## THE HUMAN MAGNET™

- » Outfielder Elijah Cabell has been hit by 13 pitches this season, the most in the country. As a freshman, Cabell ranked fourth in the ACC with 13 HBP in 58 games.
- » Cabell has been hit by a pitch in 9 of the past 11 games and has been hit by multiple pitches in a game three times.
- » Cabell also has five of FSU's nine home runs in 2020, including a two-run HR against Mercer on Tuesday. He was named the ACC Player of the Week after hitting a pair of three-run home runs and a grand slam against Cincinnati.
- » All of Cabell's home runs have scored multiple runs (1 2-R; 3 3-R; GS). His grand slam against Cincinnati was the second of his career.
- » Cabell ranks third nationally with 22 RBI.

## MARTIN'S LEAD FSU IN HITTING

- » Freshman DH and third baseman Tyler Martin is hitting a team-high .385, with 15 hits, 14 runs scored, five doubles and 12 walks. His doubles, walks and runs lead also lead the team.
- » Tyler Martin's .545 on-base percentage is the highest on the team.
- » Tyler Martin lined a one-out, bases loaded single in the 11th inning for a walk-off, 9-8 win over previously undefeated Mercer (3/3).
- » Outfielder and DH Robby Martin is FSU's only other hitter above .300, with a .354 BA, 17 hits and 13 RBI.
- » In the doubleheader against FAU and Texas (February 29), Robby Martin recorded seven hits, including a career-high four against the No. 3 Red Raiders.
- » Robby Martin had four RBI in the game against FAU.

## OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- » Fifth-year senior pitcher Chase Haney is FSU's team captain for 2020. He leads the country with 9 relief appearances this season.
- » Haney ranks 7th in FSU history with 104 relief appearances and is 32 shy of tying the school record.
- » Haney has a 2.98 ERA and a 12-4 record in his career; he had a 2.41 ERA in a career-high 37.1 innings pitched in 2019.
- » The Winter Garden native is 2-0 in 2020, with wins against USF and Cincinnati.

## HEY-HEY-HEY

- » Junior outfielder Reese Albert entered 2020 as one of the top hitters in the country and the No. 12 outfielder per D1Baseball.
- » Despite missing 19 games with a shoulder injury in 2019, Albert hit a career-high nine home runs, none bigger than his two at LSU in the Super Regional.
- » In game one, FSU overcame a 4-0 deficit, tying the game on Albert's three-run home run in the seventh inning. Albert hit a second homer in the ninth inning, his first career 2-HR game.
- » The four-run deficit was the largest FSU came back from to win a game in 2019.
- » Albert also hit two home runs in the Athens Regional, against FAU and No. 4 Georgia.

## VAN EYK LEADS FSU PITCHING STAFF

- » Preseason All-American CJ Van Eyk is 18-4 in his career, going 7-0 as a freshman in 2018 and 10-4 as a sophomore. His .818 win percentage is 9th-best in FSU history for players with at least 20 decisions.
- » Van Eyk earned his first win of the 2020 against FAU, giving up just one hit in six innings. Van Eyk's one hit allowed tied the fewest in a start in his career.
- » Van Eyk struck out 129 batters in 2020, the second-most in the ACC. Van Eyk and Drew Parrish (125), drafted by the Kansas City Royals, were the first FSU teammates to each strikeout 100 batters in a season since 1999.
- » Since starting 2019 3-3, Van Eyk won seven straight decisions entering the College World Series.
- » His wins in that span included Clemson, at Virginia, Wake Forest, at Louisville, vs. NC State in Durham for the ACC Tournament and at Georgia in the Athens Regional.
- » Against the Bulldogs, Van Eyk struck out 9 batters and allowed just three runs in a matchup of likely first round picks in the 2020 MLB Draft against Emerson Hancock. Hancock lasted just 4.0 innings and allowed a season high 5 runs on 9 hits.

# GAME NOTES

### GRADY POISED AS WEEKEND STARTER

- » Junior Conor Grady won nine games in 2019, including a masterful 7.0 innings pitched against No. 4 Georgia in the Athens Regional final. He allowed just 6 hits, 2 walks and a solo home run in FSU's 10-1 win.
- » He is 2-0 in 2020, striking out 14 and allowing just three runs in 13.0 innings.
- » He earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors after throwing 12.1 innings, allowing three hits and striking out 20 batters against Florida (4/9) and Clemson (4/14).
- » Against the Tigers, Grady entered in relief and struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.1 innings to earn the win.
- » Grady's 11 strikeouts out of the bullpen are the most for a Seminole reliever since Zach Diaz had 12 in 5.2 innings in 1997.

- » He also earned the victory against Richmond in the final home game for head coach Mike Martin.

### BEHIND THE PLATE

- » Sophomore catcher Mat Nelson ended 2019 red-hot, hitting .330 with nine extra-base hits and 24 RBI from April through the College World Series.
- » Nelson, from Largo, Fla., struggled to start his freshman campaign, hitting .210 before April.
- » Behind the plate, Nelson picked off four runners, none bigger than in the sixth inning against No. 13 LSU, helping curb a Tiger comeback in an eventual 5-4, 12-inning walk-off win.
- » Nelson's three-run home run against USF (2/18) broke a 3-3 tie en route to FSU's 7-3 win. He had a two-run double against No. 3 Texas Tech.
- » Nelson has reached base safely in all 12 games in 2020 and 24 consecutive dating back to his freshman year. He had a pair of hits Tuesday against Mercer.

### SIMMONS FIGHTS BACK FROM CANCER

- » Freshman pitcher and designated hitter Dylan Simmons was scheduled to enroll at FSU over the summer, but was diagnosed with Stage I lymphoma in late May.
- » Instead of enrolling at FSU, Simmons stayed home in Jacksonville for chemotherapy and radiation treatments at the Mayo Clinic.
- » Simmons was declared 'cancer-free' in December and enrolled at FSU for the spring 2020 semester.
- » On Opening Night (February 14), it was just 260 days since Simmons first received his cancer diagnosis.
- » In limited action this season, Simmons is hitting .273 with two doubles, four RBI and three runs scored. He has also drawn seven walks and has a .448 on-base percentage.
- » Simmons has appeared on the mound three times.

### OPENING WEEKEND RECAP

- » Florida State has not dropped a season-opening, head-to-head series since 1981. That streak continued this year after winning the final two games against Niagara (2/15-16).

- » Florida State outscored the Purple Eagles 35-5 in the final two games of the series at Dick Howser.
- » Mike Martin Jr. earned his first win at the helm of the FSU program on Saturday as the Seminoles combined for 14 hits, drew 13 walks, and were hit by five pitches in the 24-4 triumph. In total, 12 FSU players scored at least once, 10 players had a hit and 10 players recorded an RBI. Carter Smith drove in the final three runs of the game with a moon shot to right field for Florida State's first home run of the season.
- » Aided by seven runs in the opening frame, FSU won Sunday's finale 11-1 behind strong pitching from Conor Grady (5.0 IP, 7 K), Chase Haney (1.0 IP, 3 K), Bryce Hubbart (1.0 IP, 2 K), Tyler Ahearn (1.0 IP, 1 K) and Davis Hare (1.0 IP, 2 K). The Seminole staff struck out 15 Niagara hitters while walking just one.

### NOLES ROUND UP LOCAL RECRUITS

- » Over the years, Florida State has had a number of outstanding players from the Tallahassee area, including Link Jarrett and 2017 All-American Tyler Holton.
- » This season, five Seminoles claim Tallahassee as their hometown - freshman infielder Danny Andzel, junior pitcher Logan Lacey, freshman infielder Tyler Martin, freshman infield JD Tease and freshman pitcher Brandon Walker.

### RECRUITING PHILOSOPHY

- » New head coach Mike Martin, Jr., along with first-year assistants Mike Metcalf and Jimmy Belanger, have hit the ground running in regards to recruiting.
- » Looking for players 'with an edge' that play hard, Metcalf, FSU's recruiting coordinator, says FSU is also interested in fast-paced athletes that shine in the classroom, in the community and on the field.
- » Martin, Jr. has also stressed the importance of mental health for his student-athletes and players regularly meet with clinical and sport psychologists.

### ANDERSON GETS THE CALL

- » Sophomore pitcher Jack Anderson made his second career start in a 7-3 win over USF (February 18). The Tampa native allowed just one earned run in 2.0 innings.
- » Against USF, four FSU relievers combined to allow just three hits and a walk, with 10 strikeouts, over the final seven innings.
- » Anderson earned his first career win against FAU, throwing 4.2 innings of relief in FSU's 16-6 win. He tied a career high with four strikeouts.

### SCHEDULE ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST

- » Florida State will play 23 games against teams ranked in the preseason Top 25 (USA Today), including three games each against No. 2 Louisville, No. 7 Miami and No. 10 Florida. FSU hosts No. 3 Texas Tech for two games.
- » The Noles host the Cardinals and Hurricanes in consecutive weekends in late April-early May.
- » FSU also welcomes No. 22 Georgia Tech and No. 18 NC State to Dick Howser in 2020. FSU visits No. 20 Duke and No. 24 Wake Forest.
- » In a new twist for the Noles, FSU will take the second weekend in May off, allowing the student-athletes to recharge and refresh heading into the homestretch - at Clemson, the ACC Tournament in Charlotte and the NCAA Tournament.



# GAME NOTES

## COACHES IN FIRST SEASONS

- » Mike Martin, Jr. is in his first season as Florida State's head coach after spending 22 years as an assistant coach and 3 years as a player for the Noles.
- » Martin is the ninth head coach in FSU's 73-year history. He is the fourth straight head coach, dating back to 1975, that is an FSU alumnus.

## LEAVE YOUR LEGACY

- » Earlier this year, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association named its annual Coach of the Year trophy after former FSU head coach Mike Martin.
- » Martin won more games than any coach in NCAA history, finishing his 40-year career with a 2,029-736-4 record.
- » Martin is the third Seminole with a national baseball award named in his honor, joining Dick Howser (NCBWA Player of the Year) and Buster Posey (Catcher of the Year).

## STADIUM IMPROVEMENTS

- » For the third straight offseason, Mike Martin Field at Dick Howser Stadium has seen important renovations take place.
- » Prior to the 2018 season, a new video board was unveiled. At the time, it was the second largest in college baseball.
- » Prior to the 2019 season, the weight room under the grandstands was renovated with state-of-the-art equipment and over 1,800 square feet of workout space.
- » Before the 2020 season, new LED lights were installed to further modernize Dick Howser Stadium.

## FSU ALUMS ACROSS COLLEGE BASEBALL

- » Mike Martin, Jr. is one of three current Atlantic Coast Conference baseball coaches that graduated from Florida State.
- » Pitt's Mike Bell played at FSU from 1994-95 and was the Noles pitching coach from 2012-18 before taking the Panthers job.
- » Notre Dame hired Link Jarrett, an FSU shortstop from 1991-94, prior to the 2020 season. Jarrett started his coaching career at Flagler College in 1999 before assistant jobs at FSU, Mercer, East Carolina and Auburn. He was the head coach at UNC-Greensboro from 2013-19.
- » Former Florida State pitcher and 21-year pitching coach Jamey Shouppe is in his seventh season as Florida A&M's head coach. Former FSU All-American pitcher Bryan Henry is Shouppe's pitching coach for the Rattlers.
- » FSU also has assistant coaches at NC State (Chris Hart, FSU player from 1999-03; coach at NC State since 2005) and Georgia Tech (James Ramsey, FSU player from 2008-12; coach at GT since 2019).
- » John Sansone, an FSU infielder from 2013-16, is the volunteer assistant coach for Bell at Pitt.

- » On the broadcast side, former FSU All-Americans Eduardo Perez (ESPN) and Doug Mientkiewicz (ACC Network) provide analysis and coverage of college baseball.
- » Perez has covered baseball for ESPN since 2006; Mientkiewicz is in his first year behind the mic after his managing career ended.

## LONGEST HR TRACKED BY TRACKMAN

- » Ball-tracking provider TrackMan is a vital tool that tracks home run distance, exit velocity on batted balls, pitch speed and rotation among a number of other statistical uses.
- » On balls the company tracked, FSU players had the two furthest-hit balls in 2019.
- » Cooper Swanson hit a 471.0-foot home run and Elijah Cabell smacked a 465.7-foot home run. Both hits came against Mercer in early March.
- » Cabell has FSU's two longest hits of 2020 - home runs that traveled 429 and 426 feet.

## D1BASEBALL RANKINGS

- » D1Baseball ranked its top 100 outfielders heading into the 2020 season, and Florida State is the only team that had three players represented.
- » Junior Reese Albert, who enters 2020 as FSU's leader in career home runs with 16, is ranked No. 12.
- » Sophomore Robby Martin, FSU's leading returning hitter with a .315 average in 2019, is ranked No. 21, while sophomore Elijah Cabell is No. 56.
- » Martin, a freshman All-American in 2019, enters the year as a third-team All-American from the NCBWA.

## FIRST STARTS ON THE MOUND

- » Florida State brings back 8 pitchers that have started at least one game in their careers.
- » All three of FSU's starters for opening weekend (Van Eyk, Drohan, Grady) have started multiple games in their careers.
- » Freshman Bryce Hubbard made his first start February 29 against FAU.

- » Behind CJ Van Eyk's team-high 129 strikeouts, Florida State ranked fifth nationally with 657 strikeouts in 2019.
- » The 657 strikeouts were the most since the Noles racked up 662 in 1999 and were tied for the fourth-most in FSU history.
- » FSU's 10.4 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in school history.
- » In 2018, FSU led the country with 635 K's.
- » So far in 2020, the Noles are averaging 11.5 strikeouts per game and have hit double-digits in 11 of 12 games.
- » FSU's 19 strikeouts against No. 3 Texas Tech on February 29 are tied for the most in the country against a Top 10 team.

### 42 STRAIGHT NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES

- » The Seminoles ended the 2019 season in a familiar place, playing in Omaha at the College World Series.
- » The appearance was FSU's 23rd all-time appearance and former head coach Mike Martin's 17th trip, tied for the most for any one coach.
- » The 2019 season also produced a 42nd consecutive NCAA appearance as an at-large berth from the ACC. The Noles were the three-seed in the Athens Regional.
- » It was the first time ever that FSU was NOT a No. 1 or No. 2 seed in a regional. The last time FSU was not a No. 1 was in 2006 (also in Athens). The last time FSU did not host a regional was in 2010 (No. 1 seed in UConn regional).
- » Entering 2020, FSU's 57 regional appearances and 42 consecutive appearances rank second, behind Texas and Miami, respectively:

Longtime Florida State assistant coach Mike Martin, Jr. was named the ninth head baseball coach in FSU history on June 21, 2019. Florida State Director of Athletics David Coburn elevated Martin to the head role that his father held for 40 years before him. Martin became the first new head baseball coach the Seminoles hired since 1980.

"I have every confidence Mike Martin Jr. will carry on the winning tradition of Florida State University baseball," FSU President John Thrasher said at the time. "For more than two decades as an assistant coach, he has shown he is a talented recruiter, passionate competitor and respected mentor to our student-athletes. While Mike Martin Jr. brings his own strengths and style of coaching to the program, his values, integrity and love for this university will carry on the proud legacy of his father."

"I want to thank President John Thrasher and Athletic Director David Coburn for entrusting me with this special program," said Martin. "I'm very honored and humbled to be able to lead Florida State. It's been a privilege to serve at this great University for the past 22 years and I'm excited to extend FSU's 70-year history of success moving forward."

Martin spent all 22 years as an assistant coach at his alma mater, focusing on hitting and recruiting. The former All-American catcher for the Seminoles compiled eight straight Top 10 recruiting classes from 2011-2018, while his offenses have a combined .300 batting average since 1998. Florida State made the postseason and won at least 40 games every year under Martin, with eight College World Series appearances, 17 NCAA super regionals and six Atlantic Coast Conference titles.

"After serving under one of the all-time greats, we will combine much of what was learned from him with our new staff's style and ideas in our pursuit of championships," added Martin.

As an assistant, Martin coached 16 Major Leaguers, 16 freshman All-Americans, 21 first team All-Americans and 41 student-athletes who have earned first, second or third team All-America accolades. In all, 77 Seminoles have earned All-ACC honors and 65 hitters have been selected in the Major League Baseball draft during that stretch.

Martin coached four Seminole hitters that captured National Player of the Year honors - Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Buster Posey and James Ramsey.

Prior to joining Florida State's staff, Martin was FSU's starting catcher from 1993-95, leading FSU to the College World Series in 1994 and 1995. He was drafted out of college by San Diego in the ninth round in 1995. Before coming to Florida State, Martin played high school ball at the Maclay School in Tallahassee and at Manatee Community College in 1992.

"We are very excited to have Coach Martin leading our baseball program into the future," said Coburn. "His commitment to, passion for and experience with the Seminole program are second to none."

"His plan for the next era of Seminole baseball is impressive. He knows what he wants to do and how he wants to do it. After traveling with this team for the last three and a half weeks, I have come away very impressed with his relationships with the players, his attention to detail and his understanding of the great game of college baseball."

Martin has two sons, Tyler and T.J.
