After snapping its seven-game winless streak with a victory at Princeton on Saturday, the Raiders hope to snap another sort of streak this weekend. Colgate hasn't won a tournament since 1999, but it will take its third shot of the season at a tourney title at the Rensselaer/Bank of America Holiday Tournament.

The Series with Ohio State

Colgate has never beaten Ohio State in six tries as the Buckeyes hold a 4-0-2 record against the Raiders. The last time the teams met, OSU earned a 2-1 win in Hamilton on Nov. 21, 2003. Ohio State is 1-0-1 against Colgate in games played at neutral sites: the teams skated to a 4-4 tie at the 1988 Riverfront Invitational, and the Buckeyes won in overtime at the 1991 Syracuse Invitational Tournament.

Scouting the Buckeyes

Ohio State has played all but two of its games during the 2006-07 season against other CCHA teams. The one time it stepped out of conference, the Buckeyes were swept by current No. 1 Minnesota, 7-2 and 6-3, at home. OSU has fared better in its league schedule: it ranks third in the conference standings behind Michigan and Miami. The Buckeyes have gone unbeaten in their last three games

Junior Jason DeSantis leads the team with 12 points, including 11 assists, and classmate Tommy Goebel has scored a team-high five goals and has eight points. OSU boasts a balanced attack that includes 10 players with five or more points through its first 12 games. All but one skater has recorded at least one point this season.

The Buckeyes have a pair of freshmen between the pipes. Joseph Palmer, a draft pick of the Chicago Blackhawks, has earned a 4-4-2 record in nine starts and has a 3.11 goals against average and .879 save percentage. Nick Fillion is 0-2-0 with a 4.85 goals against average and .844 save percentage.

The Series with Rensselaer

Earlier this season, Rensselaer topped Colgate 2-1 to win the inaugural Governor's Cup and extend its series lead to 54-44-3. The RPI victory snapped a nine-game unbeaten streak for Colgate in the series. At home, the Engineers are 31-19-0 against the Raiders. If the teams meet each other on Saturday, they will play each other at least four times, and have the potential to share the ice in as many as seven games this season.

Scouting the Engineers

Rensselaer had a five-game unbeaten streak snapped on Friday when it lost to Sacred Heart at home, 5-4. That unbeaten streak began at the inaugural Governor's Cup in October with a tie of Union and a win against Colgate that lifted the Engineers to the tournament title. Every game in RPI's streak was played in Troy or in the Capital District. The Engineers don't go back on the road again until next weekend, when they visit Central New York to take on Cornell and Colgate.

The Raiders Aren't Red Anymore

Colgate's nickname is "Raiders." Although the university's athletic teams were once known as the "Red Raiders," Colgate dropped the "Red" from its nickname in 2001 due to the name's relationship with the school's old Native American mascot. When referring to Colgate athletic teams, please use just "Raiders."

Seniors Jake Luthi and Oren Eizenman are the only Engineers who have reached double digits in the points column. Luthi leads Rensselaer with 11 points, including nine assists, while Eizenman has 10 points on four goals and six assists. Junior Jake Morissette leads the squad with five goals, and is tied for third in the team scoring race with senior Kirk MacDonald with eight points each.

Sophomore Mathias Lange and junior Jordan Alford have split netminding duties evenly, although Alford boasts the more impressive numbers. Through four starts, Alford is 3-0-1 with a 1.80 goals against average and .941 save percentage. Lange is 1-2-2 with a 3.31 goals against average and .868 save percentage.

The Series with Niagara

Colgate earned a 2-1 win against Niagara at the Blue Cross Arena in Rochester earlier this season to take a 4-2-1 lead in the all-time series. In neutral-site games, the Raiders are 3-2-0 against the Purple Eagles, including October's 2-1 win. Colgate is unbeaten in its last three games against Niagara.

Scouting the Purple Eagles

After starting the season with just three wins in its first nine games, Niagara has gone unbeaten in its last five contests, all against College Hockey America competition, including three straight wins and back-to-back ties last weekend with Bemidji State. The Purple Eagles started their current unbeaten streak with big offensive efforts: they netted seven goals in a win at Robert Morris, and in a home victory versus Alabama-Huntsville.

Three Purple Eagles have already reached the 20-point plateau: sophomore Les Reaney leads the squad with 25 points on 11 goals and 14 assists, classmate Ted Cook has a team-high 13 goals and 23 points, and senior Sean Bentivoglio is tied with freshman Chris Moran with a squad-best 15 assists and 20 points. Moran ranks fourth with 18 points.

Sophomore Juliano Pagliero has played two-thirds of Niagara's minutes in goal. He owns a 3.42 goals against average and .900 save percentage. Senior Allen Barton has started twice and seen time in two games in relief. He has a 3.51 goals against average and .905 save percentage.

The Last Time Out

Colgate snapped its seven-game winless skid with a victory at Princeton on Saturday, Nov. 18. The Raiders used three 5-on-3 power-play goals to build a 3-1 lead late in the second period.

Junior **Mark Dekanich** made a career-high 49 saves to keep the Tigers at bay as the hosts outshot Colgate 51-29, including 29 shots on 13 power-play opportunities. Both of Princeton's goals in the 4-2 Raider win came with a man advantage.

Junior assistant captain **Tyler Burton** tied his career high with three assists, and sophomore **Jason Fredricks** enjoyed the first multiple-point game of his career with two assists. Sophomore **Nick St. Pierre** added a goal and an assist. Junior **Jesse Winchester** extended his current goal scoring streak to three with a power-play score 4:03 into the game.

On Friday, Dekanich was also outstanding, but the offense lagged in a 3-1 loss at Quinnipiac. Dekanich stopped 17 straight Bobcat shots in the first period before his counterpart saw any rubber as the Raiders were outshot 20-6 in the first period of the game. The shot differential was 34-12 by the second intermission, but Colgate's offense woke up for the third period, outshooting Quinnipiac 15-7 over the last 20 minutes.

Down 2-0 late in the third period, the Raiders put Dekanich on the bench in favor of the extra skater, and it paid off when Winchester scored with 47 seconds left in regulation. Colgate continued to skate 6-on-5, but was unable to get the equalizer. Bobcat freshman Brandon Wong put the game away with an empty-net score with 10 seconds on the clock.

Hockey Teams Help Out During Holiday Season

The Raiders, led by freshman forward **Ethan Cox**, will be hosting a toy drive to benefit local children at their next home games, Dec. 1-2, against Union and Rensselaer. Volunteers will collect new or gently-used toys in the lobby of Reid Athletic Center, outside the entrance to Starr Rink. All collected toys will be donated to the Community Action Program, a local organization.

As an added incentive, for every toy donated, fans will receive a raffle ticket that enters them into a drawing for team-autographed memorabilia. A grand prize will be given out during the third period of each game.

Recent ECACHL Games

Quinnipiac jumped into first place in the league standings with a home sweep of Colgate and Cornell at the Northford Ice Pavilion. The Big Red beat Princeton on Friday to stay in a tie for second place, and the Raiders also defeated the Tigers to climb out of last place in the standings.

Yale earned a sweep of Dartmouth and Harvard on the road to take sole possession of fifth place. Brown played two one-goal games, beating Harvard before losing to Dartmouth. The Bears are tied with Rensselaer and Colgate for seventh place. The Big Green earned a pair of points to move into a share of second place with a 1-0 win against Brown at home, and Harvard sits in a three-way tie for 10th place.

In non-conference action, St. Cloud State swept Clarkson in Minnesota, Sacred Heart beat Rensselaer in Troy, and on Tuesday, Harvard lost to Boston University on the road and Yale skated to a 4-4 tie with Mercyhurst on the road.

Colgate in Tournament Play

The Raiders haven't had a great deal of success in four-team tournaments in recent years, but with four regular-season tournaments on the schedule, they'll have plenty of opportunities to turn their fortunes around.

The last time Colgate won a tournament was in 1999 when it beat Merrimack 3-0 and Niagara 3-2 to win the Syracuse Invitational Tournament.

Prior to its appearance in the championship game of the inaugural Governor's Cup, the Raiders last played for a tournament title in 2000. That year, they advanced to the championship game of the Ice Breaker Tournament against New Hampshire by beating host Michigan in a shootout in the opening game. Colgate's appearance in the title game of the Governor's Cup also came following a shootout.

Andy McDonald '00 Makes NHL All-Star Ballot

Former Colgate standout Andy McDonald '00, now of the Anaheim Ducks, is one of 30 Western Conference forwards on the ballot for the 2007 NHL All-Star Game.

Through 22 games this season, McDonald has 18 points on eight goals and 10 assists. He is currently riding a four-game point streak that includes a four-point effort in Anaheim's 6-4 win against Phoenix on Nov. 19. He is one of five Ducks on the all-star ballot.

Bill Johnston '73 Receives Silver Puck Award

Former Colgate hockey player Bill Johnston '73 received the Silver Puck Award at the club's annual banquet on Saturday, Nov. 11, at the White Eagle Conference Center in Hamilton.

Johnston was a three-year letterwinner in hockey at Colgate, and is a member of the Silver Puck Club's board of directors. Since 1983, he has worked at HarbourVest Partners, LLC, in Boston, where he is now a managing director. Johnston serves on two corporate advisory boards, and has served on the boards of three public companies.

The Silver Puck Award is given each year by the Silver Puck Club to a person or persons whose continued support and contributions to the Colgate hockey program warrant special recognition and applause. The award is a silver-plated, puck-sized award weighing three points and is inscribed the with recipient's name.

Deuces Wild

Colgate's defense held its opponents to just two goals in each of three straight games: versus Quinnipiac and Rensselaer in the Governor's Cup, and in the league-opener at Yale. However, the Raiders were unable to generate enough offense to earn a win in any of those games.

Last year, spotting opponents two goals or fewer wasn't a problem for Colgate. The Raiders were 16-1-4 during the 2005-06 season when their goaltenders gave up two or fewer goals. The only loss in that equation was to Cornell, 2-0, in the ECACHL semifinals.

Colgate Hosts Annual Skate with the Raiders

Approximately 100 children and members of the Hamilton community took to the ice at Starr Rink for Colgate's annual Skate with the Raiders on Tuesday, Nov. 7. The attendees enjoyed 90 minutes of sharing the rink with members of both the men's and women's hockey teams, as they also vied for prizes and collected autographs from their favorite Raiders.

The event also featured the skating debut of Colgate's new mascot, "Raider." "Raider," who is scheduled to appear at each of Colgate's remaining home games, joined the student-athletes in interacting with the fans and giving away prizes.

CU Falls Short in Inaugural Governor's Cup

Colgate came just 49 seconds from forcing the third overtime of the inaugural Governor's Cup presented by Citizens Bank, but a lucky goal lifted Rensselaer to the tournament's first championship.

Dan Peace poked the puck past Raider junior goalie **Mark Dekanich** to seal the win. Tyler Eaves shot in from just inside the blue line, and the puck caught an upright Dekanich in the chest. He bobbled it, came off balance, and fell on his right side. Dekanich lost track of the puck in the crease, and Peace was waiting on the left side of the goalmouth to sweep it in.

Both Colgate and Rensselaer advanced to the title game by virtue of shootout wins in their respective semifinals. RPI skated to a 3-3 tie with Capital District rival Union, then beat the Dutchmen 2-0 in five rounds to go to the title game.

The Raiders finished their game with Quinnipiac in a 2-2 tie. Dekanich stymied all four Bobcat shooters, as junior **Tyler Burton** and sophomore **Peter Bogdanich** provided goals in the first and fourth rounds to clinch the shootout win. Bogdanich also scored the tying goal against the Bobcats to earn a spot on the all-tournament team. He was joined on the squad by classmate **Nick St. Pierre**, who netted the first goal against Quinnipiac and assisted on the only CU goal versus Rensselaer.

Special Teams Showcase

Colgate's second home game of the year against Canisius featured a combined 70 minutes worth of penalties as well as nine Raider goals, eight of which were scoring during special-teams situations.

The last time the Raiders had so many odd-man goals was in 1987 when they scored seven times on the power play and had one shorthanded goal in a 10-4 win at Cornell.

Six of Colgate's goals against Canisius came on the power play. The last time the Raiders capitalized on that many extra-man opportunities was in a 9-5 win against Toronto in 1991 when seven CU goals were power-play scores.

The Raiders' other two special teams goals against the Griffs were shorthanded scores. Colgate matched that feat just two years ago when Jon Smyth and Adam Mitchell both scored shorthanded in a 4-2 win at Ferris State.

One of CU's shorthanded goals was scored by junior **Tyler Burton** and came during a 5-on-3 Canisius power-play opportunity. The last player to score when the Raiders were two men down was the school's all-time leading scorer Mike Harder.

He achieved the feat in a 7-6 loss to Union during the 1993-94 season. Colgate's nine goals were the most the team had scored since it beat Vermont 9-4 on Jan. 24, 2004. The nine-goal margin of victory was the largest since the Raiders beat Plattsburgh State by 11, 14-3, on Dec. 11, 1992.

A Whistle Workout

Colgate had plenty of opportunity to work on its special-teams play during its first two home games of the season. Out of 120 minutes, less than 30 minutes were spent with the teams skating 5-on-5.

Against Bentley, the teams combined for 71 penalty minutes, creating just 14:33 of 5-on-5 play for the game. The longest consecutive stretch of 5-on-5 competition was 3:33 during the first period.

In a 9-0 mismatch against Canisius, Colgate scored eight special-teams goals. There was only 14:32 of 5-on-5 play against the Griffs, with the longest consecutive stretch of 5-on-5 being 1:38.

Raiders Rule the Faceoff Circle



Winchester

Colgate has become increasingly more successful in the faceoff circle as the season has progressed, going from a .450 winning percentage in the season-opener to a .618 winning percentage over the next three games. The Raiders have posted a cumulative 56.1 percent success rate in the circle this season, winning 527 of their 940 draw attempts.

Junior assistant captain **Tyler Burton** has attempted the most faceoffs on the team with 350, and he has won 201 of those draws for a .574 winning percentage. Classmate **Jesse Winchester** is the leader in terms of winning percentage with a 65.6 percent success rate. He has won 59 draws on 90 attempts. Just behind him in second place is freshman **David McIntyre**, who has a .655 winning percentage with 72 victories on 110 attempts.

Freshmen Get Their Feet Wet

All five Colgate freshmen have gotten on the ice this season, and they are already making their presence felt. In addition to goalie **Charles Long**, the four forwards in the class have combined for 15 points, or 14.7 percent of the team's scoring.

McIntyre was drafted by the Dallas Stars with the 138th overall pick in the fifth round.

Colgate's two draft picks were the most the Raiders have had selected in any NHL Draft since Bruce Gardiner and Chris MacKenzie were both selected by the St. Louis Blues in the 1991 draft. The pair of fifth-round picks mark the highest any Colgate player has ever been selected in terms of round, and the highest in terms of overall pick since 1988, when Craig Woodcroft was chosen by the Chicago Blackhawks with the 134th selection.

Mike Milbury '74 Gets Hall Call

Former Colgate hockey player Mike Milbury '74 was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame on Saturday, Oct. 7, in St. Paul, Minn. Milbury is the first Colgate player to ever be inducted into the Hall.

Milbury spent the last 35 years in the sport as a player, coach and general manager. He lettered three times as a Raider, and finished his college career with 61 points, including 55 assists, in 76 games. After graduation, Milbury became the first player in school history to sign a free-agent contract with a National Hockey League team when he inked a deal with the Boston Bruins.

Milbury spent his entire NHL career in Boston, where he played in 754 games and racked up 238 points. He went on to become the head coach of the Bruins, where he coached such hockey legends as Cam Neely and Ray Bourque. Milbury led Boston to the Stanley Cup finals during the 1989-90 season, and later became an assistant general manager for the club.

In 1995, Milbury joined the New York Islanders as head coach and general manager. He continued as the Islanders' GM through the end of the 2005-06 season, when he stepped aside to become a senior vice president for team owner Charles Wang's sports properties.

Dex's Rubber Road Trip

Dekanich saw a lot of rubber in Colgate's trip to Quinnipiac and Princeton. Against the Bobcats, he made 38 saves on 40 shots, and he saved a career-high 49 out of 51 shots versus the Tigers to finish the weekend with 87 saves and a .956 save percentage. His efforts earned him a spot on the ECACHL Weekly Honor Roll.

Dekanich has made 30 or more saves 14 times in his career, and he has posted a 7-3-4 record in those games. His winning percentage goes up to .700 (3-1-1) when he makes more than 40 stops in a contest.

Deuces Don't Translate to Wins

Dekanich allowed just two goals in each of three straight Colgate games, but the Raiders weren't able to generate enough offense to pull out wins. Dekanich's three straight two-goal games lowered his goals against average from 2.26 to 2.14 and improved his save percentage from .905 to .909.

Prior to that three-game stretch, Colgate was 17-1-4 when Dekanich allows two goals or fewer. The only loss the Raiders had during that time was to Cornell, 2-0, in the 2006 ECACHL semifinals.

Dekanich Slams the Door

During the three games against Niagara, Bentley and Canisius, Dekanich slammed the door on Colgate's opponents, allowing just two goals and making 54 saves for a 0.67 goals against average and .964 save percentage.

The three Raider wins mark the stingiest Dekanich has ever been over a three-game stretch in his career. Last season, Dekanich allowed just three goals in a three-game stretch twice: against Army, Brown and Yale he posted a 1.00 goals against average and .959 save percentage, and versus Rensselaer, Union and Western Michigan he had a 0.95 goals against average and .961 save percentage.

Dex Strings Together Shutout Streak

With his shutout of Canisius, Dekanich extended his shutout streak to more than 115 minutes. He entered the Governor's Cup semifinal game against Quinnipiac needing just over a period of scoreless hockey to set Colgate's record for consecutive shutout minutes, but fell short of that mark when QU's Bryan Leitch scored 14:46 into the first period.

Dekanich's streak ended at a career-long 130:07. The streak was 6:33 short of the Colgate career mark of 136:40, which was set by Jeff Cooper during the 1983-84 season. Cooper's streak ranks 14th in NCAA history.

Dex Gets Raiders on Winning Track

After starting the season with a disappointing showing at the Ice Breaker Tournament, Dekanich helped Colgate right the ship by posting back-to-back wins in which he has given up just one goal.

In the Raiders' first victory of the season, Dekanich played more than 40 minutes of scoreless hockey before Niagara ruined his shutout bid with a rebound goal at the 8:44 mark of the third period. Three days later, in Colgate's home-opener, Dekanich allowed an early first-period goal against Bentley, but kept the Falcons off the board for the rest of the game. For his efforts in helping Colgate to its first two wins of the season, Dekanich was named to the ECACHL Weekly Honor Roll on Monday, Oct. 16.

Burton Leads Offensive Onslaught

Burton led Colgate with three points on a goal and two assists against Canisius. His goal came in the second period on a shorthanded breakaway during a 5-on-3 Griff power play. His first assist also came during a 5-on-3 situation, this time a power play for the Raiders, when he assisted on sophomore Nick St. Pierre's first goal of the season. Burton also helped set up classmate Dustin Gillanders' first goal of the season, which was scored on the power play in the third.

Burton Doesn't Miss a Beat

Colgate's top returning scorer from last season, Burton picked up where he left off last year by scoring both Raider goals during the opening weekend of play. Burton gave Colgate its first lead of the new campaign with a second-period goal against Denver, then followed it up with the team's first power-play goal of the year late in the third period.

Burton the Best on Faceoffs

Last season, Burton led Colgate with a 58.4 percent success rate on faceoffs. He has continued to be successful on draws with a team-high 201 wins on 350 faceoff attempts for a .574 winning percentage, which ranks third on the team.

The Countdown to 100

With 89 points in two-plus seasons, Burton is the most prolific scorer on the team in terms of career points. After averaging 37 points through his first two years, Burton is on pace to score the 100th point of his career this year. If he achieves that feat, he will be the first player to reach the century mark before his senior season since Mike Harder (1994-97), Colgate's all-time leading scorer and the last Raider to wear jersey number 9, registered 104 points by the end of his sophomore campaign.

Dekanich single-handedly kept Colgate in the game in the first period by making a season-high 20 saves as his Raiders were outshot 20-6. Colgate didn't put a puck on Bobcat goalie Bud Fisher until more than 12 minutes had elapsed in the game, and by the time the Raiders got a shot on goal, Quinnipiac had already put 17 on Dekanich.

The Bobcats' persistence paid off midway through the second period. Just as a Quinnipiac penalty expired, the Bobcats gained the zone and streaked in on goal. Brandon Wong brought the puck in on net from the left, then slipped it across the crease to Ben Nelson, who scored backdoor.

Quinnipiac nearly made it 2-0 with 4:30 left in the middle stanza. The Raiders were on the penalty kill, and got caught on a line change, allowing QU to skate two men in on Dekanich uncontested. CU's netminder was up to the task, however, as he knocked down a shot by Jamie Bates with his glove, and then stuffed Wong on the rebound before his teammates managed to clear it out.

The Bobcats scored a second goal 12:04 into the third period on the power-play. Dekanich made the initial save on Matt Sorteberg, but the rebound came to David Marshall on the right side of the goalmouth, and he swept it into the open net while Dekanich was still down in the crease.

With just over a minute left in regulation, Colgate pulled Dekanich in favor of the extra skater. The Raiders struggled to keep the puck in the zone, but eventually worked it down low where **Tyler Burton** found **Jesse Winchester** in the right face-off circle, and Winchester beat Fisher at the 19:23 mark.

Colgate won the ensuing faceoff and Dekanich again retreated to the bench to put the extra man on the ice. However, Quinnipiac gained control in its own end with just over 10 seconds to play, and worked the puck up to Wong who sent a shot down the ice from the neutral zone that rolled into Colgate's empty goal to set the final score at 3-1.

The Bobcats posted 18 shots on five power-play opportunities through the first two periods.

Mark Dekanich made a career-high 49 saves to backstop Colgate to a 4-2 win against Princeton. The victory snapped CU's seven-game winless skid.

Colgate took the lead 4:03 into the contest during a 5-on-3 power-play opportunity. St. Pierre and Fredricks played give-and-go at the points before Fredricks sent it to Burton in the right faceoff circle. Burton sent the puck to Winchester at the top of the right circle, and he fired a shot that deflected into the goal off a Princeton skate.

The Tigers scored with 4:35 left in the game. Seconds after a 5-on-3 power-play opportunity expired to make it 5-on-4, Jody Pederson and Brett Wilson set up Grant Goeckner-Zoeller. He shot through traffic past Dekanich from the left circle.
