ETSU NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

ETSU picked up its second win of the season on Saturday by defeating West Georgia by a score of 35-27. That victory, which was the program's 400th all-time, boosts ETSU's record to 2-2 for the 2026 campaign.

MASON MAKING THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

Quarterback Mason Mims continues his stellar start to the season. Mims went 15-for-24 for 198 yards and a pair of passing touchdowns against the Wolves. Mims, who has thrown for two or more touchdowns in three of ETSU's four games so far this season, paces all Division I (both FBS & FCS) freshman quarterbacks with 991 passing yards and paces those signal callers in completion percentage (71.8%).

PLENTY OF WORK FOR PEYTON

Running Back TJ Peyton narrowly missed out on his second 100-yard rushing game of the season against UWG finishing with 94 yards on 17 carries and a touchdown. As the Bucs move into conference play, Peyton paces the SoCon in rushing touchdowns (4) and ranks second in rushing yards (347).

MORE PRODUCTION OUT OF ETSU'S BACKFIELD

Peyton was not the only ETSU running back making some noise on Saturday. Jaiden Daniels ran for a career-high 69 yards on 10 carries. Jason Albritton also scored his third touchdown of the season to help the cause. Albritton has reached the end zone in 11 times in his 16 games as a Buc.

RECORD-BREAKING PASS

One of the key throws made by Mims was an 88-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Winton. That pass set a new program record for the longest scoring pass play breaking the previous record of 86 yards set back in 1997 (Todd Wells to Anthony Stringfield vs. Appalachian State).

BALANCED BUCS = SUCCESS

The Bucs were extremely balanced offensively in Saturday's victory finishing with 198 passing yards and 179 rushing yards.

PICK SIX FOR MIKE JENKINS

After not causing a turnover in the first three games of the season, the Bucs got a big one on Saturday. Senior safety Mike Jenkins intercepted his first pass of the season and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. It is not only the first interception by a Buccaneer defender in 2026, but it is also the first interception returned for a touchdown since September 28, 2024 against The Citadel (Jimmy Bowdry). Jenkins also totaled a season-high eight tackles against UWG. For his play in last Saturday's win, Jenkins was named the SoCon Defensive Player. Jenkins is the first Buccaneer defender to receive this honor since 2024 when Zach West earned this accolade.

SENIOR STACKING UP THE TACKLES

Fellow senior Dre Delinois also totaled eight tackles. Delinois ranks seventh in the FCS in terms of total tackles this season with 40.

BUCS HAVE BEEN TERRIFIC ON THIRD DOWN

ETSU successfully moved the chains on eight of 15 third downs during their victory over West Georgia on Saturday (53.3%). For the season, the Bucs have converted 29 of 54 attempts on third down (53.7%), which ranks sixth in the FCS. The five teams ahead of the Bucs on this list boast a combined record of 13-3 this season.

ASTOUNDING ACCURACY

ETSU passers have combined to go 86-for-120 throwing the football in 2026 (71.7%). Among the teams that have thrown 120 passes or more in the FBS and FCS so far this season, only USC (76.2%), Youngstown State (73.3%), and Maryland (72.6%) have a higher completion percentage than the Bucs.

READY IN THE RETURN GAME

After allowing 22 kick return yards to West Georgia on Saturday, the Bucs have now allowed just 80 yards through four games this season (13.3 yards per return). Among the FCS teams that have covered six kickoff returns or more, only Stephen F. Austin has allowed fewer yards than the Bucs (75 yards).

LIMITING NEGATIVE PLAYS

One boost that the Bucs have had so far in 2026 has been limiting negative plays. Through the first four games of the season, opponents have tackled the Bucs behind the line of scrimmage 13 times (3.3 per game). That is tied for the sixth-fewest in the FCS coming into this week's games. In comparison, the Bucs were tackled for a loss 70 times in 12 games last season (5.8 per game).

ABOUT WESTERN CAROLINA

Like the Bucs, Western Carolina will enter this Saturday's game in Johnson City sporting a 2-2 record. WCU is coming off a 58-14 victory over Presbyterian on Saturday. WCU's other win came against Eastern Kentucky (45-21) but have suffered losses to Campbell (28-19) and Cincinnati (62-10) this season.

COUNT ON THE CATAMOUNT PASSING GAME

As the case has been in over the past few seasons, Western Carolina has one of the top passing attacks in the SoCon. Quarterback Lex Thomas (a transfer from NC State) has thrown for 1,079 yards this season, completing 68.8 percent of his passes and has not thrown an interception in 144 pass attempts to go along with six touchdown throws. In the three games for Western Carolina against FCS opponents this season, Thomas has topped 260 yards passing and has tossed at least one TD in each of those games.

PERRY PROVIDING A BIG DAY ON THE GROUND VS. PC

After not reaching 200 yards rushing in their first three games, the Catamount running game got going in a big way against PC totaling 325 yards on 52 attempts and five touchdowns. Josh Perry led these efforts finishing the night with 142 yards on 16 carries and three touchdowns.

PLENTY OF OPTIONS TO COVER

One aspect of WCU's offense that is difficult to stop is their ability to spread the ball around. 19 different Catamounts have caught at least one pass in 2026. AJ Columbo has been the top target so far with 21 catches for 262 yards.

SPLASH PLAYS WITH WESTERN'S DEFENSE

Defensively, Western Carolina ranks in the bottom half of the conference in multiple statistical categories. However, WCU has been able to impact the opposing quarterback with 10 sacks and five interceptions. The Catamount defense also has 15 additional tackles for loss and two forced fumbles to their credit this season.

TERRIFIC IN THE TURNOVER MARGIN

Thanks to those turnovers caused, the Catamounts are tied for the top turnover margin in the SoCon (+4). That is tied for the fifth-best turnover margin in the FCS as well.



The Bucs knocked off Western Carolina by a score of 52-35 last season in Cullowhee. ETSU quarterbacks Jacolby Criswell and Jackson Byrd combined for a school record six touchdown passes in the win, while Jason Albritton topped 100 rushing yards & the duo of Jeremiah Harrison (139 yards) and Hakeem Meggett (113 yards) both topped the century mark for receiving.

ABOUT WESTERN'S DEFENSE

Joshua Collins is Western Carolina's top tackler this season with 23. Collins also accounts for 20 percent of WCU's sack total. Ken Moore Jr. also has reached 20 tackles this season and has also added two sacks for the Catamounts.

CATS AWAY FROM CULLOWHEE

Western Carolina is 0-2 on the road this season with losses to Campbell and Cincinnati. WCU went 5-1 in road games in 2025 and the last time that the Catamounts lost a conference road game came in Johnson City in 2024.

BELL LEADS WESTERN CAROLINA

Kerwin Bell is the Head Coach for Western Carolina. Bell, who is in his sixth season in Cullowhee, has built one of the most productive offenses in the FCS during his tenure. Since being hired ahead of the 2021 season, Western Carolina leads all FCS programs averaging 478.8 yards of total offense per game.

SERIES REWIND AGAINST WESTERN CAROLINA

Facing off against Western Carolina on Saturday, the Bucs will look to gain the edge in the all-time series against the Catamounts that is deadlocked at 27-27-1. ETSU has won the last two matchups, including last season 52-35 in Cullowhee. If the Bucs defeat the Catamounts on Saturday, it'll be the first three-game winning streak for ETSU over WCU since 1994-96.

FBS SCHOOLS REPRESENTED ON ETSU'S ROSTER

While the Bucs compete at the FCS level, ETSU has plenty of FBS experience on its roster. Overall, 25 ETSU players have previously spent time at an FBS school. These transfers have made an immediate impact for the Blue and Gold as ETSU's starting quarterback Mason Mims (Louisville), top three running backs TJ Peyton (Georgia State), Jason Albritton (Ole Miss/USF), D'Marius Rucker (Coastal Carolina), and top five pass catchers Suderian Harrison (Virginia), Brandon Winton (USF), Charlie Browder (UCF/Tennessee), Trey Weary (Tennessee), Tyler Griffin (UCF/UL Monroe) all began their college careers at a FBS institution.

YEAR TWO FOR HEAD COACH WILL HEALY

Head Coach Will Healy will begin his second season leading the Bucs on Saturday. Healy guided the Bucs to a 7-5 record a season ago, which included a 5-3 mark in conference play. ETSU, which also went 7-5 in 2024, has posted back-to-back seasons of seven or more wins for the first time since 1996-97. The Bucs were predicted to finish third in the SoCon Preseason Poll and had nine players earn Preseason All-SoCon honors, the most in the league.

BUCS THAT ARE BACK

Like most college football teams, ETSU's roster went through a major overhaul during the offseason. That said, the Bucs do have nine Preseason All-Conference players on their squad. Running back Jason Albritton, offensive lineman Will McCraw, tight end Charlie Browder, defensive lineman Brenden LeBlanc, safety Mike Jenkins, and kicker Ewan Johnson all collected First Team honors, while linebacker Dre Delinois, nickelback Jivon Oggs, and long snapper Brock Winstead were named to the Second Team.

YOUTH MOVEMENT FOR THE BUCS

While those All-SoCon players will provide leadership for the Bucs both on and off the field, ETSU will have plenty of youth on its roster in 2026. Of the 108 players currently on ETSU's roster, 69 are underclassmen (63.8%).

SO CLOSE YET SO FAR

As mentioned previously, the Bucs are coming off back-to-back 7-5 seasons. Those 7-5 finishes might have looked drastically different if a few more things went ETSU's way. Taking away the losses to FBS foes Appalachian State and Tennessee, ETSU's other eight losses over the past two seasons have been by a total of 40 points. In 2025, the Bucs lost four games to West Georgia, Furman, Chattanooga, and Mercer by a combined 21 points. ETSU held leads in the fourth quarter in each of those contests but let them slip away. Taking away an interception returned for a touchdown to close out the loss a Furman, the margin would shrink even smaller to 15 points in the four losses.

BUCS IN THE NFL

With the NFL season underway, there are four former Buccaneers that are in NFL organizations. Running back Jacob Saylor (Detroit Lions) and tight end Nate Adkins (Denver Broncos) are on the active roster, while cornerback Alijah Huzzie (Houston Texans) and linebacker Chandler Martin (New York Giants) are both currently on the practice squads for their given teams.

ETSU kicker Ewan Johnson ranks sixth on ETSU's all-time scoring list with 229 points. He needs nine more points to move into fifth place on the list passing Jerry Chapman's 237 points. The all-time leading scorer for the Bucs is Quay Holmes with 306 points

Saturday is the third time in five games that ETSU has matched up against a team from North Carolina. The Bucs are 0-2 in the previous matchups with losses to Campbell (49-37) and North Carolina (35-3).

The Bucs have scored touchdowns on 11 of their 13 trips into the redzone this season. (84.6%).

The 88-yard touchdown pass from Mason Mims and Brandon Winton was a new single game school record for the Bucs. As for longest passes in the FCS in 2026, that strike was tied for the fourth-longest.

7-2 is ETSU's home record over the last two seasons, which includes a 2-1 mark in 2026. This is the best nine-game streak for the Bucs at home since 2021 and three games into 2022 when they went a perfect 8-1 at Greene Stadium.

2024

ETSU will be looking for its first 1-0 start to SoCon play since 2024. In that year, the Bucs battled travel issues due to Hurricane Helene and knocked off The Citadel by a score of 34-17.

BANK OF TENNESSEE FIELD AT WILLIAM B. GREENE JR. STADIUM



In the Fall of 2017, East Tennessee State University began playing football on campus for the first time since November 22, 2003. William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium, the Home for Buccaneer Football, is a classic horseshoe designed stadium nestled at the foot of Buffalo Mountain in the campus' southwest corner. In 2023, ETSU Athletics and Bank of Tennessee announced the naming rights of the field at William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium -- making it Bank of Tennessee Field at William B., Greene, Jr. Stadium.

Construction of the new home of Buccaneer football began in 2015. The stadium was designed by McCarty Holsaple McCarty and was built by Bur-Wil Construction Company. This phase of the project was built at a cost of approximately \$26 million and will feature a total seating capacity of 7,694. The east side entry arch, the west side tower, the south end videoboard and the north end grass berm are just some of the features that will give the new facility a unique feel for fans.

The Bucs have had capacity crowds inside Greene Stadium in 24 of their last 28 games and 40 of the 53 total games played inside ETSU's on-campus stadium that was opened in 2017

Foundation Rocks

Two special rocks which were removed from the stadium site during construction have been placed inside the stadium. One is located on the east concourse for fans to see and touch as they enter the stadium, while the second is located under the video board in the south end zone and will be touched by the team as they enter the field. This is a symbolic gesture of the rebirth of the program and shows the unified spirit between the team, students and fans.

Bank of Tennessee Arch

Brick arches once greeted fans of Buccaneer football when they attended games in the original Memorial Stadium, which was located where the ETSU Athletic Center now sits. The beautiful Bank of Tennessee Arch now stands in tribute to the original on campus stadium and the history of ETSU Football.

WILL HEALY • HEAD COACH • SECOND SEASON

RECORD AT ETSU: 9-7 (Second Season)

OVERALL RECORD: 37-52 (Three Seasons at Austin Peay, Four at Charlotte)

ETSU Director of Athletics Dr. Richard Sander announced on Dec. 12, 2024 that Will Healy will be the school's new Head Football Coach. Healy, who will be the 21st head coach in program history, comes to Johnson City after spending the past two seasons as an Assistant Head Coach at Georgia State (2024) and UCF (2023). Healy also has experience as the Head Coach at Austin Peay (2016-2018) and Charlotte (2019-2022).

During his first season leading the Bucs, Healy guided ETSU to a 7-5 record (5-3 SoCon). Healy's time with ETSU began with a 45-17 victory over Murray State on August 30. Four of ETSU's five losses in 2025 were by single digits to West Georgia, Chattanooga, Furman, and eventual league champion Mercer. The Bucs closed out the 2025 season on a four-game winning streak against Wofford, Samford, Western Carolina, and The Citadel. Furthermore, the Bucs had nine players earn All-SoCon honors at season's end, which was the most for the program since 2021.

Prior to his two seasons as an Assistant Head Coach at the FBS level, the Chattanooga, Tenn., native engineered a remarkable turnaround at Austin Peay. In his second season as head coach in 2017, he led as the Governors to an 8-4 mark, an 8-1 record versus FCS opponents and a program-record seven Ohio Valley Conference wins—after Austin Peay had won only one football game in the previous four years combined.

In addition to being named OVC coach of the year in 2017, he received the Eddie Robinson Award by STATS as the top FCS coach in the country. His 2017 recruiting class was rated No. 1 in the country by 247Sports.

Healy took over at Charlotte in 2019, and in his first season, he guided the 49ers to the first winning record and postseason bowl invitation (the Bahamas Bowl against Buffalo) in program history while producing the school's first All-American (defensive end Alex Highsmith).

The following season, he led Charlotte to a win over Duke for the program's first victory over a power conference opponent.

Healy's coaching career began in 2009 in his hometown as the quarterbacks coach at Chattanooga. He spent seven years (2009-15) on the Mocs' staff, switching to coach wide receivers in 2010 and also working as passing game coordinator and recruiting coordinator. He produced consecutive recruiting classes rated the best in FCS football.

While with the Mocs, Healy helped develop quarterback Jacob Huesman into a three-time Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year and second-team FCS All-American and also worked with quarterback BJ Coleman, who eventually became a seventh-round pick of the Green Bay Packers in the 2012 NFL Draft.

After originally attending the Air Force Academy in 2003, Healy transferred to Richmond, where he was the backup quarterback as a senior for the Spiders' 2008 FCS national championship team.

Healy graduated from Richmond in 2008 with a degree in rhetoric and communication studies.

He and his wife Emily (Broyles) are parents of Eli and Wynn.

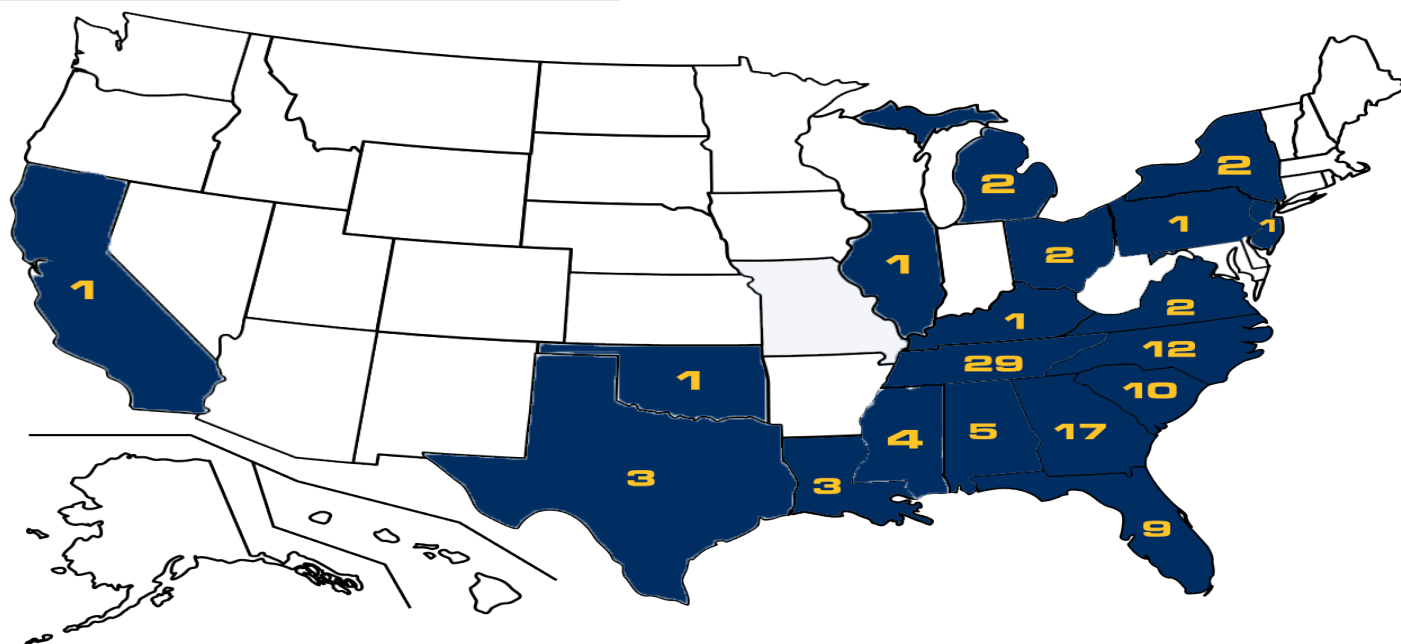
