OPENING KICK

- Navy (1-1, 0-1 in the American) and UAB (1-2, 0-0 in the American) will meet on the gridiron for the fourth time in series history (Navy leads 3-0) when the two square off on ESPN on Friday night (7:00 pm) at Protective Stadium (42,351) in Birmingham. It is the first conference game for UAB, while the Mids look to bounce back from a 38-30 loss to Florida Atlantic on Sept. 12.
- Navy won last year's game 38-24 in Annapolis as Alex Tecza rushed for 111 yards and one touchdown, while Blake Horvath threw for 168 yards and a touchdown and ran for 72 yards and two touchdowns in the conference opener for both teams. The game was tied at 24 at the half before Navy outscored the Blazers 14-0 in the second half.
- Navy's loss to FAU marked the first time it has lost the conference opener since 2023 when the Mids lost at Memphis 28-24. The loss also broke Navy's five-game winning streak dating back to last year and its nine-game winning streak in August and September dating back to 2024.
- The Mids will now try and make history as the last American Conference team to lose its conference opener and still win the conference championship was Cincinnati in 2014. The Bearcats lost their league opener to Memphis, 41-14, before winning their final seven conference games to finish 7-1 and earn a share of the American title. No team has lost its conference opener and gone on to win the American Conference Championship since the league instituted a championship game in 2015.
- Navy will not play another home game until Oct. 10 when it plays host to Tulsa. Navy played at FAU on Sept. 12, plays at UAB on Sept. 25 and at Air Force on Oct. 3. It is the first time Navy will play three-consecutive true road games since 2010 when the Mids played at Louisiana Tech (W, 37-23), at Air Force (L, 14-6) and at Wake Forest (W, 28-27). Navy finished that year with a 9-4 record, which included a 31-17 win over Army.
- This will be the first time Navy has played three of its first-four games of the season on the road (not counting neutral site games) since 1997, when the Mids played at San Diego State (L, 45-31), home vs. Rutgers (W, 36-7), at SMU (W, 46-16) and at Duke (L, 26-17). That team finished 7-4, which included a 39-7 win over Army, but did not go to a bowl game because two of those seven wins were against FCS teams.
- Navy is one of five schools in the country that will play three-consecutive road games in 2026, joining Western Kentucky, Syracuse, UNLV and Cal.
- Under Newberry, Navy is an incredible 15-3 (.833) at home and 12-10 (.545) away from the friendly confines of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium (8-7 on the road, 4-3 in neutral site games).
- The Mids have won seven-consecutive home games dating back to the 2025 season and are 11-1 (.917) at home since 2024. Navy last won seven-consecutive home games in 2018-19. Navy won 14 straight at home from 2014-16. Navy finished 6-0 at home in 2025. It is just the sixth time in school history Navy has gone undefeated at home in years it has played five or more home games. The Mids also went undefeated at home in 2019 (6-0), 2015 (7-0), 2013 (5-0), 2004 (6-0) and 1981 (5-0).
- The Mids will play seven-straight games without a bye starting with Friday's game at UAB. It is the most games Navy has played without a bye since 2022 when the Mids played nine-consecutive games without a bye. That team finished 4-8.
- Navy did not come up with a turnover in its first-two games of the year for the first time since 1987.
- Navy is an extremely young team, ranking 134th out of 138 FBS teams in career snaps played entering the 2026 season.
- Navy's winning percentage of .786 (22-6) over the past three seasons (2024-26) is the 11th best in the FBS and the second-best among non-autonomy 6 schools behind James Madison (.800, 24-6).
- Navy currently ranks second in the nation in rushing, averaging 376 rushing yards per game. Navy is averaging 6.9 yards per carry this year, which ranks sixth nationally.
- The Mids have scored five red zone touchdowns in five opportunities in 2026. Navy and Toledo are the only two schools in the FBS to score a touchdown this year every time it gets in the red zone.
- Not only is Navy No. 2 in the nation in rushing offense, but it is also No. 2 in rushing defense. The Mids are giving up just 40.5 rushing yards per game, second in the country to LSU (33.0 yds/gm).
- **Jackson Gutierrez** (Jr. / QB / RB) was listed on the depth chart at two different positions in 2025 and is again playing two different positions in 2026. He was the only player in the FBS to be listed on the three-deep depth chart at quarterback and at another position (running back) in 2025 and the same holds true in 2026. **Braxton Woodson** (Sr. / QB) played quarterback, snipe and wide receiver in 2025 as well.

- There are six different players on the depth chart that came to Navy as quarterbacks and are now playing different positions or splitting time at quarterback and another position. Starting wide receiver **Luke Hutchison** (Sr.) and snipes **Charles Robinson** (Jr.), **Tre Jones III** (Jr.), **Landon Walker** (So.) and **Evan Blouir** (Fr.) are all playing different positions, while **Jackson Gutierrez** (QB / RB, Jr.) is splitting time between quarterback and running back.
- Woodson's 148 rushing yards per game ranks fourth in the nation and first among quarterbacks. He is also averaging 8.46 yards per carry, which ranks fifth nationally and is the best mark among quarterbacks. His four rushing touchdowns in 2026 rank 13th in the FBS, while his 12 points per game rank sixth in the FBS.
- **Aiden Lyczek** (DE) is off to a great junior campaign after missing most of his sophomore year with a lower body injury. He did make it back to play in the final three games. In his first two games of the 2026 season, Lyczek has recorded eight tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks. He ranks ninth nationally in sacks per game.
- The last six times Navy has won the season opener, it has gone on to play in a bowl game. The Mids won the season opener this year 42-15 over Towson.
- Navy has gone to a bowl game in 12 of the last 13 years it has won its season opener.
- Navy has won 79-consecutive games at home when leading after 3 quarters, the nation's longest streak. The last time Navy lost at home when leading after 3 quarters was Oct. 23, 1999, when the Mids led Akron 29-13 and lost 35-29.
- Navy is 9-1 over the last two seasons when scoring on the opening drive and had won 17 straight when scoring on the opening drive dating back to 2021 before losing on Sept. 12 at FAU.
- Navy owns a 760-606-57 (.554) record over 146 seasons. The 760 wins are the 23rd most in the FBS and the most of any team not in the autonomy four.
- Brian Newberry started his head coaching career at Navy with a 20-10 record, which is the best 30-game start by a Navy head coach since Wayne Hardin went 20-9-1 from 1959-61. Ken Niumatalolo, the winningest head coach in school history, started his first-30 games at Navy with a 19-11 record. Newberry is currently 27-13 (.675) as a head coach, which ties him with Niumatalolo for the second best start in school history after 40 games. Bill Ingram owns the best start for a Navy coach after 40 games. He started 27-9-4 (.725) from 1926-30.
- Navy's senior class has put together a 27-13 (.675) record over four seasons, including a 17-8 (.680) mark in the American Conference. The record for wins by a class is 37 by the Class of 2017. That class posted a 37-16 (.698) record in its four years.
- **Hoke Smith II** (Sr. / OG) has the honor of wearing jersey No. 68 this season in memory of former Navy offensive lineman David Forney. Forney, who was a senior offensive lineman on the 2019 team, died on Feb. 20, 2020, after being found unresponsive in Bancroft Hall. He was 22 years old. Forney was a 3-year varsity letter winner for the Mids and played in 39-consecutive games over his final 3 seasons.

THE CAPTAIN'S CORNER

- Seniors **Giuseppe Sessi** (S) and **Braxton Woodson** (QB) were voted team captains for the 2026 season by their teammates. It is the greatest honor a Navy student-athlete can receive.
- Sessi started all 13 games last fall at safety and recorded 81 tackles, second only to linebacker MarcAnthony Parker. He also recovered a fumble, had a pass breakup and recorded a half-tackle for loss.
- He was part of a Navy defense that held each of its final three opponents under 300 yards of total offense (288 by Memphis, 202 by Army and 239 by Cincinnati).
- He posted a career-high 11 tackles in Navy's win over Temple, added 10 tackles against North Texas and had eight against both USF and Memphis.
- Woodson played in 10 games last fall, including his third career start against Notre Dame. He finished the year with 414 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 44 carries, while completing 9 of 19 passes for 110 yards. He also caught a 10-yard pass from Blake Horvath against Army.
- The highlight of Woodson's 2025 season came when he came off the bench in relief of an injured Horvath against USF and carried the ball nine times for 103 yards and two touchdowns. His touchdown runs covered 64 and 20 yards as Navy upset the Bulls.
- Woodson carried the ball 23 times for 101 yards and a touchdown against Notre Dame and rushed for 180 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries against VMI. He became the first FBS player to rush for 180 or more yards on seven or fewer carries since LSU's Clyde Edwards-Helaire accomplished the feat against Arkansas in 2019.

- Navy's roster represents 31 different states, including 3 players from the state of Alabama, which includes starting right guard **Hoke Smith II** (Sr. / Birmingham).
- The Naval Academy Athletic Association (NAAA) and USAA have extended their historic partnership for an additional 10 years, continuing a longstanding relationship built on shared values of service, leadership and commitment to those who serve. As part of the expanded partnership, USAA has been named the Anchor Partner of Navy Athletics, the highest level of corporate partnership within the Naval Academy Athletic Association. Beginning with the 2026-27 academic year, the USAA logo will appear on jerseys for 30 Navy varsity sports, providing a visible representation of the continued collaboration between two organizations with deep connections to the military community.
- Navy Athletics will celebrate the 100th anniversary of its only football national championship, honoring a remarkable 1926 team that finished 9-0-1 and captured a share of the national title. The Mids will wear a commemorative uniform with a special patch for the Notre Dame game in recognition of a team whose accomplishments remain one of the great chapters in Navy football history.
- Navy currently has four players on the active NFL rosters. 2nd Lt. Eli Heidenreich (RB / WR, Pittsburgh Steelers) and 2nd Lt. Landon Robinson (DL, Cincinnati Bengals) are both rookies, while 2nd Lt. Rayuan Lane (S, Jacksonville Jaguars) is in his second year. Joe Cardona (LS, Los Angeles Rams) is in his 12th NFL season, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Fame quarterback Roger Staubach for the longest NFL career by a former Navy football player. Staubach played 11 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys from 1969 through 1979.
- Navy's four players on active 53-man NFL rosters are believed to be the most from a service academy at one time in NFL history.

- Navy owns a 760-606-57 (.554) record over 146 seasons of football. The 760 wins are the 23rd most in FBS history, the most of any Service Academy and the most of any team not in the autonomy 4.
- With its 66-31 victory over East Carolina on Nov. 19, 2016, Navy became the 24th school in the FBS and the first Service Academy to reach 700 wins.
- Navy secured its 750th victory on Sept. 6 behind a 38-24 win over UAB in both teams' American Conference opener.

NAVY HITS THE 500 YARD RUSHING MARK AGAINST TOWSON

- Navy ran for 506 yards on 73 carries in its 42-15 win over Towson in the season opener.
- The 506 rushing yards are the 12th most in school history and the most since the Mids ran for 559 yards against SMU in 2017.
- The 73 carries are tied for the 8th most in school history and the most since 2022.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- In Navy's season-opening victory over Towson, **Braxton Woodson** (Sr. / QB) and **Jackson Gutierrez** (Jr. / QB / FB) became the first pair of Navy quarterbacks to run for two or more touchdowns in the same game since the 2017 Military Bowl. Woodson scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns, while Gutierrez ran for the first-two rushing touchdowns of his career.
- In the 2017 Military Bowl, starter Malcolm Perry ran for two touchdowns before leaving with an injury, while Zach Abey ran for five in a 49-7 rout of Virginia.

NAVY AMONG THE TOP RUSHING TEAMS IN THE COUNTRY ON A YEARLY BASIS

- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for a fourth-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished second in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yds/gm.
- Navy was second in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yds/gm. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy again finished second in the country, averaging 326.7 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged a then school-record 351.4 yds/gm in 2017, which was the 2nd most in the country.
- In 2019, Navy once again led the nation in rushing with its school-record 360.5 yds/gm. The Mids outrushed 2nd-place Air Force by 62 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged 247.5 rushing yards per game in 2024, the 6th-best average in the FBS and the program's best since 2019 when it averaged a school-record 360.5 rushing yards per game. Navy's 38 rushing touchdowns in 2024 were the 6th most in the country.
- The Mids led the FBS in rushing in 2025, averaging 285.6 yards per game. It's the first time Navy has led the FBS in rushing since 2019 when the Mids ran for a school-record 360.5 yards per game. Navy's 41 rushing touchdowns tied for second in the FBS. Navy was second in the FBS in rushing yards per carry (5.76).
- Navy is ranked second in the nation in rushing this season, averaging 376.0 rushing yards per game. Army leads with 394.0 yards per game.
- Navy is averaging 6.9 yards per carry in 2026, which ranks sixth nationally.

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the second-most by a quarterback in FBS history.
- Reynolds is the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.
- Ricky Dobbs ran for 27 touchdowns in 2009, which is tied with Collin Klein of Kansas State for the third most in FBS history among quarterbacks.
- Will Worth ran for 25 touchdowns in 2016, which are the fifth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 24 touchdowns in 2015, which are the sixth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 23 touchdowns in 2014, which ties as the seventh-most by a quarterback.

WOODSON NAMED TO MAXWELL AWARD AND SHRINE BOWL WATCH LISTS

- Braxton Woodson** (Sr. / QB) has been named to the Maxwell Award Watch List by the Maxwell Football Club.
- The Maxwell Award has been presented annually to the outstanding player in college football since 1937.
- It is named in honor of Robert "Tiny" Maxwell, a former standout at Swarthmore College and a renowned sportswriter and football official.
- Navy has had four winners of the Maxwell Award, the last coming in 1963 when Roger Staubach earned the honor. Ron Beagle (1954), Bob Reifsnyder (1957) and Joe Bellino (1960) also won the Maxwell.
- Woodson was also named to the Shriners Children's East-West Bowl 1000
- Every year, approximately 1,000 all-star-game-eligible players are drafted, signed as undrafted free agents, or attend rookie minicamps. The Shriners Children's East-West Bowl 1000 provides a look into the organization's scouting process while previewing college players who are eligible for the 2027 Shriners Children's East-West Bowl and the 2027 NFL Draft.

IT'S BRAXTON'S TURN

- **Braxton Woodson** (Sr. / QB) started his senior year off with a bang, rushing for a career-high 200 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 23 carries in Navy's 42-15 win over Towson. Woodson's previous high was 180 yards in last year's season opener against VMI. It was also the fourth time in Woodson's career he has scored multiple touchdowns.
- Woodson's 200 yards rushing are the most by a Navy player since Blake Horvath rushed for 211 yards against Memphis on Sept. 21, 2024 in a 56-44 win.
- Woodson rushed for 96 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries before leaving with a lower body injury on the first drive of the third quarter against FAU.
- Woodson's 148 rushing yards per game ranks fourth in the nation and first among quarterbacks. He is also averaging 8.46 yards per carry, which stands fifth nationally and is the best among quarterbacks. His four rushing touchdowns in 2026 ranks 13th in the FBS, while his 12 points per game is sixth best in the country.
- Last year, Woodson came off the bench and ran for a career-high 180 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries in Navy's 52-7 win over VMI in the 2025 opener. He played a little more than a quarter in the game.
- Woodson's 180 yards rushing on just seven carries are the most yards rushing in seven carries or less since LSU's Clyde Edwards-Helaire ran for 188 yards on six carries against Arkansas on Nov. 23, 2019 in a 56-20 LSU win.
- Woodson had touchdown runs of 74 and 68 yards against the Keydets.
- Woodson saw action against Tulsa, carrying the ball three times for 14 yards.
- He entered the game against Temple as a fullback next to Horvath in the shotgun formation. Horvath ran for a 59-yard touchdown on that play after faking a handoff to Woodson as most of the defense was focused on Woodson.
- Woodson continued to see more playing time against FAU running for a 16-yard touchdown when he lined up as a snipe and completing a pass after getting a handoff from Horvath for 23 yards.
- He was the starting quarterback against Notre Dame and rushed for 101 yards on 23 carries.
- Woodson entered the game in the third quarter for a cramping Horvath and ran for 103 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries to help lead Navy to the 41-38 upset of #24 South Florida. Woodson scored on touchdown runs of 20 and 64 yards.
- Woodson caught one pass for 10 yards in the Army-Navy game.
- He averaged an incredible 9.4 yards per carry on his 44 carries in 2025 and was third on the team in rushing touchdowns with six.
- Woodson started the 2024 game against East Carolina and led Navy to 34 second-half points in the Mids' 34-20 win over a good Pirates squad.
- Against ECU, Woodson ran the ball 15 times for 125 yards and two touchdowns while throwing for 165 yards and a TD.
- As a freshman, he played in four games and made his first career start against Air Force.
- He was one of 19 true freshmen quarterbacks in the FBS who earned a start in 2023. He closed out the year with 173 yards rushing on 53 carries (3.3 yds/carry, 43.3 yds/gm) and a touchdown, while completing 17 of his 40 passes (42.5) for 163 yards (40.8 yds/gm) with an interception and a touchdown.
- Woodson scored his first-collegiate rushing touchdown on a career-long 69-yard run against SMU.
- Made his first-career start against Air Force, becoming just the sixth freshman in school history to start a game at quarterback for Navy and only the third to make his first-career start against Air Force (2020 - Xavier Arline at Tulane, 2012 - Keenan Reynolds at Central Michigan, 1991 - Jim Kubiak vs. Air Force, 1987 - Alton Gizzard vs. Air Force, 1974 - Mike Roban at Georgia Tech).
- After entering the game at 7:12 in the opening quarter for an injured Tai Lavatai, led Navy to a 14-0 victory at Charlotte in just his second career appearance. He completed five of

his 14 pass attempts for 85 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 58 yards on 18 carries. He hit Eli Heidenreich for a 69-yard touchdown pass (12:30, 3Qtr), the first touchdown pass of his career.

MIDS HAVE QB'S LINED UP EVERYWHERE

- Navy has six players on the depth chart who came to the Academy as quarterbacks and are now playing different positions or splitting time at quarterback and another position.
- Starting wide receiver **Luke Hutchison** (Sr.) and snipes **Charles Robinson** (Jr.), **Tre Jones III** (Jr.), **Landon Walker** (So.) and **Evan Blouir** (Fr.) are all playing different positions, while **Jackson Gutierrez** (QB / RB, Jr.) is splitting time between quarterback and running back.

GUTIERREZ PRESENTS THREAT AT MULTIPLE POSITIONS

- **Jackson Gutierrez** (Jr. / QB / RB) was listed on the depth chart at two different positions in 2025 and is again playing two different positions in 2026. He was the only player in the FBS to be listed on the three-deep depth chart at quarterback and at another position (running back) in 2025 and the same holds true in 2026.
- Gutierrez saw time at both positions in the 2026 season opener against Towson, running eight times for 31 yards and the first two rushing touchdowns of his career.
- Gutierrez came on at quarterback in relief of an injured **Braxton Woodson** (Sr. / QB) against FAU and played extremely well. He rushed for 75 yards and a touchdown on just seven carries and completed six of his 12 pass attempts for 100 yards and two touchdowns. Gutierrez scored on a 48 yard touchdown run while throwing touchdown passes of 64 and eight yards, as he nearly led Navy to a miracle comeback. Navy came from 38-7 down to score 23-consecutive points over the final 16 minutes only to fall short 38-30.
- Gutierrez saw time at both positions in 2025, running for 156 yards on 26 carries, while catching two passes for 12 yards. The coaches had enough confidence in him that he caught the pass on fourth down that sealed the win over Air Force.
- He rushed for 37 yards on seven carries while playing quarterback against Notre Dame.
- He made his collegiate debut at quarterback in his freshman year at ECU where he carried the ball five times for 20 yards.

SMITH II WEARS #68 IN MEMORY OF DAVID FORNEY

- **Hoke Smith II** (Sr. / OG) has the honor of wearing jersey No. 68 this season in memory of former Navy offensive lineman David Forney.
- Forney, who was a senior offensive lineman on the 2019 team, died on Feb. 20, 2020, after being found unresponsive in Bancroft Hall. He was 22 years old. Forney was a 3-year varsity letter winner for the Mids and played in 39-consecutive games over his final 3 seasons.
- In 2019, Forney started all 13 games at guard and was the anchor of an offensive line that set a school record and led the nation in rushing, averaging 360.5 yards per game. Forney was extremely proud of being part of a senior class that authored the second-greatest turnaround in the history of FBS football as the Mids won a school-record tying 11 games, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, shared the American Conference West Division title and won the Liberty Bowl. Forney was named First-Team All-American Conference and First-Team All-East.
- In 2020, Navy honored Forney by wearing a sticker on the back of its helmets that pictured him running out of the tunnel at the 2019 Army-Navy game carrying the American flag with the word Brotherhood underneath. Additionally, Navy did not issue jersey No. 68 until the Army-Navy game when starting offensive lineman Billy Honaker wore it to honor his friend.
- At the start of the 2021 season, it was determined that a senior offensive lineman would be assigned No. 68 each year to remember Forney. Pierce Banbury (C / OG) was the first to be tabbed with the honor, followed by Kip Frankland (OT) in 2022, Lirion Murtezi (C) in 2023, Connor McMahon (OT) in 2024 and Ben Purvis (OG) in 2025.
- A native of Walkersville, Md. and a 2015 graduate of Georgetown Prep, Forney is survived by his parents, Rick and Erika Forney, younger brothers, Chris and Erik, and sister, Rebekah.
- Forney, who was a member of the ninth company at the Naval Academy and a political science major, would have graduated on May 22, 2020. He was due to serve as a cryptologic warfare officer.

HUTCHISON NAMED TO EARL CAMPBELL TYLER ROSE AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Luke Hutchison** (Sr. / WR) has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List.
- The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award recognizes the top offensive player in Division I football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell: integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity—specifically, the persistence and determination to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals.
- In addition, nominees must meet one or more of the following criteria: They must have played football at and graduated from a Texas high school and/or currently play at a four-year college in Texas.
- The Watch List will be narrowed to 16 semifinalists in November and five finalists in December. The semifinalists and finalists will be selected by broadcasters, commentators, journalists, fans and previous winners.
- The winner will be announced in December and celebrated at the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Banquet scheduled for Jan. 27, 2027, in Tyler, Texas.
- Hutchison started six games last year for the Mids, missing four games due to a broken collarbone.
- He was a touchdown machine for Navy last year, scoring four times on just six touches (3 receiving and 1 rushing).
- In his career, Hutchison is averaging 18.0 yards per catch with nine receptions for 162 yards.
- Hutchison did not have a touch in the season opener against Towson and he had one catch for 27 yards against FAU.

NICHOLS ONE OF 40 CENTERS NAMED TO THE RIMINGTON WATCH LIST

- **Cam Nichols** (Sr. / C) is one of 40 centers, including four from the American Conference, named to the 2026 Rimington Trophy Watch List, which recognizes the nation's top center.
- Ironically, Nichols started at guard in the first two games because that allowed Navy to get its best five linemen on the field.
- This year, the Rimington Trophy committee worked with Pro Football Focus (PFF) to narrow down its list to the top 40 centers. PFF grades every player on every play of every game based on how well they execute their assignment. That play-by-play grading allowed the Trophy committee to create a watch list based both on nominations from the schools and data provided by PFF.
- Once the season begins, schools will be able to nominate their centers for late addition based on in-season merit.
- Nichols has been a starter in 20 games in his career and has earned two varsity letters.
- He helped anchor an offensive line that earned a spot on the 2025 Joe Moore Award Midseason Honor Roll.

LISTORTI NAMED TO 2026 COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- **Vic Listorti** (Sr. / RB) has been named to the 2026 Comeback Player of the Year watch list released by College Sports Communicators in association with the Associated Press and the Fiesta Sports Foundation.
- Since 2018, the award has recognized college football student-athletes who have overcome injury, illness or other circumstances. At the conclusion of each season, three student-athletes are selected as Comeback Player of the Year Award winners in a vote by a panel of college football writers, editors and sports information directors. The winners are honored at the Vrbo Fiesta Bowl.
- College athletics communications professionals who work with football programs are encouraged to nominate deserving candidates at Comeback-Player.com.
- Listorti appeared in just five games last fall after battling a hamstring injury for most of the season.
- He was projected to serve as the backup to Alex Tecza, but finished the year with just three carries for 17 yards.
- Listorti had a breakout performance in the 2026 season opener against Towson, rushing for a career-high 81 yards and his first-career touchdown on 11 carries. His touchdown came on a dazzling 35-yard jaunt.
- Listorti ran the ball four times for 35 yards against FAU and lost a fumble.

JOHNSON LOOKING TO BUILD ON STANDOUT FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

- **Malcolm Johnson** (So. / OT), who had primarily seen action as a member of the PAT/FG unit, made his first-career start against FAU at offensive tackle in 2025.
- He was the first Navy freshman to start on the offensive line since 1997 when Duncan Cave started the SMU game at center for an injured Brian Drechsler.
- Johnson also started against North Texas, Notre Dame, USF, Memphis, Army and Cincinnati.
- He was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year.
- Johnson started the first two games of the 2026 season against Towson and FAU.
- Johnson played just one year of high school football, his senior year, as a wide receiver. He was recruited by Navy to play tight end and while at the Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, R.I. he grew into an offensive tackle.
- Johnson was a second-team All-State basketball player in Utah.

WINNING EARLY AND OFTEN

- Navy's 10-game winning streak over a two-year span (2024-25) tied for the longest winning streak in school history.
- Navy also won 10-consecutive games in 1959-60, 1917-18 and 1910-11.
- Navy was riding a five-game winning streak before falling at FAU on Sept. 12.

- Rayne Fry (Sr. / LS) is one of 20 players named to the Patrick Mannelly Long Snapper of the Year Watch List. Additionally, he is one of two players from the American Conference to make the list.
- Fry, the 2025 American Conference Deep Snapper of the Year and a First-Team All-American Conference selection, is entering his fourth season as Navy's starter after taking over the role in the fourth game of his freshman season.

CARLSON IMPRESSIVE IN DEBUT

- Jacob Carlson (Jr. / P) was impressive for Navy in his first year on the job as a sophomore.
- Carlson averaged 44.5 yards per punt in 2025, which is the fourth-best punting average in school history for a single season.
- He had two punts in the 2026 opener against Towson, averaging 42.5 yards per punt and killing one inside the 20.
- Against FAU, Carlson punted four times for 480 yards (45.0 average) with a long of 52..

- Josh Switzer (Sr. / S) is one of the smartest midshipmen at the Naval Academy where he carries a 3.99 grade-point average while majoring in Ocean Engineering (Honors).
- Switzer has received just **ONE** A- in his four years at Navy (freshman year, American Naval History). He is ranked 12th in the senior class (1,078 students) in overall order of merit which factors in athletics, academics and military performance. He has been on the Superintendent's and Commandant's list all six semesters.
- Switzer is working on an honors thesis which is an independent research project developing an inverted pendulum wave energy converter for renewable energy.
- Switzer is also working on a capstone project developing a buoy to launch UAV's for port defense.
- He is a Naval Academy STEM outreach volunteer. During the spring semester, he spends his weekends at local high schools and teaches STEM camps about hydraulics.
- He is a member of the Society of American Engineers, as well as Vice President of Tau Beta Pi Honor Society (Engineering honor society) and a member of the society of American Military Engineers.
- He completed an internship at the Naval Research Laboratory researching 3D printed brass and its corrosion effects.

PARKER A TACKLING MACHINE

- MarcAnthony Parker (Jr. / LB) had a standout sophomore campaign. A starter in 12 of the 13 games last year, he led Navy in tackles with 97 (45-52), while recording 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, four QB hurries, recovered a fumble and had an interception. He was named Third-Team All-American Conference.
- Parker has 18 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack this season. His nine tackles per game rank 21st in the FBS.

CAULEY HAS STATEMENT SEASON IN 2025; LOOKING FOR BIGGER AND BETTER THINGS IN 2026

- Coleman Cauley (Sr. / LB) had five tackles in Navy's 42-15 win over Towson in a game that saw the defense play just 39 plays and hold the Tigers to 39 yards rushing on 20 carries.
- He followed up with eight tackles in Navy's 38-30 loss at FAU.
- Cauley had a huge day against FAU last fall in what was his first-career start and was named the American Conference Defensive Player of the Week.
- He led the Mids in tackles with a then career-high nine, recorded a 1/2 tackle for loss, forced two fumbles and recovered one of his forced fumbles that ended up resulting in a Navy touchdown. On the next series he picked off his first-career pass, which also would result in a Navy touchdown.
- He had 10 tackles in his second-career start against North Texas and eight tackles against Notre Dame.
- Cauley was everywhere against USF, recording a career-high 11 tackles in Navy's upset win.
- He had seven stops in Navy's win over Memphis and followed up with a team-high 10 tackles in Navy's win over Army.
- He had a monster game against Cincinnati in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, recording 10 tackles and intercepting a pass that he returned for a touchdown. For his efforts, he was named the Defensive Most Valuable Player.
- Cauley's three forced fumbles tied for the 15th most in the FBS.

LYCZEK OFF TO A GREAT START

- Aiden Lyczek (Jr. / DE) is off to a great junior campaign after missing most of his sophomore year with a lower injury. He did make it back to play in the final three games.
- This season, Lyczek has recorded eight tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks.
- He ranks ninth nationally in sacks per game and 19th in tackles for loss per game.

ONIHA STEPS UP

- Ira Oniha (Sr. / CB) is hoping for an even bigger year in 2026, after a breakout 2025 campaign.
- Oniha tied his career high with six tackles in Navy's 42-15 win over Towson in the 2026 season opener.
- Oniha was banged up entering the FAU game and only played on Navy's first series.
- Oniha broke up three passes in Navy's 42-23 win over Tulsa in 2025. The three pass breakups are tied for the second most at Navy in the last 20 years.
- He came back to post four tackles in Navy's win over Rice.
- He had three more pass breakups in Navy's win over Temple.
- He had two tackles and another pass breakup against FAU.
- He had two tackles including a tackle for loss against Notre Dame.
- His seven pass breakups were three more than the next-closest teammate (Justin Ross had 4).
- Born in Baltimore to Nigerian parents, Oniha attended elementary school and a year of middle school in the U.S. His family returned to Nigeria where he attended two years of middle school at a boarding school before returning to Maryland for his high school education.
- He is the second born of quadruplets. His brothers Osezenoria (oldest) and Oseikhuemen (youngest) graduated from UMBC in 2026, while his sister Obeliaghe graduated from Georgetown in 2025.
- His given name is Irabonoise and means "I lift my hands to praise the Lord."

MIDS LOOKING FOR HAMILTON TO STEP UP IN 2026

- Phillip Hamilton (Jr. / S) made his mark at safety in 2025 after starting the year at corner.
- Against USF, Hamilton recorded seven tackles, an interception and a forced fumble in Navy's upset win over the Bulls.
- For his efforts, he was named the American Conference Defensive Player of the Week.
- Hamilton's interception against Army, when he was playing corner, set up the game-winning touchdown in the Mids 17-16 victory over the Black Knights. He was named the Duke Cannon Army-Navy Defensive Player of the Game.
- Hamilton recorded 49 tackles, picked off three passes and forced two fumbles on the year.
- While Hamilton did not play in the opener against Towson (coaches decision), he had four tackles and a half tackle for loss in Navy's loss at FAU.

PERSON FAMILY HONORED

- On Sept. 4, thanks to a generous donor, the doctor's office in the Romo Athletic Training Room in Ricketts Hall was named in memory of William and Suzanne Person. The Persons had four sons earn letters as football players at the Naval Academy: Andy ('96) was a rare four-year letterwinner, Chris ('98) earned one letter, Dan ('03) earned two letters and Joe ('07) earned two letters. Andy is still the career sacks (22) and tackles for a loss (44) leader.

GET 6

- Since his arrival in 2019, **Brian Newberry** has challenged the defense to "Get 6" in every game.
- What does Get 6 mean? It's a combined total of 6 three-and-outs, fourth down stops and turnovers. A missed field goal counts as a fourth down stop.
- If that turnover is returned for a score, it counts as an extra point towards the goal of 6.
- Newberry believes that if the defense can accomplish the challenge, the Mids will have a great chance to win.
- In Newberry's 6 years at Navy, the Mids are 29-5 (.853) and have won 12 in a row when they "Get 6" (8-0 in 2019 / 2-0 in 2020 / 2-2 in 2021 / 2-1 in 2022 / 5-2 in 2023 / 6-0 in 2024 / 4-0 in 2025) and 20-33 (.377) when they don't (8-3 the last two years, 7-2 in 2025 and 1-1 in 2026).
- In 2023, Navy's defense achieved a "Get 6" on .536 percent of its drives, the best percentage during Newberry's tenure.

HEIDENREICH AND TECZA MAKE HISTORY

- Second Lt. Eli Heidenreich and Alex Tecza of the United States Marine Corps made Naval Academy football history on Aug. 27 when they appeared for the Pittsburgh Steelers in a 28-27 preseason loss to the Buffalo Bills.
- Heidenreich and Tecza are believed to be the fourth pair of Naval Academy graduates to appear for the same team in the same NFL game. They are the second pair of former Navy football teammates, and the first pair of Marine Corps officers who graduated from the Naval Academy, to accomplish the feat.
- The first pair of Naval Academy graduates, and the first former Navy teammates, believed to have appeared for the same team in the same NFL game were Tyree Barnes ('09) and Eric Kettani ('09), who played for the New England Patriots during the 2011 preseason.
- Two other pairs of Naval Academy graduates have appeared together in an NFL preseason game. Kettani and Joe Cardona ('15) played for the Patriots in 2015, while Cardona and Diego Fagot ('22) played for New England in 2023.
- Heidenreich carried the ball nine times for 35 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown run, and returned two kickoffs for 47 yards. Tecza saw action on special teams.
- Navy currently has four players on the active NFL rosters. 2nd Lt. RB / WR Eli Heidenreich (Pittsburgh Steelers) and 2nd Lt. DL Landon Robinson (Cincinnati Bengals) are both rookies, while 2nd Lt. Safety Rayuan Lane (Jacksonville Jaguars) is in his second year. Long snapper Joe Cardona (Los Angeles Rams) is entering his 12th NFL season, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Fame quarterback Roger Staubach for the longest NFL career by a former Navy football player. Staubach played 11 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys from 1969 through 1979.
- Navy's four players on active 53-man NFL rosters are tied for the 10th most among Non-Autonomy 6 programs and are believed to be the most from a service academy at one time in NFL history.
- Multiple Navy and Marine Corps officers have played in the NFL and returned to active duty for their service commitment.
- Those officers include 1st Lt. Malcom Perry, who transitioned back into the active-duty component of the Marine Corps in 2022 after playing in the NFL. He is currently serving as an unmanned aerial systems officer stationed in Yuma, Ariz., where he leads Marines and integrates cutting-edge technology to ensure the Corps is prepared for the complexities of the modern battlefield.

NAVY TO HONOR 1926 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM WITH THROWBACK-INSPIRED UNIFORM AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- Navy football will honor the 100th anniversary of its 1926 national championship team by wearing a commemorative Under Armour uniform inspired by the one worn by the Midshipmen a century ago when Navy takes on Notre Dame on Saturday, Oct. 31 at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The Navy-Notre Dame game is presented by Navy Federal Credit Union and Navy Mutual.
- The uniform commemorates Navy's only football national championship team, which finished the 1926 season undefeated at 9-0-1 and earned a share of the national championship.
- The jersey is a modern interpretation of the iconic "Chevron Stripe" uniform worn by Navy during the 1926 championship season. It features nine stripes across the upper body—four on the front and five on the back—symbolizing the nine victories recorded by the Midshipmen that season.
- The uniform features Navy's traditional blue-and-gold color palette and pays tribute to the Naval Academy alma mater, "Navy Blue and Gold." The song was first performed publicly in its current form on April 24, 1926, and was officially designated as the Academy's alma mater in 1927. The words "Navy Blue and Gold" are inscribed on the interior collar of the jersey.
- Additional elements of the uniform draw inspiration from Naval Academy artifacts bearing the championship year of 1926. The back-neck locker tag is based on the Class of 1926 pin, which features an eagle, trident and the year 1926. The same emblem was incorporated into the Class of 1926 ring, while the jersey numbers were inspired by the typography found on the class pin.
- The uniform also features a commemorative patch recognizing the 100th anniversary of Navy's 1926 national championship.

- Nearly a century ago, college football faced a situation that would generate plenty of debate even today: three undefeated teams with claims to the national championship.
- Navy, Stanford and Alabama each completed the 1926 season without a loss. Stanford finished 10-0-1 after playing Alabama to a 7-7 tie in the Rose Bowl, while Navy and Alabama each finished 9-0-1. With no playoff or formal national championship system, the title was determined by the recognized selectors of the era. Boand and Houlgate both selected Navy as national champion.
- The foundation for Navy's championship season was laid by first-year head coach Bill Ingram, a former Navy standout who played for the Midshipmen from 1916-18. Ingram took over a program that had won just seven games over the previous two seasons and immediately engineered a turnaround built around a powerful rushing attack and physical brand of football.
- At the center of that attack was All-America tackle and team captain Frank Wickhorst, whose blocking helped create opportunities for quarterback Tom Hamilton and Navy's formidable ground game.
- One of the defining moments of the season came against Michigan before 80,000 fans at Baltimore's Municipal Stadium. After a scoreless first half, Navy scored 10 points in the second half to defeat the Wolverines, 10-0. The Midshipmen produced 165 yards of offense, with Hamilton and Henry Caldwell leading the rushing attack and Caldwell scoring the game's only touchdown on a one-yard run.
- The victory was particularly satisfying after Michigan had handed Navy what was then the worst loss in program history, 54-0, the previous season. Navy fans celebrated the 1926 victory by tearing down the goal posts at both ends of the stadium and carrying away the markers lining both sides of the field.
- The victory improved Navy to 9-0 heading into its season finale against Army at Chicago's Soldier Field. More than

110,000 fans packed the stadium for a game The New York Times' James R. Harrison called "the greatest of its time" and "a national spectacle."

- Navy jumped to a 14-0 lead before Army rallied to take a 21-14 advantage early in the third quarter. The Midshipmen answered behind their ground attack, led by Alan Shapley. Facing fourth down and three yards to go, Shapley broke through for an eight-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 21-21.
- Army had one final opportunity to win the game, but a 25-yard field-goal attempt in the fourth quarter sailed wide. The tie preserved Navy's undefeated season and helped secure its place in college football history.
- The 1926 season also produced a remarkable connection between Navy and Notre Dame.
- Notre Dame entered its Nov. 27 game against Carnegie Tech undefeated at 8-0 and had surrendered only one touchdown all season. The Fighting Irish appeared to be headed toward a possible national championship before Carnegie Tech stunned Notre Dame, 19-0, at Forbes Field in Pittsburgh.
- Notre Dame head coach Knute Rockne wasn't there to see it.
- Confident his team would defeat Carnegie Tech, Rockne instead traveled to Chicago to watch the Army-Navy game at Soldier Field. While Rockne watched Navy preserve its undefeated season with a 21-21 tie against Army, Carnegie Tech was handing Notre Dame its only loss of the season.
- Notre Dame would finish 9-1.
- One hundred years later, that unusual intersection of Navy and Notre Dame history provides another connection as the Midshipmen honor the team that delivered the program's only national championship.
- The 1926 team remains one of the great chapters in Navy football history—a team coming off two difficult seasons, led by a first-year head coach, that went undefeated, defeated Michigan, battled Army to a tie before more than 110,000 fans and finished the season as a national champion.

THE PETE MEDHURST NAVY RADIO NETWORK BROADCAST BOOTH

- Navy Athletics has named its home radio booth the Pete Medhurst Navy Radio Network Broadcast Booth in honor of longtime broadcaster Pete Medhurst. The dedication ceremony was held prior to the start of the Towson game. A plaque honoring Medhurst will be displayed outside of the broadcast booth.
- Medhurst passed away in January of 2025, following a courageous battle with brain cancer. He was 55 years old.
- Medhurst was in his 12th year as the Voice of Navy Football and had been with the Navy Radio Network since 1997. He handled pregame, postgame, sideline and play-by-play duties for football and play-by-play for men's and women's basketball, men's and women's lacrosse, baseball, volleyball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming & diving, wrestling and Brigade Boxing.
- Medhurst, born and raised in Anne Arundel County and a graduate of Southern High School, had been the play-by-play announcer for Navy basketball for 14 seasons and the voice of Navy lacrosse for 24 years.
- Medhurst also handled football play-by-play duties for HDNet and CBS Sports Network and lacrosse for ESPN and the Big Ten Network. He also filled in on radio broadcasts for the Washington Nationals and was the proud owner of a 2019 Washington Nationals World Series ring.
- Medhurst called 240-consecutive Navy football games from either the sideline or the booth before missing the game at Rice on Nov. 2, 2024, after being diagnosed with cancer.
- Medhurst began his broadcasting career at WNAV 1430 AM in Annapolis. He then transitioned to a radio station in Pocomoke City and covered games at Salisbury University and high schools on the Eastern Shore.
- In addition to his duties at Navy, Medhurst worked pre and postgame shows for the Washington Nationals on WJFK-FM 106.7 in Washington, D.C., filling in as the play-by-play announcer for the Nationals.
- For the two years prior to his death, Medhurst also worked as a studio host for the Ravens Radio Network, providing his voice for pre and postgame shows on WBAL 1090 AM and WIYY 98 Rock in Baltimore.
- Additionally, he called horse races at Rosecroft Raceway in Fort Washington.
- Medhurst is survived by his wife, Brenda, his sons, Ryan and Cody Joyce, and daughter, Kelly.

NAVAL ACADEMY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION AND USAA EXTEND HISTORIC PARTNERSHIP

- The Naval Academy Athletic Association (NAAA) and USAA have extended their historic partnership for an additional 10 years, continuing a longstanding relationship built on shared values of service, leadership and commitment to those who serve.
- As part of the expanded partnership, USAA has been named the Anchor Partner of Navy Athletics, the highest level of corporate partnership within the Naval Academy Athletic Association.
- Beginning with the 2026-27 academic year, the USAA logo will appear on jerseys for 30 Navy varsity sports, providing a visible representation of the continued collaboration between two organizations with deep connections to the military community.
- The expanded partnership will provide a comprehensive presence across Navy Athletics, including the USAA logo on the field for regular season football games at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, expanded physical and digital venue signage, social media and video collaborations and additional opportunities to engage with Navy's student-athletes, fans and alumni.
- USAA's partnership with Navy Athletics also includes hospitality opportunities and digital assets.
- The Naval Academy Athletic Association, founded in 1891 by Robert Means Thompson, is a 501C3 non-profit organization whose objective is to "promote, influence, and assist in financing the athletic contests of the midshipmen of the United States Naval Academy" in accordance with the

policy of the Superintendent of the Academy. Through an intercollegiate athletic program that is one of the largest in the country, and a highly organized club sports program and intramural sports program, each midshipman is afforded the opportunity to compete in athletics at a level commensurate with their abilities. The emphasis on physical fitness is borne out in the first line of the mission of the Naval Academy: To develop midshipmen morally, mentally and physically. The NAAA operates one of the few in-house multi-media sales units in the FBS and commercial partnerships directly impact the Naval Academy's Physical Mission.

- The Naval Academy Athletic Association (NAAA) announced a series of new premium hospitality enhancements in the South End Zone area at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The \$7.5 million project will open for the 2026 Navy football season and reflect a commitment to a first-class fan experience at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The project was made possible through the leadership support of several Naval Academy alumni.
- The hospitality enhancements are part of Navy Athletics' broader strategic vision to elevate fan engagement, increase premium inventory and create new opportunities for season ticket holders, alumni, donors, sponsors and fans to engage with Navy football and lacrosse in support of the Physical Mission at the Naval Academy. All Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium hospitality spaces are also available for year-round use for special events.
- **South End Zone New Additions in 2026**
- The Naval Academy Athletic Foundation Pavilion, located in the Southwest End Zone, is home to the Naval Academy's Superintendent pregame VIP and donor tailgate and will also serve as a new donor hospitality space following the tailgate. The Pavilion is named in honor of the Naval Academy Athletic Foundation Trustees (former Naval Academy Foundation Athletic & Scholarships Program) who partner with the NAAA to help provide annual Physical Mission support to all 36 Navy varsity and 15 club sports.
- Located on the second level of the Naval Academy Athletic Foundation Pavilion, The Gladchuk Club offers an upscale and modern hospitality setting designed to create a unique and memorable experience for Navy Athletics leadership supporters. The Gladchuk Club is named in honor of former Navy Athletic Director Chet Gladchuk who retired last year following 24 years leading the NAAA.
- The Class of 1981 Club is a new exclusive "super suite" experience at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium located on the second level of the Minter Pavilion. The 1981 Club offers an upscale and modern hospitality environment designed to create a first-class experience for Navy Athletics leadership supporters. The 1981 Club is named in honor of the Naval Academy Class of 1981 for its leadership commitment to the Physical Mission.
- The Minter Pavilion, located in the Southeast End Zone, provides a new premium indoor-outdoor hospitality experience, beginning pregame, for Blue-N*-Gold annual members. The Minter Pavilion is named in honor of Vice Admiral Charles Minter '37 who served as the Naval Academy's 43rd Superintendent from 1964-65. Admiral Minter also had the honor of serving as the Academy's Commandant of Midshipmen. He is notably the only officer in modern times to have held both of these leadership positions at the Academy.
- The Anchor Club, located on the concourse level of the Minter Pavilion, will debut a completely upgraded experience in 2026 for Blue-N*-Gold members.

A LOOK BACK AT 2025

- Navy (11-2) finished the 2025 season ranked 23rd in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls. It is only the fourth time since 1963 Navy has ended the season ranked in the AP Poll and the first time since 2019. Navy was among three teams in the American Conference that finished the year ranked in the top 25 (Tulane and North Texas), which is one more team than the ACC had.
- Navy finished the season strong with a 35-13 win over Cincinnati in the Liberty Bowl. It was Navy's fourth-consecutive bowl win, all against autonomy four teams (Virginia, Kansas State, Oklahoma and Cincinnati). Navy's last five bowl wins have come against autonomy four teams (Pitt, Virginia, Kansas State, Oklahoma and Cincinnati). Navy is 7-1 in its last eight bowl games.
- The Liberty Bowl was Navy's 26th bowl appearance (14-11-1 all-time) and marked the third time the Mids have appeared in the Liberty Bowl (2-1).
- Navy recorded back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history. The 11 wins in 2025 tied the school record for most wins in a season (Navy also won 11 games in 2015 and '19).
- Navy's 21 wins over the last two years are the most wins in school history over a two-year span.
- Navy defeated Army 17-16 on Dec. 13 to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, which is presented annually to the winner of the football competition among the three major service academies (Navy, Air Force and Army) and is named in honor of the President of the United States.
- Navy has won the CIC Trophy 13 times in the last 23 years, including each of the last two years. Navy won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy in back-to-back years for the first time since 2012-13. The Mids are a combined 32-15 (.681) against Army and Air Force over the last 47 games.
- Navy was named the winner of the Lambert Trophy, which is awarded to the best team in the East. It is the 1st time since 2015 and just the 2nd time since 1963 the Mids have won the Lambert Trophy.
- Navy finished in a three-way tie for the American Conference regular-season title with North Texas and Tulane, but did not play in the championship game due to Tulane being ranked in the CFP and North Texas beating Navy head-to-head.
- The Navy Football Strength of Record (ESPN metric) was 17th in the country. That was the best in the American Conference and ahead of such Autonomy four teams as Illinois, Michigan, Missouri, USC, LSU, Tennessee, Arizona, Georgia Tech, Washington, Arizona State, Houston, Virginia, Louisville, TCU, Iowa State, Pitt, SMU and NC State.
- Navy defeated #24 USF on Senior Day in Annapolis 41-38. It was Navy's third win over a ranked opponent in the last two years. Navy defeated #19 / #22 Army (31-13) and RV / #22 Memphis (56-44) in 2024.
- It is the first time Navy has beaten three ranked opponents over a two-year span since 1957-58 when the Mids beat #5 / #5 Notre Dame (20-6) and #10 / #9 Army (14-0) in 1957 and #8 / #7 Rice (20-7) and #14 / #12 Michigan (20-14) in 1958.
- Navy's Class of 2026 put together a 30-20 (.600) record, including a 21-11 (.656) mark in the American. The 21 conference wins are the most of any other Navy class (Joined the American in 2015).
- The 30 wins are the most by a Navy senior class since the Class of 2020 posted a 30-23 (.566) mark, including a 20-12 (.625) record in the American.
- The Mids led the FBS in rushing, averaging 285.6 yards per game.
- Navy's 41 rushing touchdowns tied with Utah for the 2nd most in the FBS behind North Texas (49).
- Navy finished 2nd in the FBS in rushing yards per carry, averaging 5.76 yards per carry. Utah finished 1st at 6.02
- Navy finished second in the country in passing yards per completion, averaging 15.9 yards per catch.
- Navy finished third in the nation with 10 offensive plays going for 60 yards or more.
- Navy gave up 3.1 tackles for loss per game, which was the fewest in the country.
- The Navy defense held its final three opponents under

300 yards of total offense (Memphis-288 yards, Army-202 yards, Cincinnati-239 yards). It is the first time Navy has held 3-straight opponents under 300 yards since 2020.

- The Mids tied for third in the country in fewest sacks allowed (9). Navy's offensive line was on the Midseason Watch List for the Joe Moore Award, which is given to the nation's best offensive line.
- Navy's 24 first-time starters in 2025 were tied for the second most in the country.
- **Blake Horvath** was named a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year award and the Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Year. He was also named the ECAC Offensive Player of the Year.
- Horvath was named a first-team Academic All-American and the Div. I Football Team Member of the Year by the College Sports Communicators. He is the 13th Navy football player to be named a first-team Academic All-American and the 1st Navy player to be named the overall football scholar-athlete of the year, an award that has been handed out since 1987.
- Horvath was named the winner of the Maxwell Club's inaugural Military Service Academy Leadership Award, established to honor a player from one of the United States Military Service Academies who exemplifies exceptional leadership both on the football field and within their academy community.
- Horvath was also a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the Academic Heisman. Horvath graduated with a 3.73 grade-point average majoring in operations research. He is the 11th Navy player to be named a finalist and the 1st since Cameron Kinley in 2020.
- **Eli Heidenreich** was invited to the East-West Shrine Game. He is the 35th Navy football player to be selected and the first since linebacker Diego Fagot in 2021, who earned defensive MVP honors. Heidenreich is Navy's first offensive player to be selected since Malcolm Perry in 2019 and the first non-quarterback since wide receiver Brandon Turner in 2012. Heidenreich was joined by **Landon Robinson** (Sr. / NG), giving Navy two players in the East-West Shrine Game for the first time since 1957. They were among the four game captains selected to represent the East.
- Heidenreich earned an invite to the NFL Combine.
- Either Heidenreich or **Alex Tecza**, Navy's dynamic duo from Pittsburgh who grew up as childhood friends, scored a touchdown for Navy in 28 of their 36-career games (they scored in the same game nine times, including the season finale against Cincinnati in the Liberty Bowl). Heidenreich recorded 23-career touchdowns (seven rush, 16 rec), while Tecza had 26 (23 rush, three rec). Remarkably, they each scored the same number of touchdowns as high school teammates (29). Both made their first-career start at Memphis in 2023.
- Robinson was among the seven semifinalists for the Outland Trophy. He was one of only two defensive linemen to be named.
- Robinson was named a first-team All-American by *USA Today*, *Sports Illustrated*, the *Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and by Phil Steele. He was named a second-team All-American by the Walter Camp Foundation, ESPN and the *Sporting News*.
- Robinson, who was also named the American Conference Defensive Player of the Year and the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year, recorded 64 tackles, a team-high 8.5 tackles for loss, a team-high 6.5 sacks and a team-high 7 hurries in 2025.

NAVY NAMED ONE OF THE TOP 11
COMMUNICATIONS OFFICES IN THE COUNTRY
FOR THE FIFTH-CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- One first-time winner and 10 previous selections comprised the 17th Super 11 Awards, presented annually by the Football Writers Association of America to the best performing College Sports Communicators departments in the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision. The awards announced were for the 2025 season.
- The 2025 Super 11 Award is a record 13th for Clemson and its staff led by Ross Taylor, Assistant Athletic Director for Football Communications. Nebraska and its staff led by Keith Mann, Associate Athletic Director for Communications, earned its 12th. Navy and its staff led by Scott Strasemeier, Senior Associate Athletic Director for Sports Information, won for a ninth time.
- Other awards with their CSC directors and their staffs went to Iowa (Matt Weitzel), South Carolina (Steve Fink), Tennessee (Bill Martin) and West Virginia (Mike Montoro) each a fourth time; Texas Tech (Matt Dowdy) a third time and Ohio State (Jerry Emig) and San José State (Sky Kerstein) a second time. The first-time recipient in the 2025 Super 11 was Kansas (Andrew Eisch). The Super 11 began with the 2009 season.
- The winners were deemed to have had excellent accessibility during the week of their games and after the game with a program's players, coaches and coordinators/assistant coaches. Other criteria regarding beat reporter access, interview requests, and decorum and protocols in the press box and locker room are listed in the FWAA Directory.
- In January of 2009, the FWAA released the first Super 11 Awards – a concept supported by the College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA). The FWAA has now awarded at least one Super 11 Award to 83 FBS different programs.
- 78 schools have made the list since the award's inception

- in 2009. Eight schools have made the list 6 or more times: Clemson (13), Nebraska (12), Colorado (10), **Navy** (9), USC (8), Pitt (7), Georgia (6) and Kansas State (6).
- Navy has appeared on the Super 11 list 5-consecutive years, the third-longest active streak: Clemson (11), Nebraska (6), **Navy** (5), Iowa (2), South Carolina (2), Tennessee (2), Texas Tech (2) and West Virginia (2).
 - The American Conference has had 7 schools make the list for a combined 18 appearances, the most appearances on the list among non Power 4 conferences: Navy (9), ECU (2), Rice (2), UAB (2), Army (1), Memphis (1) and Tulsa (1).
 - Conference appearances (based on 2025 alignment): Big 12 (38 appearances), Big Ten (37), ACC (34), SEC (29), American (18), Mountain West (12), MAC (7), Sun Belt (7), Conference USA (4) and Pac-12 (1).

THE NAVAL ACADEMY

As the undergraduate college of the Naval service, the Naval Academy prepares young men and women to become professional officers in the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps. USNA students are midshipmen on active duty in the U.S. Navy. They attend the academy for four years, graduating with bachelor of science degrees and reserve commissions as ensigns in the Navy or second lieutenants in the Marine Corps.

Founded in 1845, Academy started as the Naval School on 10 acres of old Fort Severn in Annapolis with an original class of 55. In 1850, it became the United States Naval Academy. A new curriculum went into effect requiring midshipmen to study at the Academy for four years and to train aboard ships each summer. Congress authorized the Naval Academy to begin awarding bachelor of science degrees in 1933.

"To develop midshipmen morally, mentally and physically and to imbue them with the highest ideals of duty, honor and loyalty in order to graduate leaders who are dedicated to a career of naval service and have potential for future development in mind and character to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship and government."

NAVY HEAD COACH BRIAN NEWBERRY

8TH SEASON AT NAVY | 4TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH



• In his third year at the helm, Navy had one of the best seasons in school history finishing with an 11-2 record and ranked 23rd in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches polls. It is only the fourth time since 1963 Navy has ended the season ranked in the AP poll and the first time since 2019.

- Newberry started his head coaching career at Navy with a 20-10 record, which is the best 30-game start by a Navy head coach since Wayne Hardin went 20-9-1 from 1959-61. Ken Niumatalolo, the winningest head coach in school history, started his first-30 games at Navy with a 19-11 record.
- Newberry is currently 27-13 (.675) as a head coach, which ties him with Niumatalolo for the second best start in school history after 40 games. Bill Ingram owns the best start for a Navy coach after 40 games. He started 27-9-4 (.725) from 1926-30.
- Navy finished strong in 2025 with a 35-13 win over Cincinnati in the Liberty Bowl. It was Navy's fourth-consecutive bowl win, all against Autonomy four teams (Virginia, Kansas State, Oklahoma and Cincinnati).
- Newberry has produced back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history. The 11 wins this year tied the school record (Navy also won 11 games in 2015 and 2019).
- Navy's 21 wins over the last two years are the most wins in school history over a two-year span, while its 22-5 record (.815) over the last three years is the eighth-best winning percentage in the FBS and the best among the Non-Autonomy four.
- Navy defeated Army 17-16 to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, which is presented annually to the winner of the football competition among the three major service academies (Navy, Air Force and Army) and is named in honor of the President of the United States. Navy has won the CIC Trophy in back-to-back years and has won it 13 times in the last 23 years.
- Navy was also named the winner of the Lambert Trophy, which is awarded to the best team in the East. It is the 1st time since 2015 and just the 2nd time since 1963 the Mids have won the Lambert Trophy.
- Navy finished in a three-way tie for the American Conference regular-season title with North Texas and Tulane, but did not play in the championship game due to Tulane being ranked in the CFP and North Texas beating Navy head-to-head.
- The Navy Football Strength of Record (ESPN metric) in 2025 was 17th in the country. That was the best in the American Conference.
- Navy defeated #24 USF on Senior Day in Annapolis 41-38. It was Navy's 3rd win over a ranked opponent in the last 2 years. Last year, Navy defeated #19 / #22 Army (31-13) and RV / #22 Memphis (56-44).
- It is the first time Navy has beaten three ranked opponents over a two-year span since 1957-58 when the Mids beat #5 / #5 Notre Dame (20-6) and #10 / #9 Army (14-0) in 1957 and #8 / #7 Rice (20-7) and #14 / #12 Michigan (20-14) in 1958.
- Navy's two losses in 2025 came against teams with a combined record of 22-4 (North Texas was 12-2, Notre Dame was 10-2).
- Navy finished 6-0 at home in 2025. It is just the sixth time in school history Navy has gone undefeated at home in years it has played 5 or more home games.
- Landon Robinson was named a first-team All-American in 2025 by *USA Today*, *Sports Illustrated*, the *Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and by Phil Steele. He was named a second-team All-American by Walter Camp, ESPN and *The Sporting News*. Robinson is the 1st Navy player to be named a first-team All-American in 40 years (Napoleon McCallum in 1985) and the 1st defen-

sive player in 50 years (Chet Moeller in 1975).

- In his second year as the head coach at Navy (2024), Newberry led the Mids to a 10-3 record, wins over Air Force and Army to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and a victory over Oklahoma to win the Armed Forces Bowl. The 10 wins marked just the sixth time in school history Navy has won 10 or more games in a season.
- The win over Oklahoma in the Armed Forces Bowl was the first time Navy has defeated a team from the SEC in a bowl game since 1954 (1955 Sugar Bowl) when the Mids beat Ole Miss 21-0. It was the first win against an SEC team overall since Navy defeated Vanderbilt in 2004.
- Navy finished the regular season with a complete domination of Service Academy rival #19 Army, knocking off the Black Knights 31-13 in the 125th playing of the Army-Navy Game presented by USAA. With wins over Air Force and Army, the Mids won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.
- Navy won the two Service Academy games in 2024 by a combined 45 points, which ties the 2019 Navy team for the biggest combined CIC blowouts by any of the three Service Academies since 2007 when Navy beat Air Force and Army by a combined 46 points.
- Navy's win over Army gave Navy victories over two ranked opponents for the 1st time since 1958, when the Mids defeated #8 / #7 Rice 20-7 and #14 / #12 Michigan 20-14. Navy defeated #24 (Coaches) Memphis 56-44 on Sept. 21, 2024.
- Navy was predicted to finish 11th in the 2024 American Conference preseason poll and ended the year tied for third with Memphis (Navy beat Memphis head-to-head) with a 6-2 mark.
- Newberry's hiring of Drew Cronin as the offensive coordinator proved to be brilliant as the Mids scored 407 points in their 13 games in 2024, 195 more than they scored in their 12 games in 2023.
- In his first year as head coach (2023), Newberry led Navy to a 5-7 record and a 4-4 mark in the American Conference. Navy, picked ninth in the preseason poll by the league's coaches, finished tied for fifth in the American.
- The five wins were the most by a Navy team since 2019, while five of Navy's seven losses came at the hands of a team that played in a bowl game including two teams that finished in the top 25 (Notre Dame at #14 and SMU at #22).
- The 2023 season was highlighted by a defense that was one of only two (Penn State) in the FBS to record 3 shut-outs.
- Navy's defense also finished second in the nation in fumbles recovered (14), third in red zone defense (allowed opponents to score just 72% of the time), fourth in turnover margin (+0.92) and 19th in stop rate (71.3%).
- Newberry was named head coach on Dec. 19, 2022, by Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. Newberry had served as the Mids' defensive coordinator the previous four seasons.
- Newberry and his wife, Kate, are the parents of a son, Max, and a daughter, Lyla.

- UAB enters Friday's game with a 1-2 record, defeating Louisiana Monroe (26-20) and losing to Illinois (42-23) and Louisiana (21-14). The Illinois game was much closer than the final score indicated.
- UAB has 59 transfers on its roster, including 28 from the autonomy 4 conferences.
- Redshirt junior and Georgia transfer Rod Robinson II leads the Blazers in rushing with 225 yards on 48 carries, while redshirt senior running back and South Alabama / Louisiana Monroe transfer Bam McReynolds has rushed for 143 yards and a touchdown on 36 carries.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Ryder Burton, a transfer from BYU and West Virginia, has completed 41 of his 72 pass attempts for 478 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.
- Wake Forest transfer EJ Reid, a redshirt sophomore wide receiver, is Burton's favorite target. He has 12 catches for 119 yards and a touchdown, while Southern Miss / Texas State transfer Ty Mims, a redshirt senior wide receiver, has nine catches for 120 yards and two touchdowns. Mims is also an excellent punt returner, averaging 15.2 yards per return which ranks 23rd nationally.
- Redshirt senior linebacker Muaaz Byard, a transfer from Middle Tennessee State, leads the Blazers defense with 30 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss, while redshirt junior linebacker Ike Esonwune, a transfer from Oklahoma State, has recorded 26 stops with one interception. Byard is 10th in the FBS in tackles per game (10.0).

- The UAB defense is sixth in the nation in passing yards allowed, giving up just 116.0 yards per game.
- Senior kicker Jonah Delange is one of the best in the country, making all seven of his field goal attempts and all six of his extra point attempts. He is third in the country in field goals per game.

GREAT MOMENTS IN NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM HISTORY

Sept. 26, 1959 – Navy defeats William & Mary 29-2 in the first game played at the stadium.

Sept. 24, 1960 – President Eisenhower watches as the Midshipmen defeat Villanova 41-7.

Nov. 12, 1960 – Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino of Navy sets a school record by scoring four touchdowns in a 41-6 win over Virginia.

Oct. 26, 1963 – Heisman Trophy winner Roger Staubach leads the Mids to a 24-12 win over unbeaten Pittsburgh by completing 14-of-19 passes, seven to Jim Campbell.

Sept. 23, 1967 – Navy receiver Rob Taylor sets school records for most catches (10) and most yards receiving (140) in a game, as Navy beats Penn State 23-22 when Taylor catches a 16-yard TD pass with 57 seconds left.

Nov. 12, 1977 – Navy beats Georgia Tech 20-12 as Naval Academy alumnus President Jimmy Carter watches.

Sept. 12, 1981 – Navy defeats The Citadel for its 500th all-time win.

Nov. 7, 1981 – Eddie Meyers sets a Navy record for most rushing yardage in a game with 298 yards and four touchdowns in the Mids' 35-23 win over Syracuse.

Nov. 17, 1984 – Navy defeats second-ranked South Carolina 38-21 in one of the biggest upsets ever for the Mids. It marks only the third time Navy has beaten an opponent ranked this high.

Sept. 22, 1990 – Alton Grizzard becomes Navy's all-time career total offense leader in a 23-21 win over Villanova.

Oct. 5, 1996 – The Mids explode for 64 points to top Duke 64-27 on Homecoming.

Nov. 9, 1996 – Navy clinches its first winning season since 1982 with a 30-14 victory over Delaware.

Sept. 13, 1997 – Chris McCoy ties an NCAA record by rushing for three touchdowns on consecutive carries, as Navy defeated Rutgers 36-7.

Nov. 22, 1997 – Pat McGrew had a 91-yard touchdown run, second longest in school history and longest in stadium history, as Navy rolls over Kent State 62-29.

Nov. 22, 2003 – Quarterback Craig Candeto directed touchdown drives on all eight possessions he played as Navy destroyed Central Michigan 63-34 in front of a Senior Day crowd of 29,527. The win made Navy bowl eligible for the first time since 1996.

Nov. 20, 2004 – Seniors Kyle Eckel, Aaron Polanco and Eric Roberts rushed for two touchdowns apiece as Navy routed Rutgers 54-21, in front of a Senior Day crowd of 33,615. Navy, which scored 47-consecutive points in the game, rushed for 476 yards and had 613 yards of total offense. The victory gave the Mids an undefeated record at home for the first time since 1996.

Oct. 8, 2005 – On a day that was already special because of the rededication of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, sophomore Joey Bullen made it even more memorable by drilling a 46-yard field goal with four-tenths of a second remaining to give Navy a thrilling 27-24 comeback victory over Air Force.

Aug. 30, 2008 – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and three touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.

Nov. 1, 2008 – Linebacker Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime and quarterback Ricky Dobbs' one-yard run in the extra session gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 overtime victory over Temple.

Sept. 26, 2009 – Navy celebrated the 50th anniversary of the first game played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium by wearing replica 1959 jerseys against Western Kentucky. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs rushed for 143 yards and four touchdowns in the 38-22 victory.

Oct. 3, 2009 – The Navy defense completely shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while junior kicker Joe Buckley drilled three field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.

Nov. 14, 2009 – Ricky Dobbs rushed for a then Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium-record five touchdowns on 26 carries to help lead Navy to a 35-18 victory over Delaware.

Oct. 20, 2012 – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana 31-30 in front of 33,441 fans on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parrish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.

Oct. 26, 2013 – One week after missing an extra-point in the second overtime that cost his team a chance to defeat Toledo, Nick Sloan redeemed himself against Pittsburgh booting a 30-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.

Oct. 25, 2014 – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns on 39 carries to give Navy a 49-39 Homecoming victory over San Jose State. Reynolds' first touchdown of the day set the school record for career rushing touchdowns with 50.

Nov. 15, 2014 – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record six touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.

Sept. 19, 2015 – Keenan Reynolds ran for five touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut 45-21.

Oct. 3, 2015 – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.

Oct. 31, 2015 – Keenan Reynolds scored twice in the fourth quarter to tie the collegiate mark for career rushing touchdowns and Navy set a school record with three 100-yard rushers in a 29-17 victory over USF. Reynolds finished with 117 yards rushing, while Chris Swain rushed for a game-high 131 yards and Dishan Romine had 117 yards. It marked the first time in program history that three players each rushed for 100 or more yards in a game.

Nov. 14, 2015 – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record, scoring four rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of the Mustangs. The four rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.

Dec. 28, 2015 – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career in spectacular fashion, rushing for three scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 victory over Pittsburgh in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown, with 4:19 remaining, clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, which is a school record.

Oct. 22, 2016 – Will Worth rushed for 115 yards and threw two touchdown passes to help lead Navy to a 46-40 victory over #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a team ranked in the Top 10 since 1984. Navy entered the game as a 17-point underdog, but shredded the No. 1-ranked rushing defense in the country for 306 yards on the ground. Josiah Powell's 34-yard interception return for a touchdown was the big play of the game.

Oct. 7, 2017 – Zach Abey threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds left to lead Navy to a 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792.

Nov. 11, 2017 – Malcolm Perry rushed for 282 yards and four touchdowns in his first career start at quarterback and backup kicker JR Osborn hit an 18-yard game-winning field goal as time expired to give Navy a 43-40 victory over SMU. Perry's 282 yards rushing are the third most in school history.

Dec. 28, 2017 – Zach Abey came off the bench to rush for five touchdowns, and starting quarterback Malcolm Perry ran for 114 yards and two touchdowns as Navy rolled to an easy 49-7 victory over Virginia in the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman.

Oct. 5, 2019 – Malcolm Perry scored on a 4-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds remaining to give Navy a stunning 34-25, victory over Air Force. The Falcons had scored 16 consecutive points in the final quarter and took the lead on a 1-yard run by Taven Birdow with 3:15 left in the game. However, Perry led an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to claim the victory in the first leg of the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy. Navy linebacker Tony Brown returned a fumble 7 yards in the closing seconds to round out the scoring.

GREAT MOMENTS IN STADIUM HISTORY CONT.

Oct. 26, 2019 – Bijan Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired and Navy edged Tulane 41-38. Nichols' kick - a yard shy of a career long - capped a seven-play drive in the final 61 seconds to secure bowl eligibility for the Midshipmen for the 15th time in 17 years. Sophomore fullback Jamale Carothers rushed for a career-high 154 yards and accounted for four touchdowns and quarterback Malcolm Perry rushed for 142 yards and threw for a touchdown for the Midshipmen.

Nov. 11, 2023 – Safety Rayuan Lane III returned an interception 97 yards for a touchdown to cap off a dominant defensive performance in Navy's 31-6 win over UAB. It was the longest interception return in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium history and the second longest in school history.

Sept. 21, 2024 – Quarterback Blake Horvath rushed for 211 yards and 4 touchdowns while throwing for 192 yards and 2 touchdowns as Navy beat No. 23 Memphis for the first time in 5 years, 56-44. Navy clinched the game on an 86-yard interception return by Rayuan Lane III with 25 seconds remaining and Memphis driving for the game-winning score.

Oct. 19, 2024 – Corner Dashaun Peele set a school record by returning two interceptions for a touchdown in Navy's 51-17 rout of Charlotte. Peele had interception returns of 61 and 84 yards in the game.

Oct. 4, 2025 – Quarterback Blake Horvath threw for 339 yards and three touchdowns, all to snipe Eli Heidenreich, while rushing for 130 yards and a touchdown to lead Navy to a thrilling 34-31 victory over Air Force at a sold out Navy-Marine Memorial Stadium in the first leg in the race for the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy. The 469 yards of total offense by Horvath set a school record, while his 339 passing yards were the fifth most by a Navy player in program history. Heidenreich was equal to Horvath, catching eight passes for 243 yards to go along with the three touchdowns. His 14-career touchdown catches set a school record, while his three touchdown catches tied the school record for most in a game. His 243 yards receiving also set a school record.

Nov. 15, 2025 – Snipe Eli Heidenreich caught five passes for 146 yards and became Navy's all-time receiving yards leader, backup quarterback Braxton Woodson ran for 103 yards and two touchdowns in the fourth quarter in relief of Blake Horvath (21 carries, 68 yards; 8-15 passing for 147 yards and one touchdown) and the Midshipmen defeated No. 25 South Florida 41-38. Senior Alex Tecza carried the ball 12 times for 126 yards, including an early 76-yard score, and caught Horvath's lone touchdown pass.

HONORING NAVY GREATS JOE BELLINO AND ROGER STAUBACH

JOE BELLINO

- In August of 2019, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced **Joe Bellino's #27** would be placed on the turf at the 27-yard line at both ends of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium facing Navy's sideline as a tribute and in memory of the 1960 Heisman Trophy winner, who passed away on March 27, 2019.
- He was the first Navy player to win the Heisman Trophy and the first to have his number retired.
- Bellino, a native of Winchester, Mass., was known as the player who was never caught from behind. In just three seasons, he scored 31 touchdowns, rushed for 1,664 yards on 330 carries, returned 37 kicks for 833 yards and set 15 school records.
- Bellino was a unanimous All-America selection at halfback in 1960 and was also the winner of the Maxwell Award. His end zone interception preserved Navy's 17-12 win over Army that season. The Midshipmen were ranked as high as fourth in the country and went on to play in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1961.
- Bellino capped off his senior year (1960-61) by winning the school's top two athletic awards, the Thompson Trophy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. It marked the first time in 41 years that one midshipman received both of these awards.
- Bellino's #27 football jersey was retired after the 1960 season. He had a three-year stint with the Boston Patriots after he had completed his four-year service obligation. He stayed in the Navy Reserves for 24 more years and reached the rank of Captain.
- He was a 1977 inductee into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was named to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial All-Stadium Team. During its annual season-ending football banquet, Navy presents the Joe Bellino Award to the varsity football player whose inspiring on-field performance made a significant impact on the team and contributed to its overall success during the season.

ROGER STAUBACH

- In October of 2023, Gladchuk announced **Roger Staubach's #12** would be placed on the turf at the 12-yard line, opposite of Bellino's #27.
- Known as "Roger the Dodger," Staubach has scrambled his way to success as a college athlete, an All-Pro NFL quarterback and as a successful businessman.
- In 1963, Staubach became the second Naval Academy football player in four years to win the Heisman Trophy. It

- was his junior season with the Midshipmen, and all he did was lead Navy to a ranking of second in the country and a berth in the Cotton Bowl, where he set Bowl records for pass completions (21 of 31) and yards passing (228). The Midshipmen posted wins over West Virginia, Michigan, Notre Dame and Maryland that season. He completed 106 passes in 161 attempts for 1,474 yards, while earning consensus All-America honors, as well as the Maxwell Trophy and Walter Camp Memorial Trophy.
- At one time, Staubach, who was hampered by injuries in his senior season of 1964, had set 28 Naval Academy records in football.
- Staubach was the recipient of the Naval Academy's Thompson Trophy Cup for three-consecutive years and was the 1965 winner of the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. He was the first sophomore to win the Thompson Trophy Cup and is its only three-time winner. He was only the fourth midshipman since 1900 to win both the Thompson Trophy Cup and NAAA Sword.
- After four years in the United States Navy, including a tour in Vietnam, Staubach joined the Dallas Cowboys and led that team to unprecedented heights. Again, displaying the daring play he had shown at Navy, Staubach directed the Cowboys to 23 fourth-quarter comeback wins, including 14 in the final two minutes of a game or in overtime. He played 11 seasons with the Cowboys and led them to the Super Bowl four times, including world championships in 1972 and 1978. Cowboys were 90-31 with Staubach as
- Among his awards were the NFL Players Association Most Valuable Player and The Sporting News NFL Player of the Year in 1971, Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl VI (1972), Washington Touchdown Club NFC Player of the Year in 1976 and 1978, NFC Pro Bowl selection five times, the Vince Lombardi Sportsman of the Year Award in 1975, NFL Players' Association NFC Offensive Player of the Year (1978), and the Byron "Whizzer" White Humanitarian Award in 1979.
- Staubach was named the Walter Camp Foundation Man of the Year in 1985, selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1985, his first year of eligibility, and inducted into the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame in 1981.
- The football locker room in Ricketts Hall was named in his honor in 1996, and in 2008, Staubach received the National Football Foundation's Gold Medal, the highest honor one can receive from that organization. Staubach has also been honored as a "Distinguished Graduate" of the United States Naval Academy.

NAVY 42, TOWSON 15

SEPT. 5, 2026 • ANNAPOLIS, MD. • NMC MEMORIAL STADIUM • 32,654

- **Braxton Woodson** (Sr / QB) rushed for a career-high 200 yards and three touchdowns, while Navy amassed 506 yards on the ground in a 42-15 season-opening victory over Towson (0-2).
- Woodson carried the ball 23 times and averaged 8.7 yards per carry, scoring on runs of 38, eight and four yards. His 200 rushing yards were the most by a Navy player since Blake Horvath rushed for 211 yards against Memphis on Sept. 21, 2024.
- Navy's 506 rushing yards on 73 carries were the 12th most in school history and the most since the Mids rushed for 559 yards against SMU on Nov. 11, 2017. The 73 rushing attempts tie for the eighth-most in school history and the most since 2022. Navy finished with 527 yards of total offense and 30 first downs.
- Navy (1-0) scored touchdowns on six of its nine possessions and controlled the football for 39:50 compared to just 20:10 for Towson (0-2).
- After the Navy defense forced a three-and-out on Towson's opening possession, Woodson capped a six-play, 75-yard drive with a 38-yard touchdown run to give the Mids a 7-0 lead with 10:21 remaining in the first quarter.
- Navy made it 14-0 on its next possession, marching 88 yards in nine plays. **Vic Listorti** (Sr / RB) capped the drive with a 35-yard touchdown run, the first touchdown of his career. Listorti, who entered the game with just three-career carries, finished with career highs of 81 yards on 11 attempts.
- Towson answered on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Andrew Indorf connected with Aaron Enterline for a 48-yard touchdown. The extra point was missed, cutting Navy's lead to 14-6.
- The Mids responded with an 11-play, 64-yard drive, with **Jackson Gutierrez** (Jr / QB) scoring his first-career touchdown on a three-yard run to extend the lead to 21-6 with 9:32 remaining in the half.
- Towson struck back just 1:42 later when Indorf found Jacob Zollar for a 30-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion attempt failed, trimming Navy's advantage to 21-12.
- After forcing a Towson three-and-out, Navy took over at midfield with 2:12 remaining and drove 50 yards in eight plays. Woodson finished the drive with an eight-yard touchdown run with 24 seconds left, sending the Mids into the locker room with a 28-12 advantage.
- The Mids then took control of the game with a methodical opening drive in the second half, marching 75 yards in 13 plays while taking 7:14 off the clock. Gutierrez capped the drive with a two-yard touchdown run to extend the lead to 35-12.
- Gutierrez finished with 31 yards and a career-high two touchdowns on eight carries. He and Woodson became the first pair of Navy quarterbacks to score multiple rushing touchdowns in the same game since Malcolm Perry scored twice and Zach Abey five times in Navy's 49-7 victory over Virginia in the 2017 Military Bowl.
- Towson cut the lead to 35-15 on Zaydaan Faridi's 40-yard field goal with 3:14 remaining in the third quarter, but those would be the Tigers' final points.
- Woodson completed his career day midway through the fourth quarter, scoring on a four-yard run to cap a 12-play, 65-yard drive that consumed 6:04 and gave Navy a 42-15 lead with 8:39 remaining.
- Navy's defense, meanwhile, held Towson to just 39 rushing yards on 20 carries and 246 yards of total offense. **MarcAnthony Parker** (Jr / LB) paced the defense with nine tackles, while **Marcus Bleazard**, **Aiden Lyczek** and **Connor Young** recorded sacks.
- The crowd of 32,654 was Navy's largest for a home opener since 36,208 watched the Mids play Delaware in 2013.

- Navy (1-1, 0-1 American Conference) nearly pulled off a remarkable second-half comeback, rallying from a 31-point deficit behind backup quarterback **Jackson Gutierrez** (Jr) before falling to Florida Atlantic, 38-30, at Flagler Credit Union Stadium.
- The Midshipmen trailed 31-7 at halftime and 38-7 with 2:39 remaining in the third quarter before scoring the final 23 points of the game. Navy outscored the Owls 16-0 in the fourth quarter and held FAU to minus-27 yards of total offense in the final period.
- Navy was forced to make the comeback without starting quarterback **Braxton Woodson** (Sr), who left the game with an ankle injury with 10:41 remaining in the third quarter. Woodson rushed for 96 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries while completing 3 of 11 passes for 47 yards before leaving the game.
- Gutierrez, who entered the night with just two career passing attempts and no passing yards, took over and accounted for three touchdowns. He completed 6 of 12 passes for 100 yards and two touchdowns while rushing seven times for 75 yards and another score.
- FAU (1-1, 1-0) built its lead behind quarterback Caden Veltkamp, who completed 27 of 32 passes for 386 yards and five touchdowns. The five touchdown passes were the most by a Navy opponent since Houston's Clayton Tune threw five against the Mids on Oct. 22, 2022.
- FAU wasted little time taking control as Veltkamp connected with Easton Messer for a 76-yard touchdown on the Owls' second play from scrimmage, giving FAU a 7-0 lead just 42 seconds into the game.
- Navy answered immediately. **Michael Barrow** (Jr / Snipe) opened the ensuing possession with a 24-yard run before Woodson raced 48 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 7-7 with 13:12 remaining in the opening quarter.
- The Owls regained the lead later in the quarter when Veltkamp found Messer for a 36-yard touchdown to make it 14-7.
- Navy had opportunities to stay close but could not capitalize. Freshman kicker **Nolan Bartley** missed a 46-yard field goal, while the Mids also lost a fumble in the first quarter.
- FAU broke the game open in the second quarter. Veltkamp threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Kelby Valsin, followed by a 13-yard scoring pass to Dom Henry with 19 seconds left. After an interception gave the Owls the ball at the Navy 47 with seven seconds remaining, Collin Rogers kicked a 60-yard field goal on the final play of the half to send FAU into the locker room with a 31-7 advantage.
- The 24-point halftime deficit was Navy's largest since trailing Notre Dame 31-7 at halftime in 2024.
- Woodson led Navy on a seven-play drive to open the second half before leaving the game. Gutierrez took over at quarterback, but FAU extended its lead to 38-7 when Veltkamp capped a 16-play, 80-yard drive with a 5-yard touchdown pass to Antonio Johnson with 2:39 remaining in the third quarter.
- Gutierrez threw the first touchdown pass of his career on Navy's next possession, connecting with **Jordan Collins** (So / TE) for a 64-yard score that cut the deficit to 38-14 with 1:16 left in the third quarter. Collins finished with two receptions for 68 yards, with the touchdown marking just the second reception of his career.
- The Mids put together an 11-play, 85-yard drive in the fourth quarter, with Gutierrez finding **Charles Robinson** (Jr / Snipe) for an 8-yard touchdown with 5:41 remaining to make it 38-20. It was Robinson's first collegiate touchdown.
- Navy attempted an onside kick, but FAU recovered at the Navy 45. The Mids' defense then forced the Owls backward, forcing a punt, and a bad snap over the punter's head resulted in a safety that cut the lead to 38-22 with 3:12 remaining.
- Gutierrez struck again after the free kick. He capped a six-play, 58-yard drive with a career-long 49-yard touchdown run with 1:46 remaining. Gutierrez then completed the two-point conversion pass to **Vic Listorti** (Sr / RB) to pull Navy within 38-30.
- FAU recovered Navy's ensuing onside kick and was able to run out the clock.
- The loss was Navy's first in four all-time meetings against Florida Atlantic.
