The Game

- No. 22 Boston College looks to win its eighth game of the season for the first time since 2009 as the Eagles travel to Florida State Saturday at 3:30 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast by ESPN2 with Beth Mowins, Anthony Becht and Rocky Boiman on the call.
- Coverage on the Boston College IMG Sports Network begins at 3 p.m. with Jon Meterparel, Pete Cronan and Scott Mutryn. Fans can listen to the game locally on WEEI 93.7 FM.
- BC (7-3, 4-2 ACC) looks to rebound from its first home loss of the season last week to No. 2 Clemson, 27-7. The Eagles held the Tigers nearly 21 points below their single-game average in the loss.
- Florida State (4-6, 2-5 ACC) is hoping to bounce back following last Saturday's 42-13 loss at No. 3 Notre Dame.
- With a win Saturday, Boston College would capture its second straight win over the Seminoles for just the second time in series history.

The Series

- Boston College and Florida State meet for the 17th time in series history Saturday at Doak Campbell Stadium. The Seminoles lead the all-time series, 11-5.
- In ACC play, FSU leads the series 10-4 as the Seminoles were the first ACC opponent for the Eagles in 2005. Florida State won the 2005 matchup 28-17 at Alumni Stadium.
- The series between the two schools began in 1957 in Chestnut Hill as the Eagles came away with a 20-7 victory.
- FSU had won seven straight in the series before last year's 35-3 win for the Eagles in Chestnut Hill. It was the largest margin of victory for BC in the series and the most points they have ever scored in a game against the Seminoles.
- BC's longest win streak in the series is two games - a 27-17 victory in 2008 and the 28-21 win in 2009. The Eagles have only scored 30-plus points twice in series history against FSU - 34 in 2013 and last year's 35 points.

1st and 10

- BC looks for its first win in Tallahassee since 2008 with a victory Saturday.
- Nine Florida natives on the BC roster return to the Sunshine State Saturday. Four starters are among the nine as cornerback Hamp Cheevers (Trenton), defensive end Wyatt Ray (Fort Lauderdale), wide receiver Jeff Smith (St. Petersburg) and wide receiver/return specialist Michael Walker (Naples) are from Florida.
- With a win Saturday, Boston College would record a winning record in the ACC for the sixth time in school history. The last time BC won five ACC games in a season was 2009 (8-5, 5-3). The school record for single-season ACC victories is six, set in 2007.
- With a win Saturday, the Eagles would clinch their first eight-win season since 2009 (8-5, 5-3). It would be just the 30th eight-win campaign in 120 seasons of Boston College football.

Briefly, all interviews must be arranged through the Communications Office at least one day in advance and all players, coaches and support staff will not take part in an interview unless scheduled by the BC Athletic Communications Office.

STEVE ADDAZIO WEEKLY NEWS CONFERENCE

Steve Addazio's weekly news conference is held at noon Monday of each game week at the Conte Forum Media Suite. Lunch is served immediately following the news conference. The transcript will be sent out and available on bceagles.com later in the day along with live video of the news conference on BCEagles.com.

STEVE ADDAZIO MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

For those who cannot attend the Monday press conference, the head coach is also available on the ACC teleconference each Wednesday during the season at 12:20 p.m. Transcripts are made available through the ACC. Please contact Kevin Best at the ACC for call-in information.

STUDENT-ATHLETE INTERVIEWS

The first 20 minutes of practice on Tuesday and Wednesday is open to the media. Players are made available for interviews following the conclusion of practice.

An attempt is made for telephone interviews for media outside the Boston area if arranged in advance with the BC Communications office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystem.com/bostoncollege.

Admittance to the Alumni Stadium Press Box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made through BC's credentialing website.

Please request credentials at least two weeks in advance of the game to permit sufficient time for mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate C of Conte Forum.

Working space in the Alumni Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New England; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio representatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials. Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. Use the St. Ignatius Gate on lower campus at Campanella Way to access the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive a press folder with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Steve Addazio and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Addazio's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Yawkey Center.

Boston College's locker room is closed to the media. Select players will be made available in the Barber Room following Addazio's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.

Steve Addazio was named Boston College's 35th head football coach in December of 2012 and wasted no time making his mark on the program. Addazio took over an Eagles program that had suffered back-to-back losing seasons for the first time in 14 years (including a 2-10 mark in 2012) and engineered a remarkable turnaround. In what were supposed to be rebuilding years, Addazio led the Eagles to back-to-back seven-win seasons and two consecutive bowl games.

Addazio is the first coach in Boston College history to lead the Eagles to four bowls in the first five seasons as head coach after guiding BC to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in 2017.

Boston College finished the regular season winning five of its last seven games as the Eagles closed out a 7-6 season and 4-4 mark in the ACC. BC was one of 21 teams nationally - and just one of 13 teams from Power Five conferences - to win at least five of the final six games of the regular season. Only Clemson (6-0) and Boston College (5-1) won at least five of their last six in the regular season among ACC schools.

Boston College had the seventh-most improved scoring offense among Power 5 teams nationally. The Eagles featured ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns.

BC tied a school record with nine players earning All-ACC football honors in 2017. True freshman running back AJ Dillon was named first team All-ACC and tied with Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson for most votes among the all-conference teams. Dillon was the first true freshman running back to be named first team All-ACC since T.A. McLendon of NC State in 2002. He was also the first BC true freshman to collect first team All-ACC accolades since linebacker Luke Kuechly in 2009.

In addition to Dillon, junior free safety Lukas Denis and junior offensive tackle Chris Lindstrom earned second team All-ACC honors, senior defensive end Harold Landry, senior linebacker Ty Schwab, junior tight end Tommy Sweeney and junior specialist Michael Walker collected third team All-ACC accolades while junior defensive end Zach Allen and junior offensive guard Sam Schmal were name All-ACC honorable mention.

Three Eagles earned All-America honors following the year, including Walter Camp All-America defensive back Lukas Denis and Freshmen All-Americans AJ Dillon and offensive lineman Ben Petruła.

In the 2018 NFL Draft, three BC players were selected in defensive end Harold Landry (second round, Ten-

nessee Titans), cornerback Isaac Yiadom (third round, Denver Broncos) and cornerback Kamrin Moore (sixth round, New Orleans Saints). It marked the fifth consecutive year under Addazio that at least two Eagles were selected in the NFL Draft. In all, 14 players who have played for Addazio at Boston College have heard their names called at the NFL Draft.

In 2016, Boston College ranked as one of the nation's top defenses the entire season. The Eagles ranked on eight top-10 lists nationally, including ninth in total defense (314.2 yards/game), second in sacks (3.62 sacks/game) and 10th in turnovers gained (27).

During the 2013 season, running back Andre Williams led the nation in rushing, earned the Doak Walker Award as the nation's premier running back and took a trip to New York as one of six finalists for the Heisman Trophy. Williams, a consensus All-America selection, finished the season ranked fifth among all FBS running backs in the history of college football in single-season rushing yards with 2,177.

In 2014, the Eagles were picked by media to finish fifth in the ACC's Atlantic Division but surprised many by posting a second consecutive seven-win season and, in fact, falling a few yards and several plays short of finishing with a 10-2 mark. The season was highlighted by a prime-time upset of No. 9 USC, dominating the Trojans 506-337 in total offense, and a nail biter in which the Eagles had a chance to upend undefeated Florida State in Tallahassee, a game FSU won by a last-second field goal after the Eagles had missed the go-ahead kick just minutes before.

Addazio's coaching pedigree includes 16 postseason bowl games (including six BCS bowl games) and two national titles while on the coaching staff at the University of Florida (a 41-14 win over Ohio State on Jan. 8, 2007 in Glendale, Ariz., and a 24-14 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 8, 2009 in Miami, Fla.).

Prior to his arrival in Chestnut Hill, Addazio led the Temple University Owls in a two-year period of success, transition and growth. Addazio coached the Owls to a nine-win campaign and a bowl victory for the first time in 32 seasons in his first year as head coach.

Prior to leading the Owls, Addazio spent six seasons (2005-10) at Florida under head coach Urban Meyer, serving as offensive coordinator in 2009-10 and interim head coach from Dec. 2009 to July 2010. During his tenure in Gainesville, the Gators participated in six postseason bowls and won two BCS national championships.

Born June 1, 1959, Addazio is married to the former Kathleen Donoghue. They have three children - Nicole, Jessica and Louie.

ACC Wins

- Boston College joined the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2005 and has finished with a winning record just five times. The Eagles have finished with five ACC wins in a season four times and have recorded six ACC victories in a year once.
- The 6-2 ACC record in 2007 is the best in school history as the Eagles lost to Virginia Tech in the ACC Championship game.
- BC finished 5-3 in the ACC in 2005, 2006, 2008 and 2009.

Among the Nation's Best

- Boston College is ranked 22nd in this week's Associated Press Top 25 and the Amway Coaches poll.
- It is just the 18th time in AP Poll history BC has been ranked in multiple weeks during the same season.
- In 83 years of the AP Poll, BC has been ranked in just 23 of those seasons (28%).
- BC has made four appearances in the AP Top 25 this season. That marks just the 14th time in 83 seasons the Eagles have made four or more appearances in the AP Top 25 in the same year.

Beating a Ranked Opponent

- Boston College's 27-14 win over then No. 25 Miami was the first victory over a ranked team since 2014. Prior to the Miami win, the last win over a ranked opponent was a 37-31 victory over Southern California in 2014.

Taking Down the Canes and Hokies

- The 31-21 win at Virginia Tech on Nov. 3 marked just the second time in 16 seasons BC has victories over Miami and Virginia Tech in the same year. The only other time BC defeated both the Hurricanes and Hokies was 2007. The previous week, the Eagles defeated No. 25 Miami 27-13.

Going on the Offensive

- Boston College is averaging 34.2 points per game, the third-best single-game average in school history. The Eagles are 32nd nationally and fourth in the ACC in scoring.

Unforgettable, That's What You Are

- The Walter Camp Football Foundation announced the Football Bowl Subdivision National Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, presented by Generation UCAN, for games ending September 15.
- Senior defensive end Wyatt Ray was the sixth Boston College player to earn Walter Camp National Player of the Week honors since 2004, joining current teammate AJ Dillon, who was recognized on Oct. 15, 2017.
- Ray set a school single-game record with four quarterback sacks as BC earned a 41-34 victory over ACC-rival Wake Forest. Ray also recorded a career-best eight tackles and had one quarterback hurry as the Eagles' improved to 3-0, their best start to a season since 2007.
- Ray tallied 3.0 sacks (tied for fourth in BC single-game history) in the 38-20 win over Louisville on Oct. 13.
- Ray is tied for seventh nationally with 9.0 sacks on the season.
- He is tied for 10th in BC single-season history with Stalin Colinet (1996) with nine sacks.
- Ray comes from a family full of recording artists. His grandfather was Nat King Cole and his aunt is Natalie Cole.

Dillon Near the Top

- AJ Dillon is ninth nationally averaging 117.0 rushing yards per game in 2018. Dillon has played in eight of BC's 10 games, missing two due to an ankle injury.

100-yard Games Piling Up

- AJ Dillon has just 15 career starts, but he has 11 career 100-yard games already at Boston College in 21 games played.
- He is tied for eighth in BC history with 11 career 100-yard games.
- BC is 9-2 when Dillon rushes for 100+ yards in a game.

Dillon Named ACC Preseason Player of the Year

- AJ Dillon returns as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year after a record-setting freshman campaign in 2017.
- Dillon's 1,589 yards rushing last season were the second-most by any freshman in ACC history. The New London, Connecticut, native ranked second nationally among all freshmen in rushing in 2017 and seventh among all players. Dillon set the Boston College fresh-

man rushing record while posting the fourth-highest single-season total in school history.

- Dillon received 45 votes in this year's ACC Preseason Player of the Year balloting to edge Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins by three votes. NC State quarterback Ryan Finley placed third with 37 votes, and Florida State running back Cam Akers followed with 13.

Benny the Jet

- Redshirt sophomore running back Ben Glines made his first career start at running back for the Eagles at No. 23 NC State. Glines finished the day with 90 yards on 16 carries, including a 21-yard touchdown run. Glines finished with two touchdowns on the day as he hauled in an 11-yard touchdown reception as well.
- Glines rushed for a career-high 120 and a touchdown the previous game against Temple after Dillon left the game with an ankle injury.
- In the 38-20 win over Louisville, Glines rushed for 107 yards and a touchdown (6.3 yards per carry).
- For the season, Glines is averaging 5.6 yards per carry and is second on the team with 376 yards rushing. He has also caught 10 passes for 131 yards and three touchdowns as a receiver.

Block Party

- Boston College blocked a field goal and a punt at No. 23 NC State on Oct. 6. Kevin Bletzer blocked his first career field goal - the first blocked field goal for Boston College since Connor Wujciak at Virginia Tech on Nov. 1, 2014.
- In the fourth quarter, redshirt sophomore safety Michael Palmer blocked an NC State punt that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown by sophomore running back Travis Levy. It was the first punt blocked by BC since Matt Milano vs. Buffalo (10/1/16) and the first returned for a TD since Elijah Robinson's scoop-and-score vs. Louisville (10/24/15).

Select Company

- Anthony Brown threw for a career-high 304 yards and five touchdowns on 16-for-25 passing in the 41-34 win at Wake Forest on Sept. 13. The New Jersey native is one of two Boston College quarterbacks in school history to have thrown five or more touchdowns in a game without an interception. Doug Flutie threw for 354 yards and 6 TDs without a pick in 1984 at home vs. North Carolina.
- Brown became the first BC quarterback to throw for over 300 yards and five TDs in a game since Matt Ryan vs. Wake Forest (9/1/07). It was the first 300-yard passing performance by an Eagle since Chase Rettig vs. Wake Forest (11/3/12).
- Brown is tied with Tim Hasselbeck (2000) for 13th in single-season history at BC with 16 touchdown passes in 2018.

Chunk Plays

- Boston College is tied for 19th nationally and is second in the ACC behind only Clemson with 58 plays of 20+ yards in 2018. The Tigers lead the league with 66 plays of 20+ yards from scrimmage in 2018,
- Last season, BC was 70th nationally with 57 plays of 20+ yards in 13 games. In 2016, the Eagles were 121st nationally with 42 plays of 20+ yards over the 13-game season.

What Can Brown Do for You?

- Anthony Brown finished with the best single-game passer rating (245.9) by a BC QB dating back to the 1996 season with his performance against UMass in the season-opener. He finished 15-of-21 passing for 279 yards and four touchdowns. The yards and TD passes were then career-highs for the New Jersey native.
- Brown finished with the second-best single-game passer rating in the 41-34 win at Wake Forest. Brown became the first BC quarterback to throw for over 300 yards and five TDs in a game at Wake Forest (9/13/18) since Matt Ryan vs. Wake Forest (9/1/07). It was the first 300-yard passing performance by an Eagle since Chase Rettig vs. Wake Forest (11/3/12).
- Brown was named the ACC Quarterback of the Week for his performance in the win at Wake. In addition, he was one of eight quarterbacks nationally recognized by the Davey O'Brien Award and The Manning Award for his play in the win at Wake.
- In 2017, Brown was named ACC Rookie of the Week for the first time in his career following the UVA victory and also was one of eight quarterbacks nationally recognized by The Manning Award as its "Stars of the Week."
- He was the first Boston College player with three passing touchdowns and zero interceptions in a conference game since Quinton Porter in 2003 in the 41-10 victory at UVA.
- It marked the third-best single-game passer rating by a BC quarterback since 1996 at the time. The performance now ranks fourth since 1996.
- Brown was the second freshman in BC history to start a season opener under center in the Sept. 1, 2017 win at Northern Illinois. He is the only freshman quarterback in school history who started to win a season opener on the road.

Notes to Remember

- Head coach Steve Addazio has led the Eagles to four bowls in his five years, the first head coach in BC history to do so. The Eagles will head to their fifth bowl in six seasons under Addazio in December.
- The Eagles return ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns.
- Dillon was BC's first ACC Rookie of the Year. He had 1,099 rushing yards over the last six regular season games, the most of any player in the country.
- Dillon's 1,589 rushing yards were the second-most by any ACC freshman in conference history.
- Dillon tied for the most All-ACC votes with reigning Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson. Dillon had four games of 190+ yards of rushing in 2017.
- Boston College had nine players earn All-ACC honors, tied for the most in school history. Seven of the nine All-ACC selections return in 2018.
- Over the last six regular season games in 2017, BC averaged 36 points per game and outscored the opposition by 19 points per contest including wins over Florida State (35-3), at Louisville (45-42) and at Virginia (41-10).
- Boston College was third nationally in pass efficiency defense in 2017.
- Boston College was 12th nationally in interceptions (18) in 2017.
- BC scored 35+ points in three consecutive games for the first time since 2002.
- BC scored 40+ points in consecutive conference games once in school history in the BIG EAST and ACC (this season).
- 500+ yards of total offense in consecutive games against Louisville and Virginia was also a first in ACC history for BC.
- Boston College's rushing offense was the most improved unit of any Power 5 school in yards per carry (96th to 25th).
- Boston College was 12th nationally and was second in the ACC in sacks allowed in 2017.
- Boston College was 18th nationally in total plays in 2017. In 2016, the Eagles ranked 94th nationally in total plays.
- Lukas Denis was tied for second nationally with seven interceptions in 2017.

- Denis also tied for 12th nationally with 17 passes defended in 2017.
- Denis started the 2018 season with his ninth career interception - and first pick-six - with a 59-yard interception return for a touchdown against UMass.

The Nation's Most Complete Defensive Lineman

- Boston College defensive end Zach Allen has quietly become the most complete defensive lineman in the nation.
- Allen, a Preseason All-America selection, was one of two defensive linemen nationally in 2017 that recorded 100 or more tackles.
- An All-ACC honorable mention pick last year, Allen finished the season with 100 tackles, 15.5 tackles-for-loss and 6.0 sacks. The 15.5 TFLs ranked Allen in the top-10 in BC single-season history.
- Allen recorded a career-high 14 tackles, leading all players, in the Oct. 7, 2017 game against No. 16 Virginia Tech. He notched a career-high three tackles for loss and one sack on the night. He was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts in the Virginia Tech game.
- In the 45-35 win over Temple on Sept. 29, Allen was practically unblockable. The Connecticut native led BC with eight tackles, four tackles for loss and two sacks. He also broke up two passes and was credited with one quarterback hurry.
- In the 38-20 victory against Louisville on Oct. 13, Allen was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his career. Allen was all over the field as he totaled seven tackles, three tackles-for-loss and a sack in BC's win over Louisville. Allen also blocked an extra point on special teams in the victory. BC allowed a season-low 217 yards of total offense and held the Cardinals to 47 rushing yards on 32 attempts, the fewest amount of rushing yards by an opponent in 2018. BC finished with seven sacks and 12 tackles-for-loss in the win.

Pound the Rock

- For the 13th time under Steve Addazio, Boston College rushed for 300 yards or more in the Sept. 8 win against Holy Cross. BC finished with a season-best 365 yards rushing vs. the Crusaders.
- Under Addazio, BC is 13-0 when rushing for 300+ yards in a game.

Lindstrom Leads Stout BC O-Line

- Boston College returns all five starters on the offensive line along with the return of center Jon Baker from injury in 2018.
- Phil Steele's Magazine ranked the BC offensive line as the sixth-best unit.
- BC is second nationally with 139 career combined starts returning on the offensive line entering the 2018 season.
- Chris Lindstrom headlines the returners up front for the Eagles. A preseason All-American by Athlon Magazine, Lindstrom returns as one of the ACC's top offensive linemen in 2018.
- Lindstrom graded out as BC's best offensive lineman a year ago en route to All-ACC second-team honors. The Dudley, Mass., product has 41 career starts under his belt and was named the ACC's Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 3.
- Lindstrom captured Offensive Lineman of the Week honors in the league for the second time in 2018 and for the third time in his career on Oct. 15. Again the top-graded lineman up front for Boston College, Lindstrom paved the way for an offense that totaled 251 yards rushing as two backs went over 100 yards rushing (Ben Glines and David Bailey).

Scouting the Seminoles

- Florida State enters Saturday's ACC game 4-6 overall and 2-5 in the conference. The Seminoles have wins this season over Samford (36-26), Northern Illinois (37-19), Louisville (28-24) and Wake Forest (38-17) while losing to Virginia Tech (24-3), Syracuse (30-7), Miami (28-27), Clemson (59-10), NC State (47-28) and Notre Dame (42-13).
- Florida State ranks 108th nationally in total offense (356.3 yards per game), 127th in rushing offense (79.8 yards per game) and 26th in passing offense

(276.5 yards per game. The Seminoles rank 1110th in the country in scoring with 22.7 points per game on offense.

- On defense, Florida State is 68th nationally in total defense (403.8 yards per game). The Seminoles are allowing 31.6 points per contest, 93rd nationally. Against the run, FSU is allowing 136.5 yards per game (38th nationally). Through the air, FSU's opponents are averaging 267.3 yards per game, 110th nationally.

- Graduate center Jon Baker and senior defensive back Will Harris were voted team captains by their teammates, Boston College head coach Steve Addazio announced in August.

Sweeney Continues to Climb

- Tommy Sweeney is among the top 10 in school history for career receptions by a tight end at Boston College.
- The Don Bosco Prep product had just one scholarship offer at the FBS level coming out of high school in Boston College. His lone other offer was from FCS member Delaware.
- He is one of seven tight ends in school history with 1,000 or more career receiving yards.
- A three-year starter, Sweeney was named to the All-ACC third-team in 2017.
