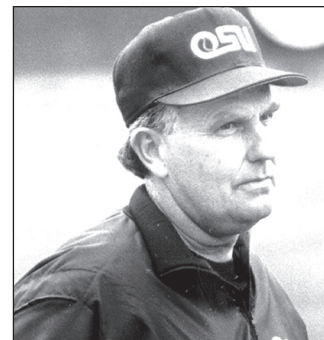

2018 National Champions Beavers Win Third Title

Oregon State returned to Omaha for the second consecutive year and seventh all-time. The Beavers went 6-2 at the College World Series to win their third national championship. OSU defeated Arkansas in three games to win the title. Overall, Oregon State finished the season 55-12-1 and 20-9-1 in Pac-12 Conference play.

Oregon State became just the second team in NCAA history to win six elimination games at the CWS. The Beavers have done it twice after first accomplishing the feat in 2006.

- Oregon State's 55 wins were one shy of the program's record of 56 in 2017. The Beavers finished a two-year stretch going 111-18-1, a winning percentage of .858.
- Oregon State set the single-year CWS record with 93 hits, and batted .327 over eight games.
- Kevin Abel became the first pitcher to win four games at the College World Series, including two in the final series. He was just the fourth pitcher to throw a shutout in a championship game, and the first since 1993.
- Adley Rutschman, named the Most Outstanding Player at the College World Series, set the CWS record with 17 hits in eight games. He batted .408 on the year for the Beavers, the third-best single-season mark in school history.
- Oregon State scored 50 runs in eight CWS games, averaging 7.4 per. The 50 runs are the third-most in a single College World Series.
- Rutschman also broke Michael Conforto's school record (76 in 2012) for RBI with 83.
- Additionally, Rutschman collected 102 hits in 2018, breaking Jacoby Ellsbury's 99 in 2005.
- Trevor Larnach tallied 15 hits during the CWS, tied for second-most behind Rutschman's 17. Larnach finished with 25 total bases during the eight games, fourth-most.
- Oregon State's pitching staff struck out 38 batters during three three games versus Arkansas, snapping Texas' finals-record of 28 in 2009 versus LSU.
- The Beavers hit eight home runs in Omaha to finish with 67 on the year, breaking the 1998 team's 60 for most in a single-season by the Beavers.
- Oregon State also finished with 753 hits, surpassing the 2006 team's record of 684.
- Luke Heimlich led the nation with 16 wins and was second with 159 strikeouts. He was named the College Baseball Foundation's National Pitcher of the Year. Heimlich was also named the Pac-12's Pitcher of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Cadyn Grenier was recognized as the recipient of the Brooks Wallace Award, given to the nation's top collegiate shortstop. He was also named the Pac-12's Defensive Player of the Year.
- Oregon State set a single-season record with seven players named All-American. They were: Nick Madrigal, Trevor Larnach, Cadyn Grenier, Adley Rutschman, Luke Heimlich, Bryce Fehmel and Jake Mulholland.
- Head coach Pat Casey was named the National Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and the ABCA. He's been named the National Coach of the Year in five different seasons: 2005, 2006, 2007, 2017 and 2018.
- Casey's 900th win came in the CWS Championship clinching victory.
- Oregon State finished the year with a 35-3 record in non-conference games, with only one loss coming during the regular season.
- The Beavers had a school-record three first-round draft selections: Nick Madrigal (fourth overall - Chicago White Sox), Trevor Larnach (20th overall - Minnesota) and Cadyn Grenier (37th overall - Baltimore). Steven Kwan (fifth round - Cleveland), Drew Rasmussen (sixth round - Milwaukee) and Michael Gretler (10th round - Pittsburgh) were also selected.

2017 CWS Participants OSU Visits CWS For 6th Time

The Oregon State baseball team returned to Omaha in 2017 for the first time since 2013 and sixth time overall. The champions of the Pac-12 Conference - for the third time since the league added Utah and emerged from the Pac-10 - posted a 49-4 record in the regular season and finished the year 56-6 after going 2-2 at TD Ameritrade Park.

The Beavers set the conference record with a 27-3 mark in Pac-12 play, and saw three major award winners. Nick Madrigal was named the Pac-12's Player and Defensive Player of the Year, becoming just the second player to accomplish that feat in the past 20 seasons. Luke Heimlich ended the season with a school-record 0.76 earned run average, leading the nation, and was named the conference's Pitcher of the Year. And Pat Casey, after guiding the team to the 49 wins in league play, was named the Pac-12's Coach of the Year.

- The 56 wins surpassed the 2013 team's record (52) for wins at OSU. The 2017 team's .903 winning percentage tied for the fourth-best single-season mark in NCAA Division I history.

- Oregon State swept through its first five games of the postseason, defeating Yale and Holy Cross at the Corvallis Regional before defeating Vanderbilt twice at the Corvallis Super Regional. The Beavers trailed for just half an inning in those five games, and outscored opponents, 44-9, entering the College World Series.

- Oregon State hit .299 as a team in the postseason, and the pitching staff finished with a 2.47 ERA. Steven Kwan, who was named the Most Outstanding Player at the Corvallis Regional, batted .424, while Nick Madrigal hit .394. Jake Thompson and Bryce Fehmel each earned two postseason victories.

- Offensively, the Beavers walked 49 times in nine postseason games, and were struck out only 60 times. By comparison, OSU pitchers struck out 73, walked 26 and limited opponents to 53 hits in 80 innings for an average of .186.

- Oregon State posted two 23-game win streaks, tying for the longest in school history. The first broke the then-school record of 18 games set in 1951 and 1962. The Beavers lost consecutive games just once.

- OSU outscored opponents, 136-49, during the first 23-game win streak. During the second, the Beavers scored 158 runs, holding opponents to 41.

- The club posted a school-record 31 wins at home, doing so in just 32 games. The team's lone loss came at the hands of USC, 7-5, in 10 innings.

- The Beavers averaged 3,261 fans per home date at Goss Stadium at Coleman Field, a single-season school record that ranked 19th overall in 2017, and second in the Pac-12. Oregon State surpassed the 100,000 mark for the first time in school history, totaling 101,090.

- The Oregon State pitching staff set a new school record for lowest ERA, at 1.93. That led the nation and by almost three-fourths of a run. Oregon State also led the nation with a 0.98 WHIP, and was the only school to post a mark shy of 1.00.

- Jake Thompson was named a unanimous First-Team All-American after leading the nation with 14 wins, which tied for the Oregon State single-season record. He also placed in the top 20 nationally with a 1.96 ERA.

- Nick Madrigal was a unanimous All-American as well, earning first, second and third-team honors. Heimlich and freshman Jake Mulholland each picked up at least one All-American recognition. Mulholland and Brandon Eisert were also named Freshman All-Americans.

- Oregon State was ranked first by Collegiate Baseball for 12 consecutive weeks entering the postseason, setting a record for the publication that started in 1959.

- The Beavers saw five players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft: Drew Rasmussen, KJ Harrison, Jake Thompson, Michael Gretler and Max Engelbrekt.

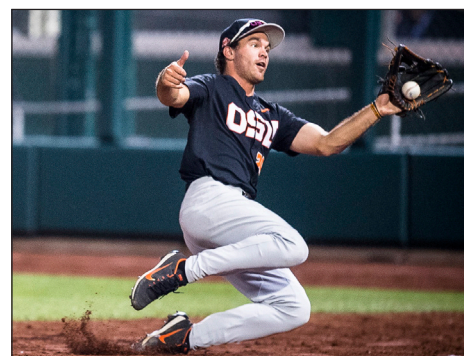

2013 CWS Participants Beavers Return To Omaha

The Oregon State baseball team returned to Omaha in 2013 after a five-year hiatus from the College World Series. The Beavers made the trip on the strength of an incredibly strong pitching staff and a balanced offense.

Much like past seasons, the Beavers relied heavily on a Northwest flavor with its roster. Twenty players on the team's 35-man roster hailed from either Washington or Oregon, including all three of the team's weekend starters, Matt Boyd, Ben Wetzler and Andrew Moore.

The Beavers broke the school record for victories with 52, won the Pac-12 Conference with a 24-6 record and advanced to the World Series after hosting both the Corvallis Regional and Corvallis Super Regional.

- Oregon State played its first ever games at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha, going 2-2. The two victories gave the Beavers 13 all-time wins in Omaha, with each belonging to head coach Pat Casey.

- Oregon State batted .290 during the postseason and finished with a 3.00 earned run average. Kavin Keyes paced OSU with a .357 batting average and Michael Conforto set the OSU single postseason record with six doubles. Ben Wetzler was stellar for the Beavers on the mound, posting a 3-0 record and a 2.74 ERA. He, Matt Boyd and Andrew Moore combined to pitch in 76 of the team's 90 postseason innings (84.4 percent) and tallied a 6-2 record.

- Matt Boyd recorded the Beavers' first-ever complete-game effort at the College World Series in his last collegiate appearance when he shut out Indiana in a 1-0 win over June 19. It was just the 18th all-time 1-0 game at the College World Series, and the first since 1985.

- Oregon State's 52 victories surpassed the 2006 club's school-record 50-win season. The Beavers' 2013 winning percentage of .800 was the best mark in modern OSU history and led the Pac-12 Conference. The 52 wins is also the most by a Pac-12 school since Arizona State won 52 in 2010.

- The Beavers stretched their program record postseason appearances to five and in eight of the last nine seasons. Oregon State has made four NCAA College World Series appearances during that stretch.

- Oregon State won its third league title under head coach Pat Casey and did so with a 24-6 record. The 24 wins is the most by a league team since the then-Pac-10 unified prior to the 1999 season. The 24 wins is the most since USC won the Pac-10 South in 1996.

- Michael Conforto was named the Pac-12's Player of the Year and Andrew Moore earned Freshman of the Year honors. Both were also named All-Americans, as was Matt Boyd, giving the Beavers three in a year for just the second time in school history (the first coming in 2006).

- Moore was named a first-team All-American, becoming the first true freshman in OSU history to pick up the honor. Conforto, meanwhile, became just the fifth player in school history to record back-to-back All-American seasons.

- The Beavers lost consecutive games just once, in a doubleheader against Washington on April 20. Oregon State opened the year with 15 consecutive wins, and later had a 12-game win streak that began the day after the doubleheader loss. Oregon State headed into the postseason with 16 wins in its last 18 games.

- OSU finished with the nation's second-lowest ERA at 2.28, which also led the Pac-12 and set a new school record for best ERA. The Beavers also led the Pac-12 with a .217 batting average against and were second in fewest hits allowed at 454 and fifth in fewest walks allowed at 173, just 15 behind the Pac-12's leader.

- Oregon State found itself in the top 10 every weekend according to Baseball America. The Beavers were outside the top 10 just twice according to the other four major polls.

2007 National Champions Beavers Go Back-To-Back

The 2007 season was a special year for the Oregon State baseball team. The Beavers became just the fifth NCAA team to win back-to-back titles, and did so on the heels of their third consecutive trip to the College World Series in Omaha.

Oregon State was led by two of the most recognizable players in school history in Mitch Canham and Darwin Barney. OSU was buoyed on the mound by Mike Stutes, who ended the season with 12 victories - three came in the postseason, including two in the College World Series. The Beavers were blessed with a cast of players that included Joe Paterson, Daniel Turpen, Eddie Kunz, Jordan Lennerton, John Wallace, Joey Wong and others, who truly embraced the team concept and helped deliver spectacular performances throughout the College World Series and the postseason.

The Beavers swept through the postseason, going 11-1 en route to their second straight national championship.

- Oregon State trailed for just one inning during the College World Series, which consisted of a little less than 45 full innings for the Beavers. North Carolina held a 1-0 lead after one inning in the final game, but the Beavers answered back with three runs in the second to help boost them to the 9-3 win.

- Oregon State became the first team ever to win four straight CWS games by at least six runs. The Beavers' closest victory came in their first game, a 3-2 victory over Cal State Fullerton.

- Oregon State became just the sixth NCAA team to sweep its way through the College World Series. And OSU was the back-to-back title holder since the NCAA went to a best-of-three championship series.

- Jorge Reyes was named the College World Series Most Outstanding Player. Reyes went 2-0 at the World Series, defeating Cal State Fullerton and North Carolina.

- Oregon State opened the postseason as the No. 3 seed at the Charlottesville Regional on the campus of the University of Virginia. By winning the College World Series, Oregon State became the first No. 3 seed to do so.

- The Beavers opened postseason play by defeating Rutgers, 5-1. They lost their next game in 13 innings to Virginia, 7-4, but then went on win their next 10 games, the final one coming in Omaha.

- Oregon State came from a 3-0 deficit in the final game of the Charlottesville Regional to advance to a Super Regional against Michigan. Against UVA, OSU scored four runs in the final two innings and held on through a Joe Paterson victory to advance.

- The Beavers one-hit Michigan in the first game of the Super Regional at Goss Stadium, and scored a run in the ninth for the win. OSU dominated the second game, 8-2, to advance to the College World Series.

- Oregon State pitchers posted an incredible 2.57 earned run average through the post-season. Opponents hit just .210 against them and collected only 83 hits in 112 innings.

- Oregon State returned to Parker Plaza on the OSU campus after returning from Omaha and celebrated the second title in front of an estimated crowd of 6,000.

- Fifteen players on the championship squad would end up being drafted by Major League clubs at some point during their tenure at Oregon State. Two more ended up signing contracts as undrafted free agents.

- OSU finished the season with 49 victories, one off tying the school record.

2006 National Champions OSU Wins Its First Title

Oregon State went to the 2006 College World Series in Omaha as veterans after the Beavers made their second all-time appearance at the CWS in 2005.

The Beavers returned a number of players who made the 2005 appearance, and who were bounced after two games. That left them hungry, knowing they wanted more. And in 2006, they did not disappoint as Oregon State went 6-2 over eight games in Omaha to claim its first national championship.

The Beavers dispatched of North Carolina in the national title series. Oregon State lost to the Tar Heels, 4-3, in the first game, and saw itself behind UNC, 5-0, after three-and-a-half innings, but the Beavers scored seven in the bottom of the fourth and forced a third game after an 11-7 victory. A North Carolina error in the eighth gave the Beavers a run, breaking a 2-2 tie in the deciding game, and ultimately, the victory.

That national championship victory made the Beavers the first NCAA title holder from the Pacific-10 Conference since USC in 1998.

- Oregon State became the first team from the Pacific Northwest to win the national title, and the first from the northern part of the country to win it in 40 years.

- The Beavers were the first team to ever face six elimination games at the College World Series. And OSU became the first national championship club to win despite losing two games in Omaha.

- Oregon State opened its trip in Omaha by losing to Miami, 11-1. By virtue of that loss, the Beavers became just the second team in the last 25 years to win the title after losing their first game.

- Right-handed starter Jonah Nickerson was named the Most Outstanding Player of the College World Series. He made three CWS appearances, throwing 21 2/3 innings, allowing just four runs (two earned), 12 hits and four walks. Nickerson struck out 19.

- Nickerson ended the postseason with a 4-0 record, winning at least one game in the NCAA Regional, NCAA Super Regional and College World Series. He threw 36 2/3 innings over five games and allowed just 20 hits to go along with 34 strikeouts and a 1.23 ERA.

- Nickerson paced the Oregon State pitching staff, which saw eight pitchers contribute in the postseason run. Only one pitcher had an ERA above 5.00, and the team combined to limit opponents to a .219 batting average.

- Offensively, the Beavers finished with a .302 average as a team through 13 postseason games. Tyler Graham paced the way for the Beavers with a .426 batting average while Bill Rowe was close behind with a .419 mark. His 18 runs batted in led the team.

- Oregon State opened the postseason by hosting an NCAA Regional and the Beavers outscored their opponents - Wright State, Kansas and Hawai'i - by a combined 28-9 mark. Oregon State never trailed during regional play.

- The Beavers defeated Stanford, 4-3, to open Super Regional play at Goss in the next round, then shut out the Cardinal, 15-0, in the second game to advance to Omaha. The 15-run win marked the second-biggest in the school's postseason history and was just the second shutout ever thrown, at the time, by OSU pitchers in NCAA play.

- Oregon State advanced to the postseason by winning the Pac-10 title and was named a No. 1 seed at its own regional.

- The Beavers ended the 2006 season with 50 victories, a school-record. It eclipsed the previous record of 46 set in 2005.

2005 CWS Participants Beavers Begin 3-Year Run

Oregon State began its magical three-year run to Omaha in 2005, a year that saw the club make many firsts. The Beavers went to the College World Series for the first time in more than 50 years, win the Pacific-10 Conference for the first time and advance to an NCAA Super Regional for the first time.

They did so with a cast of players with an overwhelming Pacific Northwest flavor, including Oregon born Dallas Buck, Kevin Gunderson, Jonah Nickerson, Jacoby Ellsbury and Darwin Barney, among others. Of the 29 players on the roster born in either Oregon or Washington, 13 ended their tenure at Oregon State being drafted by Major League clubs at least once.

The Beavers played their last game in Omaha on June 20, which, at the time, was the latest on the calendar an Oregon State season had ever extended.

- Oregon State went 0-2 in Omaha, but the World Series capped off a magnificent season for the Beavers. Oregon State won its first Pac-10 title by going 19-5 during the regular season. The 19 wins mark a conference record for the Beavers, who won seven of their eight Pac-10 series.

- The Beavers won 46 games, a new single-season school record. It surpassed the previous record of 39 set in 1986.

- The Beavers lost consecutive games only twice; once during the regular season, to Stanford and Arizona, and then in Omaha to Tulane and Baylor.

- Oregon State won five of its six games leading up to the College World Series. The Beavers outscored St. John's and Ohio State, 34-7, in three games at the Corvallis Regional.

- The Beavers advanced to a Super Regional at Goss Stadium, and took 2-of-3 from USC, whom OSU had ended the Pac-10 regular season with. The Beavers advanced to the NCAA College World Series after scoring two runs in the seventh in the third game of the Super Regional.

- Oregon State lost both of its games in Omaha, but the team's pitching staff was stellar. The Beavers allowed just seven runs over two games at Rosenblatt Stadium.

- The Beavers batted .321 as a team through the eight postseason games, and were led by Andy Jenkins' .459 batting average, which stands as the single-best postseason for any Oregon State player.

- The team's pitching staff was anchored by Jonah Nickerson, who went 1-1 with a 2.11 earned run average. Nickerson ended his career with five postseason victories, four a year later, which ties Mike Stutes for most in an OSU career.

- The trip to the postseason was the first in 19 years for Oregon State, which had last appeared in an NCAA Regional in Stillwater, Okla., in 1986. At the time, the eight postseason games played in 2005 was a single-year record for the Beavers.

- Head coach Pat Casey won his first career postseason game on June 3 as the Beavers scored a run in both the eighth and ninth innings for a 4-3 come-from-behind victory over Ohio State.

- Oregon State defeated St. John's, 19-3, in the final game of the Corvallis Regional. The 16-run win still stands as the team's single-largest postseason victory.

- Jacoby Ellsbury, who in 2007 became the first former OSU player to win a MLB World Series, played in all eight games in the 2005 postseason and batted .351 with two doubles, a triple and five stolen bases.

- Thirteen players who played in the 2005 postseason won a title in 2006 with OSU.

1952 CWS Participants **OSU Makes First CWS Trip**

Oregon State made its first foray into an NCAA postseason in 1952, and the Beavers also advanced to the College World Series for the first time. Oregon State lost in two games in their inaugural trip to Omaha, but came away with a positive first experience at Omaha Stadium.

The Beavers opened the year by winning the Pacific Coast Conference title and then swept Fresno State in the Western Regional in Corvallis.

“The team of ‘52 was an exceptional collection of raw talent as I look back today,” pitcher Alex Goedhard said years later. “I say raw talent because we had no specialty training. There were no coaches specializing in hitting, fielding, outfield or pitching. There were no physical training regimens for players targeting playing positions outside of daily routine practice. There was no or very little scouting of opposing teams and players.”

- At the Western Regional, on June 7, the Beavers hosted Fresno State in front of a crowd of 4,600, the largest attendance figure to date at what is now Goss Stadium at Coleman Field.

- Oregon State began the season on a high note, winning its first seven games and nine of 10.

- The Beavers had just three losing streaks of two games, with the final one coming in Omaha. Oregon State did not lose consecutive games at home the entire season.

- The 27 victories posted by the Beavers in 1952 set a school single-season record. That record was not surpassed until the 1975 team won 28 games.

- Ralph Coleman was in the midst of his third stint with the team and had another 14 years before ending his illustrious career. Coleman’s two victories in the postseason do not count toward his overall career record, but merely add to 561 victories, then a school record.

- Oregon State’s appearance in Omaha was significant as it was only the sixth-ever College World Series held. The Beavers opened against Duke in just the second-ever meeting between the schools in any sport; the first was in the 1942 Rose Bowl.

- Oregon State used what is now an unusual mode of transportation to arrive in Omaha. The team traveled to Omaha by train on the Union Pacific streamliner City of Portland. The Beavers arrived just after 3 a.m. on a Wednesday.

- Oregon State was the fourth team of what is now known as the Pac-10 to advance to the College World Series. California, USC and Washington State all advanced to Omaha before the Beavers’ first trip in 1952.

- The games were played at what was then known as Omaha Stadium; it is now known as Rosenblatt Stadium. This marked the third year the CWS was held at Rosenblatt.

- Twenty-seven of the 34 players (79.4 percent) listed on the roster hailed from the state of Oregon.

- Oregon State won its first-ever Pacific Coast Conference Championship in 1952. The Beavers defeated USC in two games; winning game one, 12-10, and taking game two, 5-4, with both contests being played in Corvallis.

- Dwane Helbig became Oregon State’s first All-American in 1952 when the American Baseball Coaches Association named him to the second team. He batted .418 with three home runs and 10 RBI in PCC Northern Division games.

- Bailey Brem and Jay Dean, who were both on the 1952 team, earned All-American honors in 1953 and 1954, respectively. Dean was an All-American in 1955 as well. He was OSU’s first two-time All-American.
