completed 22 of 24 passes for 291 yards with three TDs and no interceptions. His performance marks the third-best completion percentage in school history (.917) by a passer with more than 10 completions.

Mountaineers Roll Over Maine in Season Debut

BOONE, N.C. — App State opened the 2026 season with a dominant home win over Maine, recording a 55-3 victory in front of a sold-out crowd of 33,664 at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Beginning their second season under the direction of head coach Dowell Loggains, with 73 newcomers on the roster, the Mountaineers posted the program's largest margin of victory since a 72-7 win against Gardner-Webb in 2018.

App State shut out Maine (1-1) until the final minute of the third quarter, building a 38-0 lead as Malachi Singleton completed 22 of 24 passes for 291 yards and three TDs in less than three full quarters of work.

App State's 10 possessions resulted in a turnover-capped march to the Maine 5-yard line on the opening series and then nine straight scoring drives, with seven touchdowns and two James London field goals. Sam Pickett III followed a Darrin Fugitt touchdown reception with two scores of his own, and the Mountaineers' four rushing touchdowns came from Treyaun Webb, Jaquari Lewis, Nate Branch and Jackson Grier. Branch and Grier, both receivers, scored on runs of 36 and 28 yards.

Caleb Sandstrom produced App State's first sack of the season right before edge rusher Caleb Pitts intercepted a pass that he tipped to himself late in the first half, setting up a touchdown drive that led to a 31-0 halftime advantage, and Colton Phares came down with another interception early in the third quarter. Phares also added a sack thanks to his pressure on a penalty for intentional grounding, part of the Mountaineers' eight tackles for loss.

The Mountaineers have won all four matchups against the Pirates when competing as FBS peers. It was the second straight win in Greenville after losing seven straight to the Pirates there from 1962-2012.
This was App State's 100th win since it became a postseason-eligible FBS member in 2015, 11th-most nationally in that span.
App State won the turnover battle against ECU 2-0 and is now +3 in the turnover margin after two contests.
Kaleb Purdy led all Mountaineers with eight tackles (including a TFL) – the most in his college career, which includes previous stops at Kansas and Tennessee Tech.
James London went 2-for-3 on field goals with makes from 41 and 37 and a miss from what could have been a school-record 59-yarder. He also made all three PATs and kicked five of six kickoffs out of the end zone (with the sixth being called for a fair catch).
After not punting in his App State debut a week earlier, Jaxson Dunn punted seven times for a 44.4-yard average, landing four inside the 20.
The two in-state programs agreed to a four-game series nearly a decade ago, facilitating the first meeting with both schools competing as FBS members, and App State officially won home games in 2021 (at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium) and 2023 (at Kidd Brewer Stadium). A victory at ECU in 2024 was App State's first win in Greenville since 1959,

GREENVILLE, N.C. — Why swab the deck when you can sweep it?

App State moved to 2-0 on the season and 4-0 in the FBS series with East Carolina by winning 27-24 at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

The Mountaineers built a 24-10 lead early in the second half and had a 27-17 advantage before ECU (0-2) scored a touchdown with 21 seconds left. App State could begin celebrating when the onside kick bounced into the Pirates' sideline without being recovered.

Caleb Sandstrom recorded two sacks, forcing a key turnover to set up a short-field touchdown that erased an early deficit, and cornerback Dre Walker's toe-tapping interception in the final three minutes halted an ECU drive when there was still enough time remaining for a viable comeback attempt. The Pirates completed only 21 of their 37 pass attempts, as five Mountaineers registered a pass breakup.

While ECU went only 2-for-13 on third down, App State had five third-down conversions, with quarterback Malachi Singleton showing poise in the pocket while benefiting from strong protection from his offensive line. In addition to running for a 4-yard TD, Singleton completed 20 of 28 passes for 267 yards to lead a turnover-free effort from the offense.

Jaquari Lewis (17 carries for 73 yards) and Treyaun Webb both had rushing touchdowns for the second straight week.

ECU opened the game with a 12-play, 60-yard drive and an eight-play, 83-yard drive, but that netted just seven total points because of a missed 33-yard field goal on the opening series. Singleton's 34-yard completion to Sam Pickett III helped set up a 41-yard field goal from James London, and Sandstrom recorded a strip sack on the first play of the next ECU series. Aaron Clark scooped up the loose ball, giving App State possession at the ECU 12, and the Mountaineers moved in front for good on Singleton's 4-yard keeper for a TD shortly after defensive pass interference in the end zone negated a third-and-12 incompletion.

App State Improves to 3-0 After Late-Night Start

BOONE, N.C. — Black Saturday turned to Black Sunday thanks to the latest kickoff time in Kidd Brewer Stadium history.

App State needed to weather several storms to remain unbeaten this season and unblemished against Charlotte.

Khalil Conley's interception deep in Charlotte territory set up the first of two second-half TD passes from Malachi Singleton as the Mountaineers gained separation before holding on for a 26-21 home victory.

App State (3-0) held a 26-7 lead midway through the fourth quarter, but Charlotte's 36-yard INT return for a TD with 1:58 left put the outcome in doubt. Darrin Fugitt recovered the onside kick, and the 49ers (0-3) had no timeouts left to prevent App State from kneeling out the clock.

Kickoff for Black Saturday was scheduled for 6 p.m., but frequent lightning delayed the start to 9:30 p.m., an hour later than a nationally televised App State-Louisiana matchup on a Friday night in 2020 set the previous record for the latest start at The Rock. At 12:32 a.m., the clock ran out on the Mountaineers' fifth win in five meetings with Charlotte.

Singleton completed 28 of 42 passes for 331 yards with second-half scores to receivers Chris Lofton and Jackson Grier. Conley's third-quarter interception at the Charlotte 27 occurred on a Cole Gonzales throw from his own end zone, shortly after App State's opening drive of the second half ended with an unsuccessful fourth-and-goal run from the 1.

Singleton threw a 3-yard TD pass to Lofton to push the lead to 19-7, and Grier's 7-yard touchdown reception gave App State a 19-point advantage. Khamani Alexander's second 1-yard touchdown run of the night cut the 49ers' deficit to 26-15, and the Mountaineers appeared to seal the victory when Dre Walker picked off a pass with 2:17 left. The Mountaineers took over at their 28, but Collin Gill intercepted a third-and-5 throw and scored a stunning defensive touchdown.
