QUARTERBACK

By the time spring ball concludes, the coaching staff is hoping someone has stepped up to claim the number one position. They want to see someone establish himself head and shoulders above the other candidates.

Gone is starter Mike Saraceno, who was the starter for the past two seasons. The battle will be between juniors Alex Relph (5-11, 183), Dan Pitcher (6-0, 193) and Anthony Fucillo (6-2, 219) and sophomore Ryan Meyers (6-2, 222). Relph started one game last season against Lehigh, while Meyers saw action in one series against Georgetown.

RUNNING BACKS

Ready to spearhead the rushing attack for the third season is junior tailback Jordan Scott (5-10, 198), who rushed for a school record 2,598 yards in his first two seasons. Only the third running back in school history to post back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, Scott is poised for another run among the elite backs in the country.

The Patriot League Rookie of the Year in 2005 and first team all-league performer in 2006 has a nose for the end zone, where he has tallied 20 rushing touchdowns. He has 13 games over 100 yards rushing and three over 200 yards.

For the third straight season, senior J.J. Bennett (5-7, 196) will be Scott's backup at tailback. Bennett has been Colgate's third leading rusher in each of the last two seasons gaining 257 yards on 51 carries and scoring two touchdowns. Junior Steve Hansen (5-8, 176) has battled through injuries in his first two seasons, but if healthy, he should provide solid depth.

Eric Tupta (6-2, 229) returns as the starter at fullback after taking over that job late in the '06 season. He proved to be a solid blocker. Another experienced player for the Raiders is senior Robert Wenger (5-10, 236), who started the opening five games before suffering a season-ending concussion.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Colgate lost only all-league center Jake Sulovski through graduation. The key here is the four returning starters are one year older and stronger. Everyone has started at least one game for the Raiders. The four returning regulars from last year's offensive line unit helped clear the way for the second best running attack in the Patriot League. Junior Steve Jonas (6-4, 298) returns for his third season as a starter at tackle, joining sophomore left guard Zach Posey (6-1, 264), junior right guard Rich Rosabella (6-0, 256) and junior right tackle Nick Hennessey (6-5, 286). Sophomore Ryan Gross (6-2, 257),

who started six games in Sulovski's absence last year, should be the replacement at center.

TIGHT END

Tight end should be one of the strongest positions on the team. Junior Brent Dillingham (6-4, 262), who has eight games of starting experience, returns and is completely healthy for the first time in his career. In his first two seasons he has caught 33 passes for 373 yards and one touchdown.

Also vying for time at the position is sophomore Adrien Schriefer (6-1, 213), who spent the second half of the 2006 season at fullback.

WIDE RECEIVER

The quality and depth at wide receiver might be the best the Raiders have had in several seasons. Senior Erik Burke (6-1, 186), junior David Morgan (5-10, 177) and sophomores Wayne Moten (5-7, 167), Ty Henry (6-1, 174) and Pat Simonds (6-5, 210) are an experienced group of talented receivers. Joining them is junior Sam Breslin (5-11, 188), who has been a safety for the past two seasons.

Burke, a second team all-Patriot League selection last fall, was Colgate's leading receiver with 38 catches for 565 yards and one touchdown, while Morgan caught 31 receptions for 418 yards and four touchdowns. In his rookie season, Moten made 17 catches for 181 yards, while Henry caught seven passes for 60 yards and two touchdowns. Simonds is a player who could have a breakout season.





DEFENSIVE LINE

Colgate will field a defensive front that gained valuable experience last season. With that one year under their belts, the Raiders should be stronger this season. Every returning player either started or played in 2006.

Fifth-year senior Pat Nolan (6-4, 258), and sophomores Paul Mancuso (6-2, 269) and Carlton Walker (6-0, 254) return at tackle, while senior Ryan Keller (6-1, 229) is back at defensive end along with senior Owen Brenner (6-1, 232).

Nolan had 35 tackles for the Raiders last season with seven TFL's and four quarterback sacks, while Keller hauled down 47 runners with six TFL's.

LINEBACKER

Two of the three starters are gone though graduation. Senior All-America linebacker Mike Gallihugh (6-0, 197), who led the nation in tackles last season, is Colgate's top returnee. A finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, given to the outstanding defensive player in the nation, Gallihugh made 140 tackles, including 12 TFL's, four quarterback sacks, three PBU, two quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery and caused one fumble.

Looking to move up in the linebacker rotation are sophomores Greg Hadley (5-10, 213), Mark Colon (6-0, 203), David Ashton (6-0, 204), and Mike Gandy (6-0, 210), and junior Ted Marshall (6-2, 218). Spring practice will be important to all these players as they seek starting assignments.

SECONDARY

Colgate must replace both safeties with the graduation of strong safety Geoff Bean and free safety Andrew Moore. This is a major concern for the Raiders.

The 2007 secondary will be built around a pair of cornerbacks in three-year senior letterwinner Cody Williams (5-9, 190) and junior Chris Ekpo (6-1, 192). Williams has started 23 straight games making 102 tackles and seven interceptions, while Ekpo started all 11 games last fall. Another player who should compete for playing time is sophomore Will Griffin (5-9, 169).

Replacing last year's safeties will be a big task for the Raider coaching staff. Leading candidates are any combination of seniors Andre Dawson (6-0, 193) and Raymon Taft (6-0, 188), junior Andrew Kirkland (5-10, 181) and sophomores Uzi Idah (5-10, 197) and Garrington Spence (5-11, 192).

With the Raiders seeking depth in the secondary, opportunity exists for incoming freshmen.

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Raiders return placekickers Mike Buck (6-0, 192) and Jacob Stein (5-10, 169) along with sophomore long snapper Austin Douglas (6-3, 242) from last year's special teams unit.

Buck played in seven games making 4-of-4 field goal attempts and 13-of-17 extra point attempts, while Stein handled the kickoff duties and some placekicking responsibility.

The Raiders must replace four-year starting punter Jason Sutton, who was second team all-league last fall after averaging 40.1 yards per punt.

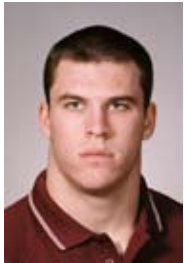
