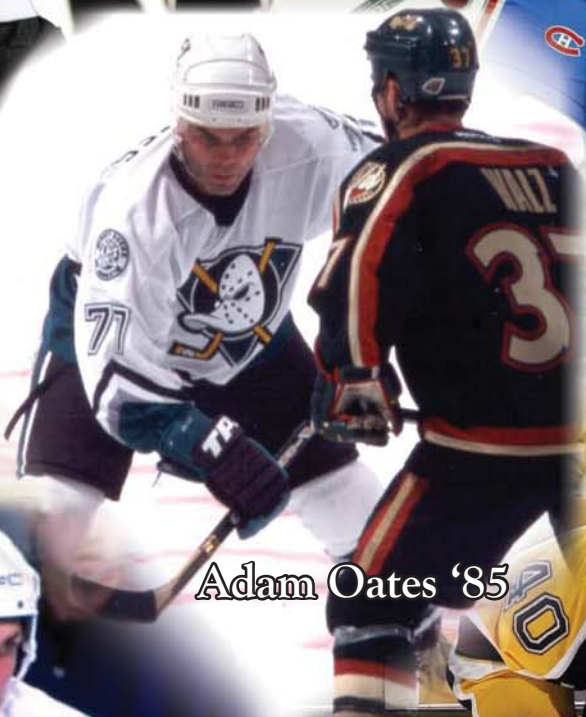

## COVERING RENSSELAER HOCKEY

The Rensselaer sports information office is happy to assist the media covering the Engineers. While covering RPI, please follow these procedures:

### Interviews

Player interviews should be arranged through Kevin Beattie, Rensselaer's sports information director. Players are not to be contacted at their residences or via e-mail under any circumstances. Instead, players will return telephone calls to members of the media, via messages left with Beattie in the sports information office at (518) 276-2187 or [beattk@rpi.edu](mailto:beattk@rpi.edu). Players will not be asked to miss classes or labs for interviews.

### Credentials

Members of the media wishing to cover Rensselaer should contact Kevin Beattie, sports information director, at (518) 276-2187 or [beattk@rpi.edu](mailto:beattk@rpi.edu). Working press credential requests should include the person's name, affiliation and phone number. Credential requests should be made at least one day in advance of the game. Parking passes are available for local media and may be available to visiting media.

RPI home games are played on campus at the Houston Field House. Media representatives can pick up their credentials at the "will call" window in the box office, which is located in the front of the Field House. Media personnel with proper accreditation may use any general admission entrance. Seating in the press box is limited. Cheering in the press box is strictly prohibited.

### Photography

Still photographers may shoot from the corners of either side of the goal at the north end. Additional space is available on the landing in front of section 15 and in the press box. Shooting from the penalty box area is restricted to Rensselaer-affiliated personnel. Special requests may be made to Kevin Beattie, sports information director, at least two days prior to the day of the game.

Television camera operators may shoot from the landing in front of section 15, from the area behind the seats on either side of the press box, from the press box itself or

from the north end.

Photographers should never impede the view of spectators.

### Broadcasts

The flagship station for Rensselaer men's hockey is WRPI, 91.5 FM, the school's student station. All games are broadcast live over the airwaves as well as on the Internet at [www.wrpi.org](http://www.wrpi.org). Jeff Kuhne is the primary contact for WRPI's broadcasts. He can be contacted at [wrpi-sportsdir@rpi.edu](mailto:wrpi-sportsdir@rpi.edu).

Visiting radio broadcasters should make arrangements for phone lines through Kim Forette of the Houston Field House at (518) 276-6694. A broadcast fee of \$100 is charged and should be paid prior to game time. Games are broadcast from the catwalk above the ice and space is extremely limited.

### Post-Game

After a brief post-game cooling off period, head coach Seth Appert will be available to the media outside of his office, which is under the stands. Rensselaer players will be available following Appert's session. A member of the Rensselaer sports information staff will be on hand to assist the media.

Interviews with the visiting coach and/or players should be coordinated with the visiting team's sports information director or Rensselaer's sports information personnel.

### Media Services

Game programs, notes and line charts will be available before every game. Scoring summaries and shot charts will be available after each period. Telephones, a fax machine and a copier are also available at the Houston Field House.

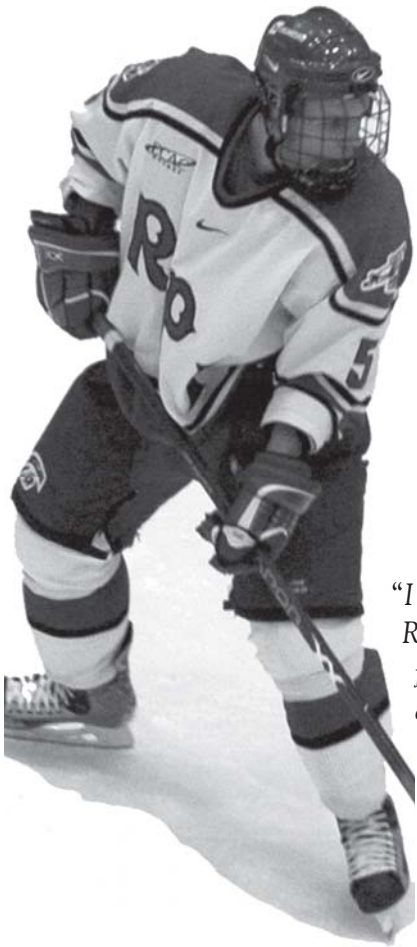

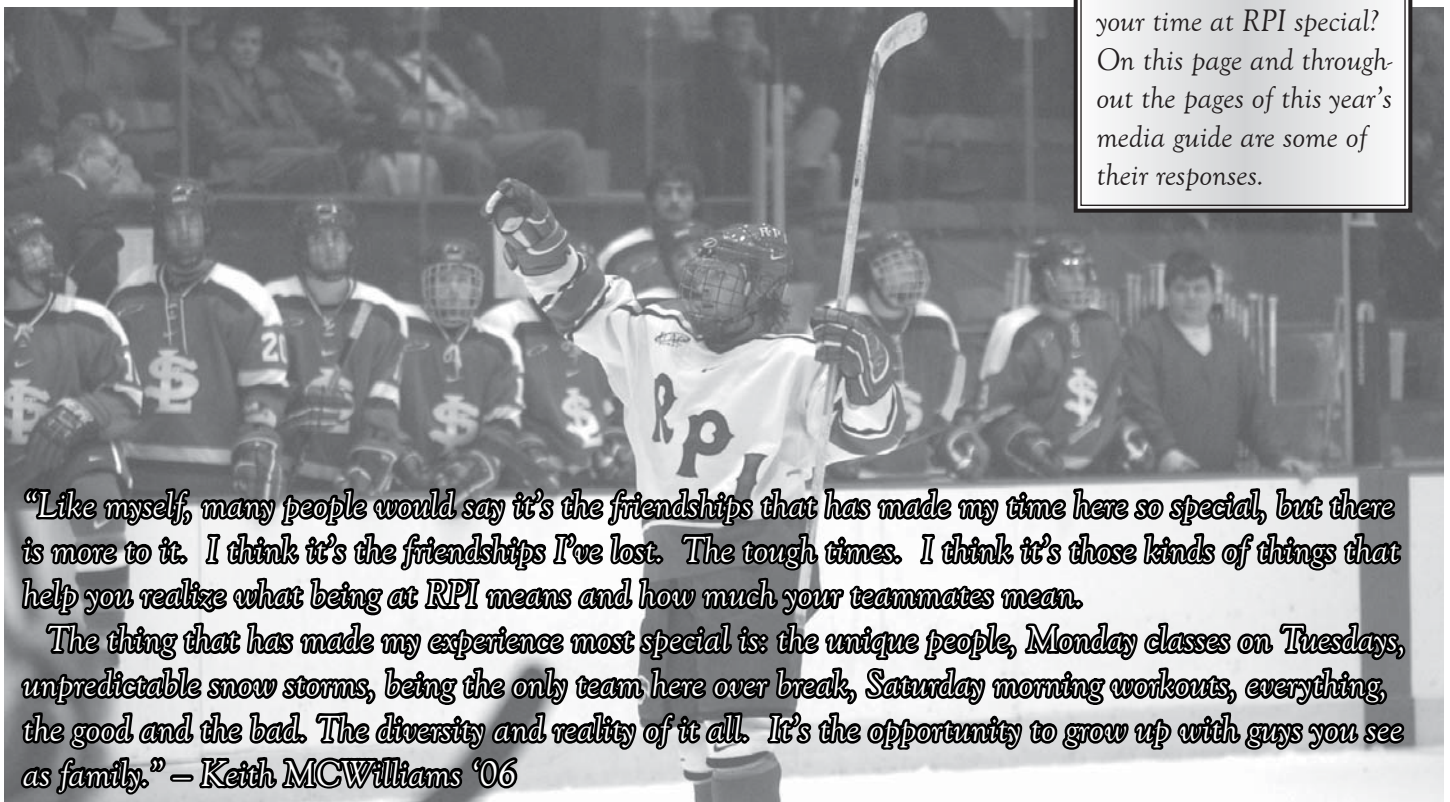
# Reflecting on Rensselaer...

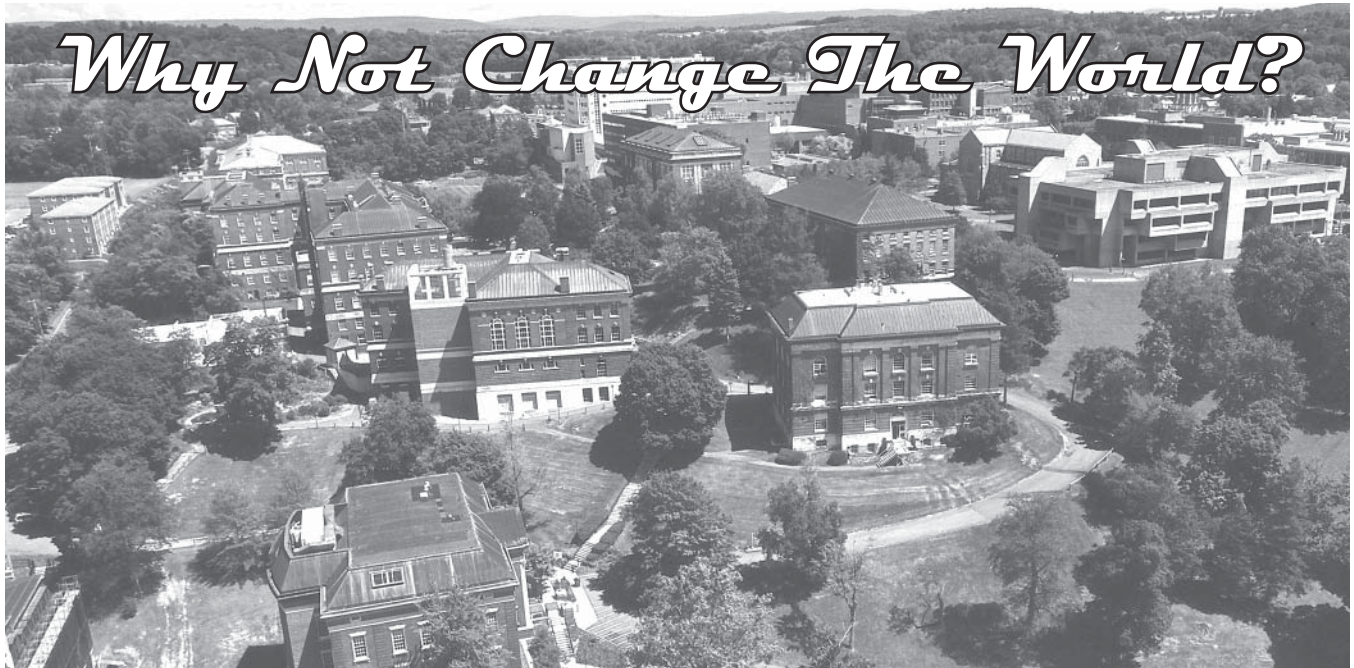

Dr. Shirley Ann Jackson is President of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

She is immediate past President of the American Association for the



Advancement of Science (2004) and chairman of the AAAS Board of Directors, a member of the National Academy of Engineering (NAE), and the Council on Foreign Relations, a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Physical Society, the Smithsonian Institution, and serves on the New York Stock Exchange Board of Directors. She is the former Chairman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC).

U.S. News & World Report has ranked Rensselaer 42nd among the nation's top universities, up from 43rd last year. The Institute also ranks 24th in the "Best Values" among national universities, up from 27th last year. Rensselaer's School of Engineering is ranked 19th in the nation.

## DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS KEN RALPH



Ken Ralph was named director of athletics at Rensselaer on May 30, 2002.

At RPI, Ralph oversees the Institute's 23 NCAA intercollegiate varsity teams - 11 of which are women's - and numerous junior varsity squads, involving more than 600 student-athletes. Two sports - men's and women's ice hockey - compete at the Division I level while the other 23 are Division III programs.

In his four years since joining the Institute, Ralph has worked tirelessly for the betterment of the student-athletes and the university.

This past season, Rensselaer saw two teams and seven individuals compete in NCAA Championships while two other teams captured ECAC Championships. Eleven student-athletes earned 15 National All-American citations, including individuals from football, track & field, diving, baseball, softball, and lacrosse. RPI also boasted seven National Academic All-Americans - which ranked second in all of Division III - and the field hockey team posted the highest team grade point average in the nation for the second straight season.

The 2004-05 season saw Rensselaer produce 11 National All-Americans and seven Academic All-Americans, which was one shy of its NCAA Division III-best eight selected in 2003-04. In fact, Rensselaer ranked second in the entire nation in Academic All-Americans across all NCAA divisions, trailing only the University of Nebraska and tying Rice University.

In 2003-04, Rensselaer was represented at eight NCAA Championships, including a tournament semi-final appearance by the football team - the first in school history - and a regional tournament berth by the baseball team. Individually, RPI sent 14 representatives to national competitions, including one who became the school's first-ever national champion in swimming, as well as four others who finished in the top four in their respective events. Overall, Rensselaer had 18 student-athletes combine for 29 National All-American honors.

Ralph's numerous other accomplishments since being hired include playing an integral role in the passing of NCAA Amendment 65-1, which maintained athletic scholarships for a select number of Division III Institutions, including RPI and its Division I men's hockey team, and the elevation of the women's ice hockey program from Division III to Division I. He also initiated the Annual Black Friday men's hockey game, started the Hockey Ring of Honor and organized the 50th Anniversary Reunion and Celebration Weekend to commemorate the school's 1954 National Championship men's hockey team as well as the 20th Anniversary Celebration of the 1985 men's hockey national championship team. Ralph also oversaw the resurfacing of the Ned Harkness Track & Field and has served on numerous committees with the Liberty League as well as the ECAC Hockey League.

Prior to joining Rensselaer, Ralph was senior assistant athletic director at Connecticut College in New London, Conn., where he oversaw a 26-team Division III department and directed The Lott Natatorium. He headed

athletic program development, was the NCAA compliance officer and supervised the coaching staff and sports information office. He also served as a member of the Athletic Director's Advisory Committee and the Athletic Management Committee.

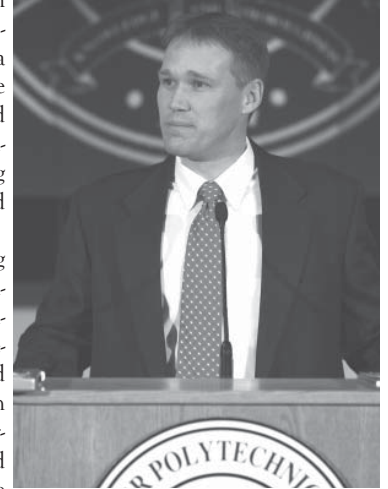
In addition, Ralph served as head swim coach of both the men's and women's programs, compiling a 50-33 record (101-72-1 in his coaching career). During his tenure, which began in 1998, every one of his teams earned National All-Academic status from the College Swim Coaches Association of America, maintaining a team average grade point average of 3.41. Ralph, who also coached water polo, earned the 2000 Andrew Chait Award for outstanding service to Connecticut College and its athletic department.

Ralph began his head coaching career in 1992 at Georgetown University, where his men's and women's swim teams broke 17 school records in two years. He became head coach at Kutztown University in 1994 and produced nine All-Americans in 1996. Both the men's and women's teams finished among the nation's top 12 and broke a total of 32 records over two seasons. Ralph was chosen as the 1996 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. Later that year, he moved to the Air Force Academy, where both swim teams earned National All-Academic status with a team GPA of at least 3.2. While at Air Force, Ralph earned the Moyer-Nike Award for Excellence in Coaching Women in 1996 and the Air Force Award for Organizational Excellence in 1997.

A native of Salem, N.H., Ralph is a graduate of the University of Alaska-Anchorage with a degree in political science. He was a five-time NCAA Division II All-American in swimming (in 1989 in the 100- and 200-yard butterfly and in 1990 in the 100-yard butterfly and 100- and 200-yard backstroke) and went on to become a U.S. Senior National Qualifier in 1989 and 1990. He is a member of the Alaska-Anchorage Athletic Hall of Fame.

Ralph's community service activities have leveraged his athletic experiences. He participated in Camp Rotary, an academic and recreational camp for disadvantaged students in New London, and he was a mentor in the Connecticut College Office of Volunteers for Community Service. He has also been a volunteer for many associations and has hosted the "Match" program with Big Brother/Big Sisters.

Ralph, who was Rensselaer's 2003-04 Person of the Year by *The Polytechnic*, the school's student newspaper, and his wife, Mary, reside in Ballston Lake.

*2006-07 Season Outlook...*



A new era of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) men's hockey begins this fall as the Engineers welcome three new coaches and seven freshmen, as well as a team leader back from his medical redshirt. The trio behind the bench will also have 18 letterwinners with whom to work, including two of the top scorers and the starting goaltender from the 2005-06 season.

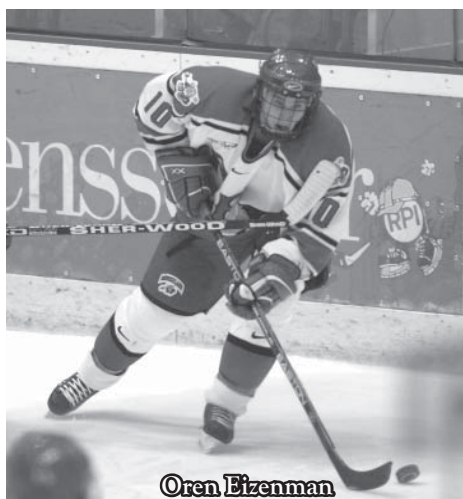
Seth Appert takes over as the head coach, joined by assistant coaches Shawn Kurulak and Jim Montgomery. They will have the opportunity to mentor 12 returning forwards, three defensemen and all three goalies who are back. Of the newcomers, three are forwards and four play defense.

"From what the staff has seen and heard from the players, we believe we will be very competitive with every team on our schedule," said Appert, who comes to Troy after nine years as an assistant coach at the University of Denver. "With our solid mix of speed and size we expect to play an up-tempo but physical style."

**THE FORWARDS**

Of the three positions on the ice, the Engineers' most experienced is at forward, where four seniors, five juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen will line up. Kirk MacDonald (Victoria, BC/Victoria Salsa), who had 16 goals and 20 assists for a team-high 36 points in 37 games two seasons ago, returns after battling testicular cancer. A rugged forward and fierce competitor, he tallied eight power play goals and four game-winners - both of which ranked among the leaders nationally - during his junior campaign.

Among those back from last year's team, which posted a 14-17-6 overall record and an 8-8-

6 ECAC Hockey League mark, is Oren Eizenman (Toronto, ON/Wexford Raiders). A senior center, he was second on the team with 38 points, including a team-best 16 goals, in 37 games. A fine skater with good vision and solid face-off skills, he dished out 22 assists, which was second on the team. Twelve of those helpers - and seven of his goals - came in 22 league games.

Classmate Kevin Broad (Humboldt, SK/Chill-

iwak Chiefs) is a fearless competitor who provides a spark with his hard hitting, timely scoring and leadership. He finished with seven goals and one assist in 23 games, missing 14 games due to injury. Fellow senior Tommy Green (Martensville, SK/Melfort Mustangs) looks to take advantage of the new staff's offensive style and finish his career with a flourish.

Junior Jonathan Ornelas (Mississauga, ON/Milton IceHawks), who has outstanding speed with a finishers' touch, was third on the team with 22 points (13 goals, 9 assists) as a sophomore. Seven of his 13 goals came on the power play, tying Eizenman for tops on the team. Classmate Andrew Lord (West Vancouver, BC/Vernon Vipers) used his solid frame (6-3, 210) to make things difficult for the opposition, tallying seven goals and six assists in the process.

Each of the other junior forwards, Jake Morissette (Fruitvale, BC/Williams Lake Timberwolves), Dan Peace (Ann Arbor, MI/Toledo Ice Diggers) and Tyler Eaves (Queensbury, NY/Shattuck St. Mary's), skate well and are responsible defensively. They, too, look to flourish in RPI's fast-paced attack.

Sophomores Kurt Colling (Ripley, ON/Vernon Vipers) and Matt Angers-Goulet (St. Augustin, PQ/Notre Dame Hounds) are both coming off strong freshmen years and look to establish themselves as dominant two-way players. Colling earned 11 points (4 goals, 7 assists) while Angers-Goulet had ten points (5 goals, 5 assists) in limited ice time in 28 and 34 games, respectively.

Seth Klerer (Thornhill, ON/North York Rangers) and Andrei Uryadov (St. Petersburg, Russia/South Kent), another pair of sophomores, expect to use their skating abilities to become solid point producers at the collegiate level.

RPI's incoming forwards are Jordan Cyr (Winnipeg, MB/Brockville Braves), a left wing, Paul Kerins (Weston, ON/North York Rangers), a center, and Garrett Vassel (Northampton, NY/New York Apple Core). Cyr tallied 53 points (22 goals, 31 assists) in 45 games while Kerins had 59 points (29 goals, 30 assists) in the same number of contests. Last season Vassel led the Apple

Core in scoring, notching 47 points (15 goals, 32 assists) in 44 games. He also has the ability to play defense for Rensselaer.

**THE DEFENSEMEN**

The Engineers return three defensemen, including two seniors and a sophomore. Jake Luthi (Palmer, AK/Sioux Falls Stampede), a senior, is the top blueliner back, having tallied 11 points in 37 games. A smooth skater with a hard shot, he scored three goals - two on the power play - with eight assists while also picking up 50 penalty minutes.

Fellow senior Ryan Swanson (Woodbury, MN/Soo Indians), who is 6-3, 220 pounds, gained valuable experience as a junior, seeing time in 35 games. The team's reigning Most Improved Player had a goal and seven assists after notching one helper in his first two seasons. One of the most respected competitors on the team, Swanson brings out the best in his teammates in practices and games.

Sophomore Reed Kipp (Victoria, BC/Vernon Vipers) showed offensive promise as he tallied two goals and six assists in 26 games during his rookie campaign.

Rensselaer's incoming blueliners bring size, toughness and offensive ability. Erik Burgdoerfer (East Setauket, NY/New York Apple Core), who is 6-2, 210 pounds, had six goals and ten assists with 60 penalty minutes in 45 games a year ago while Jason Fortino (Stoney Creek, ON/Milton IceHawks), who is 6-0, 205 pounds, had 21 points (6 goals, 15 assists) and 102 penalty minutes in 39 contests.

Christian Jensen (Watchung, NJ/Chicago Steel) is a solid 6-3, 200 pounder who had a goal and eight assists with 22 penalty minutes in 42 USHL games last season, including 24 with Chicago. He is a draft pick of the San Jose Sharks, having been selected in the ninth round (289th overall) in the 2004 NHL Entry Draft. The biggest blueliner to join the Engineers is Peter Merth (New Westminster, BC/Burnaby Express), who is

### THE GOALTENDERS

The Engineers should be strong in goal as they return all three netminders, including juniors Will Neubert (Painted Post, NY/Capital District Selects), and Jordan Alford (Red Deer, AB/Canmore Eagles)

### THE COACHES

Appert, the 12th head men's hockey coach in Rensselaer's storied history, brings an offensive-minded transition style from Denver, where he helped the Pioneers average over 24 wins per year and capture two National Championships.

A collegiate netminder at Ferris State University, Appert individually coached three goaltenders who have been draft picks of the National Hockey League, including one Hobey Baker Award finalist and two who played in the National Hockey League last season. He also recruited and coached one All-American, two All-Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) honorees, two WCHA Playoff Most Valuable Players, and two Frozen Four Most Outstanding Players.

Appert helped Denver sign nationally-ranked recruiting classes each of the past seven years. Among those he has coached or recruited are the 2006 Hobey Baker Award winner, eight All-Americans, a WCHA Player of the Year, 22 All-WCHA picks, three WCHA Defensive Players of the Year, two WCHA Student-Athletes of the Year, and 23 NHL draft picks at Denver. The Pioneers averaged over 24 wins per year in his tenure as an assistant coach and have captured two NCAA National Championships, three WCHA playoff championships, and two WCHA regular season

titles in his years of coaching at Denver.

Montgomery, a two-time All-American and former pro stand-out, spent the past year as a volunteer assistant coach at Notre Dame, where he oversaw the video coordinator's responsibilities, the team statistical program and face-off and scoring skills development.

Prior to coaching, he played professionally for 12 seasons, including stints in the NHL with St. Louis, Montreal, Philadelphia, San Jose and Dallas.

As a collegiate player at Maine from 1989-93, Montgomery tallied 103 goals and 198 assists for 301 points in 170 career games. He led the team to a 138-25-8 record with two Hockey East Championships and captained the 1993 National Championship team. The Montreal, Que., native ranks among the leaders in NCAA history in points and assists.

Kurulak spent the past two seasons as an assistant coach at Army, where he was responsible for recruiting, player development, especially with the defensemen, and coordinating video instruction while helping direct the Black Knights to their most successful season at the Division I level. He has also been the head coach of Fargo-Moorhead of the NAHL, which he led to a 33-21-0 record in its expansion year, and an assistant at

Bemidji St. for two seasons, recruiting the classes that have led the Beavers to the NCAA Tournament the past two years.

A native of Calgary, Alb., Kurulak graduated from Denver in 1999 and spent one season as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater, where he was a four-year letterwinner from the blueline. He wore the alternate captain's "A" for three seasons and was a three-time WCHA All-Academic selection.

### THE SCHEDULE

The Engineers, who open their 105th season on October 7, play 35 games, including 18 home games at the Houston Field House in Troy. Rensselaer's season opener is an exhibition game against York University of Ontario at the Field House. The Engineers host perennial national power Boston University one week later before going to Denver for a two-game set on October 20-21.

RPI returns to the Capital District for a pair of games at the Pepsi Arena in Albany on October 28-29, beginning with a matchup with area-rival Union on October 28. The Engineers face either Colgate or Quinnipiac the next day. Those two games are non-league affairs.

Rensselaer kicks off its ECAC Hockey League schedule - and its longest homestand of the season - on November 3 when Princeton visits the Field House for the 4th Annual Black Friday. Quinnipiac, the Tigers' travel partner, is in Troy the next night. The Engineers play just one game in each of the next two weekends, against Merrimack on November 12 and Sacred Heart on November 17.

The homestand concludes with the 56th Annual Rensselaer/Bank of America Holiday Tournament, the oldest college hockey holiday tournament in the nation, on November 24-25. This year's field features Colgate, Niagara and Ohio State with the Engineers opening against Niagara.

RPI is on the road for four league games over the next two weekends, including a trip to Central New York, before returning to the Field House to close out the fall semester with a non-league contest against UMass Lowell on December 16.

Following a 13-day layoff, Rensselaer travels to Burlington to participate in the University of Vermont's Sheraton/TD Banknorth Catamount Cup on December 29-30. The month of January begins with three straight home league games as Harvard (Jan. 5), Dartmouth (Jan. 6) and Union (Jan. 12) visit the Field House. The game against the Dutchmen is the start of a home-and-home series as the Engineers travel to Schenectady the next night.

Following the games with Union, RPI hosts Clarkson on January 19 and St. Lawrence on January 20. The game with the Saints, which will be preceded by the Annual Alumni Game, is the 30th Annual Big Red Freakout! RPI will attempt to extend its Freakout! unbeaten streak to 17 games (12-0-4).





Rensselaer returns to the road for its next four games, including trips to Yale (Jan. 26) and Harvard (Feb. 3), before welcoming Colgate and Cornell on February 9-10. The Engineers visit St. Lawrence and Clarkson on February 16-17 before finishing the regular season with home games against Brown and Yale on February 23-24.

"Rensselaer attracts the best of the best and once again we have done so with the hiring of Seth Appert," President Jackson said when making the announcement. "He is a proven teacher and a leader. His passion for the sport and commitment to education make him a perfect fit for the Institute and we enthusiastically welcome him into the Rensselaer family."

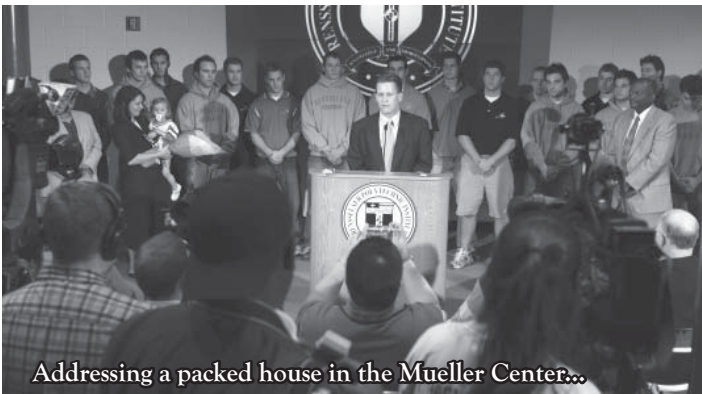

### SHAWN KURULAK

As a collegiate player at the University of Maine from 1989-93, Montgomery tallied 103 goals and 198 assists for 301 points in 170 career games. As a Black Bear, he led the team to a 138-25-8 record with two Hockey East Championships and the 1993 National Championship. The Montreal, Que., native not only captained the title team, which posted a 42-1-2 record, but he earned the tournament's Most Outstanding Player Award.

Montgomery, who ranks among the leaders in NCAA history in points and assists, was named All-Hockey East three times in his career. In addition, he was chosen to the league's All-Decade Team for the 1990's and a finalist for the 1993 Hobey Baker Award. He was twice named Maine's Most Valuable Player and he won the school's Dale Lick Academic Achievement Award. Montgomery, who had single season point totals of 60, 81, 65 and 95, had his No. 19 jersey retired by the Black Bears.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, he played professionally for 12 seasons, including stints in the National Hockey League with St. Louis, Montreal, Philadelphia, San Jose, and Dallas.

In 122 regular season NHL games, Montgomery recorded nine goals and 25 assists for 34 points with 80 penalty minutes. He also played in eight playoff games, scoring once and registering two penalty minutes. In 518 American Hockey League games over eight seasons, he tallied 183 goals and 360 assists for 543 points.

A former mayor of Troy, Conway holds an AAS degree in business administration from Hudson Valley Community College, a bachelor's in business from the University of Albany, a Master's in educational administration from Albany, and an honorary doctor of law from Manhattan College.

One of the finest fitness facilities in the Northeast, Rensselaer's Mueller Center is the training home of Engineers hockey. A two-and-a-half year old \$5.7 million center, it is a vibrant, active, and innovative three-story fitness and wellness facility located in the heart of campus. 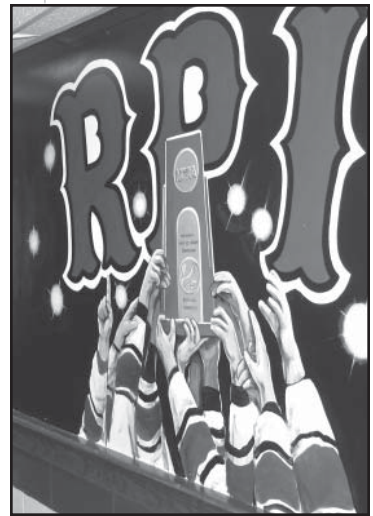
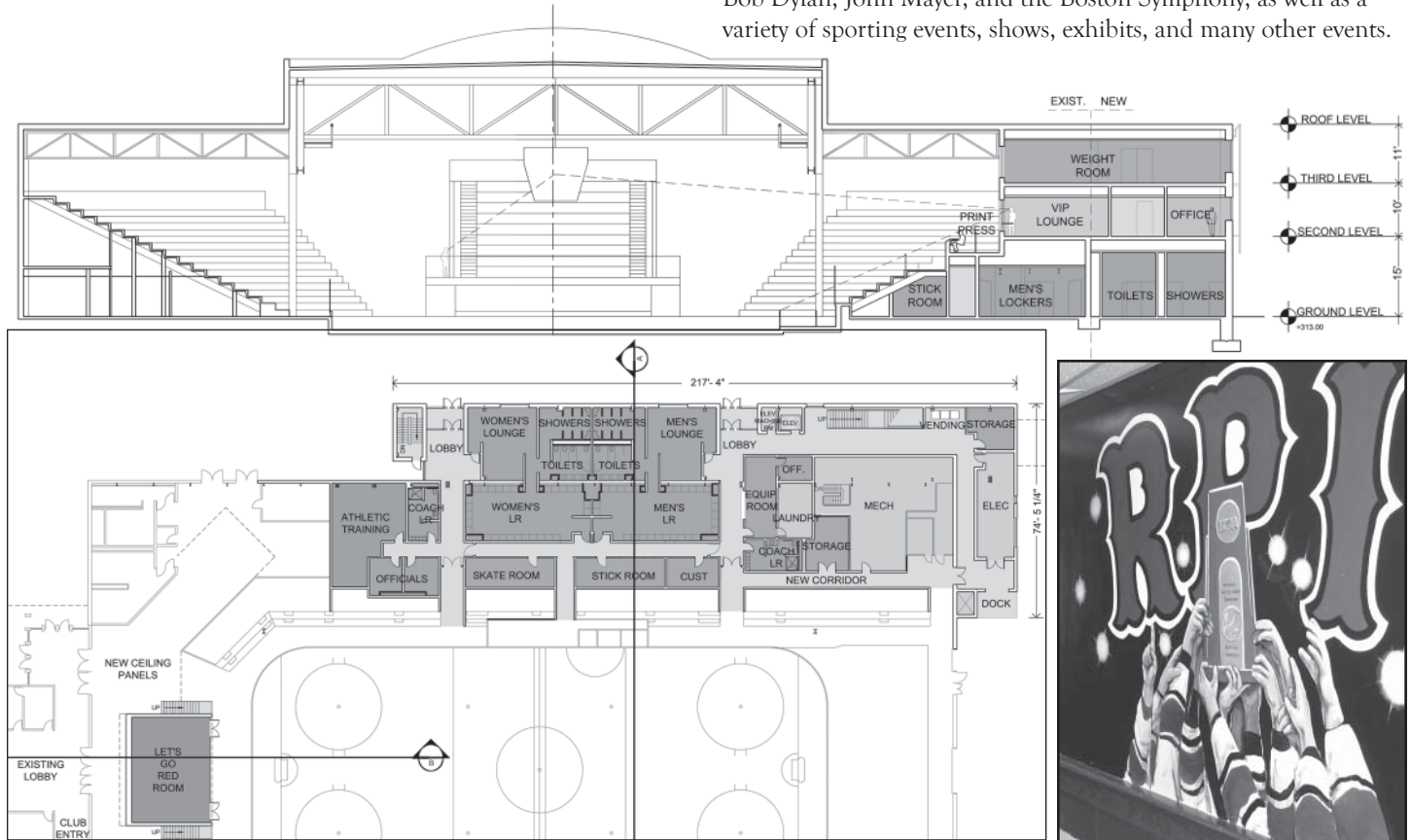


# HOUSTON FIELD HOUSE

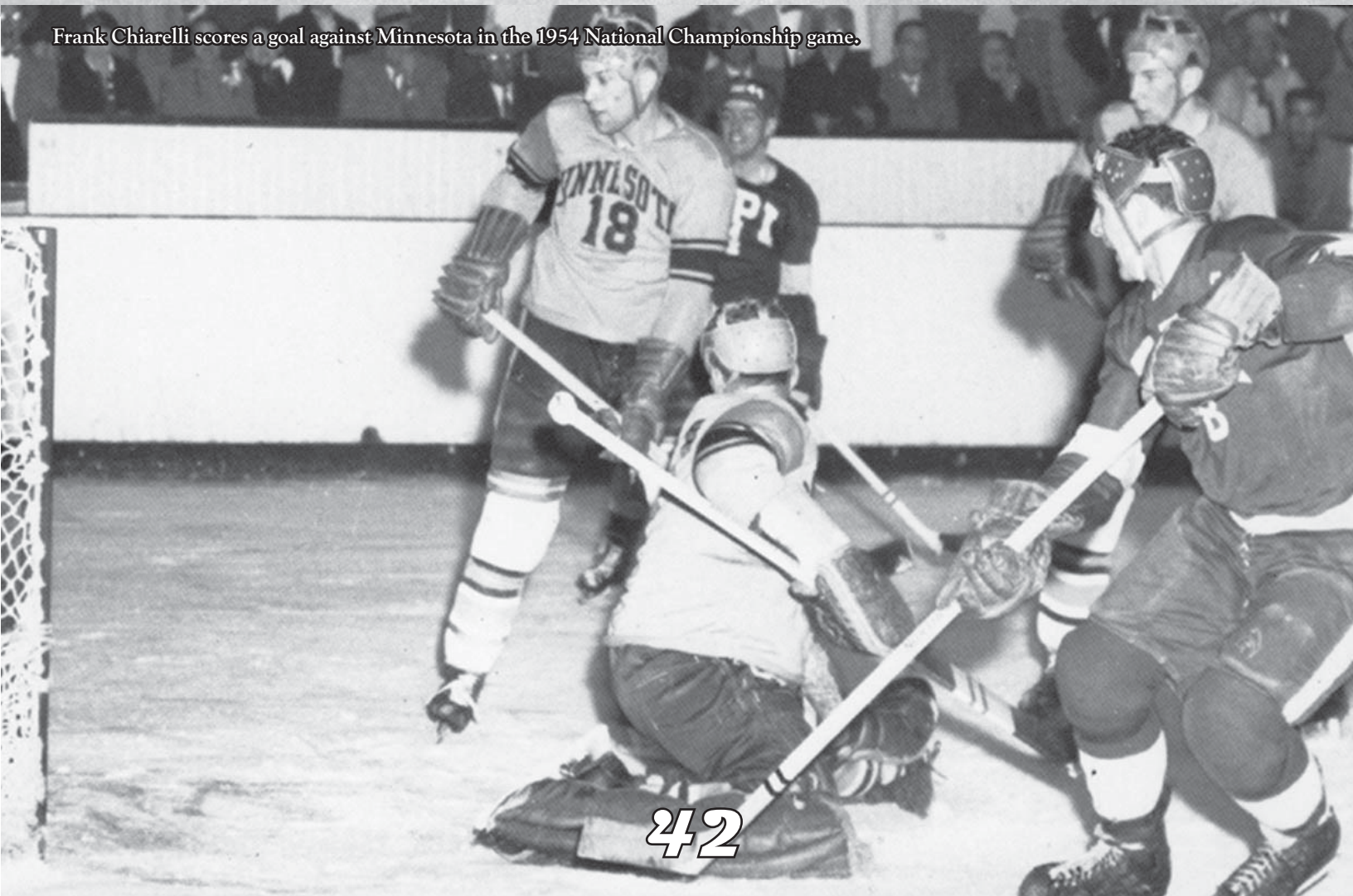

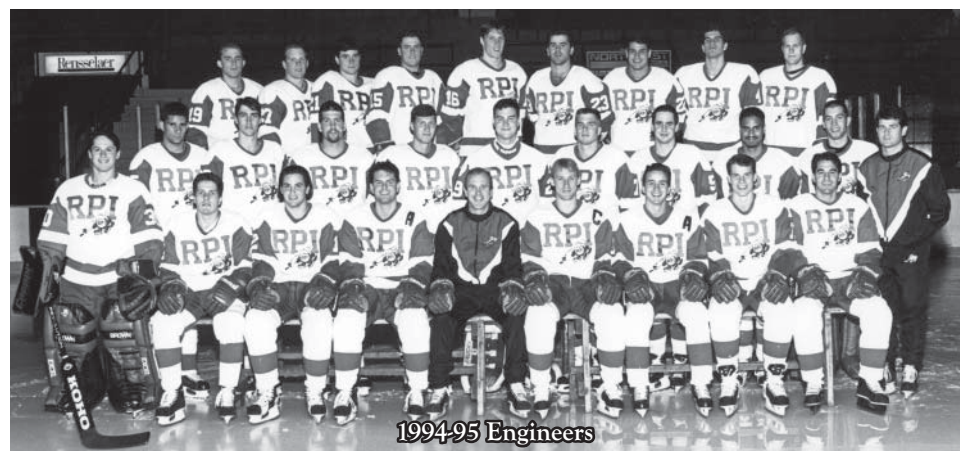

## Ref Blasts Colorado for Poor Conduct

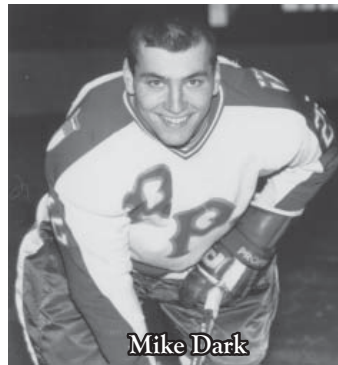

# MORE RENSSELAER HOCKEY TRADITIONS

## THE PEP BAND...



For as long as the team has been around, so has the band. Whether the Engineers are playing at home at the Houston Field House or on the road, the band, which is completely student-run, is there to make as much noise as possible.

## BLACK FRIDAY...

Started in 2003, Black Friday takes place on the first home game of league competition. All fans are encouraged to dress in all black and the RPI players wear special black uniforms for that game only. The uniforms are auctioned off during the game and after the contest, the winners are presented their sweaters by the Rensselaer player whose jersey they have been awarded.



## HOCKEY LINE...

It happened every year beginning in the early 1970s. It has lasted for as many as 179 consecutive days, 24 hours a day. It was written about in numerous national publications, including *Sports Illustrated* and *USA Today* as well as in *The Boston Globe*, *The Hartford Courant* and in all the Capital Region newspapers. It was even featured on "CBS News Morning".

The Hockey Line – a tradition in which students camped out outside the Student Union in order to purchase their season tickets for the men's hockey games – started in 1973. Back then the Houston Field House had numerous support columns that obstructed the view from many seats. In order to be able to purchase seats having an unobstructed view of the ice, individuals and groups of students formed lines at the Student Union, waiting for tickets to be sold.

The groups were allowed to rotate the people waiting on the line so that students could eat and go to class, yet maintain their positions. Of course there were other rules and regulations that had to be followed, including no such amenities as tents or the use of any heating or cooking devices. There was a finite amount of power and playing stereos was prohibited,



except on Fridays and Saturdays for groups that had valid party permits issued by the Dean of Students Office.

Since then, renovations and improvements to the Field House have removed most of the supports, but the Hockey Line tradition remained. The rules also changed. In recent years, students hauled their mattresses, books, I-Pods, X-Boxes, blankets, and more to Hockey Line.

While a wait of more than just a couple of consecutive days of sleeping, eating, studying, and hanging around outside is to be commended, recent longest stays were not even close to the record of 179 days, which was set in 1985.

It was March 31 – less than 24 hours after the 1985 Engineers brought home the school's second NCAA National Championship – when members of the Psi Upsilon fraternity set up camp. For the next six months, they battled the elements as successfully as a mail carrier. When the tickets went on sale on September 25, the previous mark of 34 days was absolutely obliterated. Their effort was certainly worthwhile as they garnered national attention, raised money for charity and, most importantly, got the seats they wanted.

Hockey line has evolved into the Big Red Stakeout, which allows students and student groups to camp out inside the Student Union and enjoy food and games while waiting for season tickets to go on sale the next morning following breakfast.

## RED/WHITE SCRIMMAGE...

The Red/White Scrimmage traditionally occurs during the first week of practice to allow the fans an opportunity to see the veteran Engineers back on the ice as well as to catch a glimpse of the newcomers for the first time in a game setting. The scrimmage is always free to the public.



## SKATE WITH THE ENGINEERS...



Every year prior to the regular season opener, the men's and women's teams host an open skate at the Houston Field House to help the fans acquaint themselves with the Engineers. The players not only skate, they chat, sign autographs, and pose for pictures with the participants. It's an event that is anticipated annually. In recent years, the Skate has been held right after the Red/White Scrimmage.

## ALUMNI WEEKEND...

Each year, Rensselaer's hockey alumni reunite for the opportunity to lace up the skates and take part in the Annual Alumni Game on the Houston Field House sheet of ice. Former players from around North America come back to reminisce about old times and to visit with many of the Rensselaer faithful who they knew while student-athletes at RPI. Each returning alum is also recognized during a between-periods, on-ice ceremony. Over the past few seasons, among those welcomed back were members of the 1954 National Championship Team as well as the 1985



team that won the NCAA title as the two squads celebrated significant anniversaries.

SENIOR NIGHT...

Every year prior to the regular season home finale, each of the seniors and their families are honored in front of the crowd. This ceremony not only recognizes each class, it allows the fans to recognize each student-athlete for their years of dedication to Rensselaer.

**BIG RED FREAKOUT!**

It all started on February 25, 1978. A standing room only crowd of 4,594 gathered in the Houston Field House for what was to be called the Big Red Freakout!

The press release was sent out by the sports information director, Jim Greenidge, that all fans for the Saturday game against New Hampshire were urged to wear something red, bring noisemakers, enjoy free skating after the game, and enter the banner contest.

At the time the excitement was high for the Engineers, enjoying one of its best seasons since Jim Salfi had taken over the club. The team finished that year with a 19-9-1 record and a 13-8-0 ECAC record for a fourth place finish, the highest conference finish to that point in Rensselaer history.

Steve Stoyanovich was the star of the first game, scoring a hat trick and adding an assist as the Engineers defeated UNH, 6-5 in overtime. Stoyanovich scored the second, fourth and sixth RPI goals and assisted on the fifth while Ian Harrison turned back 50 shots. Appropriately, the Freakout! gift that year was an Engineer hat.

In 1983 a then-record crowd of 5,222 packed into the Field House as the Engineers rolled over St. Lawrence, 8-1. Mike Sadeghpour scored twice in the first period and Mark Jooris and Kraig Nienhuis each added two goals of their own. Marty Dallman and George Servinis scored once and added two assists in the game.

According to the press release prior to that game, "the Freakout!

is an orgy of school spirit with everyone wearing red and making as much noise as possible. To add to the fun, the Student Union purchased 3,500 stadium horns to be handed out as favors."

The year 1987 was a turning point in the history of the Freakout!. The opponent was Brown and RPI jumped out to a 4-1 lead in the first period. The Engineers went on to win the penalty-filled game, 8-3, but the reason for the turning point in the event did not occur on the ice. The favor for the Brown game was another stadium horn. The combination of those horns and the number of past favors brought to the game caused an incredible amount of noise that it had an effect on the outcome of the game. The NCAA stepped in

and restricted the type of gift that could be given out.

Perhaps the most exciting game came in 2002 - the 25th Annual - when the Engineers came from behind to defeat arch-rival Clarkson, 4-3 in overtime. Trailing 3-0 with just under 13 minutes remaining in the third period, RPI fed off the sold out crowd to come all the way back for victory!

Throughout it all, the Freakout! has survived the test of time and endures today as the top event on the Rensselaer schedule each year. It is the toughest ticket to get in the area and should remain that way for as long as there is a Freakout!

Incidentally, RPI is unbeaten in its last 16 Freakouts! (12-0-4) and is 18-7-4 all-time.

**Rensselaer 6, New Hampshire 5 (OT)**  
February 25, 1978 (Hat)  
Steve Stoyanovich scored a hat trick, including the game-winning goal with 1:12 remaining in the ten-minute overtime, and an assist before 4,954 fans. Ian Harrison stopped 50 shots, including 19 in the third period and seven in overtime, for the win.

Moffett earned the win for New Hampshire.

**Cornell 7, Rensselaer 4**  
February 6, 1982 (Pennant & Cricket)  
A crowd of 4,972 watched as the Big Red got two goals and two assists from Roy Kerling. RPI had four different goal scorers and Ken Hammond picked up two assists.

**Rensselaer 8, St. Lawrence 1**  
February 12, 1983 (Horn)  
RPI jumped on St. Lawrence early and often, never letting up. Mike Sadeghpour, Kraig Nienhuis, and Mark Jooris had two goals each to pace the attack.

**Rensselaer 9, Boston College 7**  
February 24, 1979 (Pom-Pom)  
The Engineers scored three times in the first period, twice in the second and four more in the third period in front of a crowd of 4,493. Loris Muzzatti had a hat trick, Steve Stoyanovich scored twice, and Ian Harrison finished with 29 saves.

**Boston College 4, Rensselaer 1**  
February 21, 1981 (Rattle)  
The Eagles outscored the Engineers 3-0 in the final period to break open a 1-1 tie in front of a sold-out crowd of 4,972. Larry Landon scored for RPI while Gerry Fink stopped 36 shots in defeat.



**Rensselaer 10, St. Lawrence 2**  
February 11, 1984 (Bell)  
Marty Dallman scored three times, Kraig Nienhuis had two goals and an assist, and Mike Robinson scored once with two helpers as the Engineers romped in front of 5,456 Field House fans.

**Rensselaer 8, Yale 2**  
February 9, 1985 (Applause Jaws)  
Mark Jooris (2 goals, 3 assists), George Servinis (1 goal, 3 assists) and Adam Oates (1 goal, 2 assists), all collected multiple points as RPI won big for the third straight Freakout!. A record crowd of 5,506 also saw Daren Puppa stop 23 shots.

**New Hampshire 3, Rensselaer 2 (OT)**  
January 19, 1980 (Bell)  
An injury-riddled RPI outshot UNH, 55-40, but the Engineers fell in overtime. John Emerson and Dave Stoyanovich scored for the home team while Kevin Constantine finished with 37 saves. Greg

**St. Lawrence 3, Rensselaer 0**  
February 1, 1986 (Megaphone)  
Although the Engineers outshot St.

Lawrence 42-29, they allowed three power play goals and lost.

#### **Rensselaer 8, Brown 3**

February 7, 1987 (Horn)  
In a game that featured 39 penalties and 21 power plays, Chris Walsh scored twice and assisted on two others to lead Rensselaer, which went 5 for 10 with the man-advantage. Gavin Armstrong (30 saves) and Steve Duncan (2 saves) combined for the victory.

#### **Clarkson 6, Rensselaer 5**

January 30, 1988 (Towel)  
Both teams scored three times in the first period and once in the second before Clarkson tallied the final two goals for the win. The game featured 26 penalties, including 14 on RPI.

#### **Yale 5, Rensselaer 4**

February 4, 1989 (Bandana)  
A crowd of 5,219 saw the Bulldogs score twice in the third period for a come-from-behind victory. Rob Schena scored twice in the losing effort.

#### **St. Lawrence 5, Rensselaer 4**

January 27, 1990 (Pom-Pom)  
RPI led 3-1 after the first period but the Engineers could not hold off the Saints, who scored the next four goals. Joe Day had two goals and two assists to lead the visitors.

#### **Rensselaer 4, Brown 2**

February 2, 1991 (Megaphone)  
Four different players - Joe Juneau, Derek DeCosty, Bruce Coles, and Mickey LeBlanc - scored and Sean Kennedy stopped 22 shots in a come-from-behind victory.

#### **Rensselaer 2, Vermont 2 (OT)**

February 8, 1992 (Balloon)  
Wayne Clarke scored both RPI goals, including the game-tying tally at 8:15 of the third period, and Neil Little made 24 saves for the Engineers. Christian Soucy stopped 31 shots for UVM.

#### **Rensselaer 5, Brown 2**

February 6, 1993 (Glove)  
Xavier Majic and Brad Layzell led a balanced Rensselaer attack with a goal and two assists each. Neil Little stopped 28 of 30 shots as RPI went on to win in front of 5,217 fans.

#### **Rensselaer 2,**

**Vermont 2**  
February 12, 1994 (Rattle)  
Forwards Wayne Clarke and Bryan Richardson gave RPI a 2-1 lead with a goal apiece before Vermont tied the game midway through the third period. Neil Little's 40 saves kept the game deadlocked.

#### **Rensselaer 6, Brown 1**

February 25, 1995 (Bandana)  
RPI tallied four goals in the first period on its way to victory. Adam Bartell had two goals and an assist, including the game-winner. Mike Tamburro and Tim Spadafore combined to stop 34 of 35 shots for the Engineers, who won their sixth straight Freakout! game.

#### **Rensselaer 4, Brown 2**

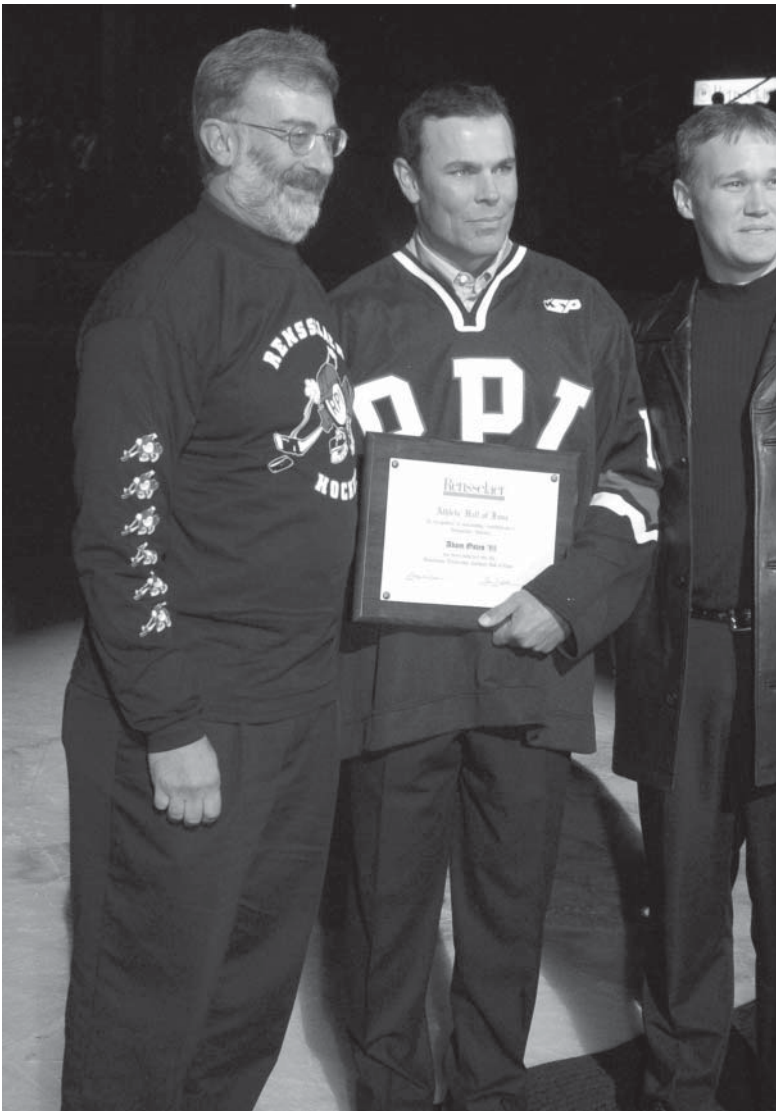
February 11, 2006 (Foam Mask)

## THE HOCKEY RING OF HONOR

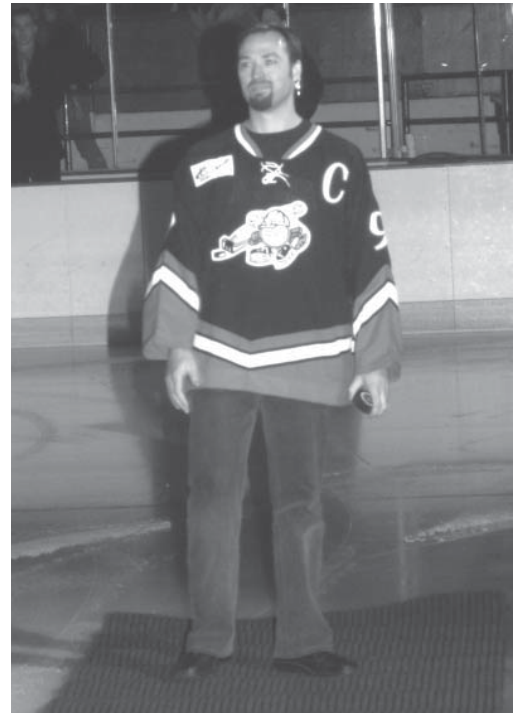
Joe Juneau was the second honoree into Rensselaer Hockey's Ring of Honor on Saturday, November 12, when the Engineers hosted Princeton in an ECACHL contest. A member of the Class of 1991, he was also inducted into the Rensselaer Athletics Hall of Fame that night.

Juneau had a tremendous career at Rensselaer, tallying 69 goals and 144 assists for 213 points in 124 games. He is currently second in school history in career assists and fifth in points. The team's leading point producer in each of his four seasons, he is also third (52 in 1989-90) and eighth (40 in 1990-91) in single season helpers. A native of Pont-Rouge, Que., Juneau was a two-time National All-American and twice named a finalist for the prestigious Hobey Baker Award, presented annually to the top college player in the U.S.

The school's Male Freshman Athlete of the Year in 1988 and the Male Career Athlete in 1990, he was drafted by the Boston Bruins in the fourth round of the National Hockey League Entry Draft and went on to have a stellar NHL career, scoring 572 points (156 goals, 416 assists) in 828 games for six teams. He also represented Canada in several national events, including the 1992 Winter Olympics.

Friday, November 5, 2004, was Adam Oates Night at the Houston Field House. That evening, Oates, a member of the Class of 1985, was inducted into the Rensselaer Athletics Hall of Fame and there was an unveiling of his number in the Houston Field House rafters, initiating the school's Hockey Ring of Honor. Oates also took part in that night's 2nd Annual Black Friday festivities, wearing a special, one-of-a-kind jersey.

Oates played three seasons for the Engineers, leading the team to the 1985 NCAA National Championship. That year he established school single season records for points (91) and assists (60) as well as career assists (150), all of which he still holds. He also scored 66 goals in his 110 collegiate games. A two-time All-American and All-ECAC selection, he led RPI in assists every year, helping the team to an overall record of 85-19-1 (.814) and two league championships.

A management major from Weston, Ont., Oates went on to score 341 goals with 1,079 assists for 1,420 points in 1,337 games for seven National Hockey League teams. A five-time All-Star Game participant, he retired following the 2003-04 season ranked fifth all-time in NHL history in assists and 13th in points.



# THE ECAC HOCKEY LEAGUE

Home to 12 of the most prestigious ice hockey programs in the nation, the ECAC Hockey League is a conference filled with tradition, legendary players, coaches and administrators and a bright and exciting future.

In terms of tradition, no conference can lay claim to the history of the ECAC Hockey League.

The birthplace of collegiate ice hockey, member institutions have been sponsoring the sport for nearly a century. On February 1, 1896 in Baltimore, Maryland, Yale faced Johns Hopkins in the first collegiate ice hockey game. Two years later on January 19, 1898, Brown defeated Harvard in Boston in the first college hockey game between schools still sponsoring the sport.

From a team standpoint, Cornell (1969-70) stands as the only team in NCAA ice hockey history to produce a perfect unbeaten and untied record en route to the Division I men's title. The Big Red posted a mark of 29-0 under coach Ned Harkness, a Hockey Hall of Fame inductee in 1994.

On the ice, legendary players such as Princeton's Hobart Amory Hare "Hobey" Baker, Cornell goaltending great Ken Dryden, who led the Montreal Canadiens to five Stanley Cups, and Clarkson's Dave Taylor, who starred with the NHL's Los Angeles Kings, are among the numerous standouts who made their mark in the conference.

The conference's tradition and history are not limited to the playing surface. A wealth of legendary coaches have called the conference home, including Harkness, Dartmouth's Eddie Jeremiah, whose instructional book on the game was the hockey bible for a generation; Army's Jack Riley, who led the 1960 U.S. Olympic squad to the gold medal at Squaw Valley; and Yale's Tim Taylor, who led the 1994 U.S. Olympic Team in Lillehammer, Norway.

In terms of leadership, the ECACHL is second to none. When the Decathlon Club of Bloomington, Minn., wanted a model for hockey's version of the Heisman Trophy, they turned to an ECAC Hockey League institution and found Princeton's Baker. Today, the best male player in college hockey receives the Hobey Baker Memorial Award.

Lest anyone think the ECACHL is about yesterday, the NHL draft annually features a wealth of conference draftees. Since the conference's inception in 1961-62, 550 players have been drafted by NHL teams, including 61 over the past five years and 159 over the last 15.

Today, many former conference players enjoy NHL careers. Former standouts include Anaheim Mighty Ducks forwards Andy McDonald (Colgate) and Todd Marchant (Clarkson); Caroli-

na Hurricanes forwards Erik Cole (Clarkson) and Craig Adams (Harvard); Chicago Blackhawks forward Craig MacDonal (Harvard); Colorado Avalanche forward Matt Murley (Rensselaer); Dallas Stars forward Jeff Halpern (Princeton); Florida Panthers forward

Joe Nieuwendyk (Cornell); Phoenix Coyotes goaltender David LeNeveu (Cornell); Pittsburgh Penguins forward Dominic Moore (Harvard); Vancouver Canucks defenseman Willie Mitchell (Clarkson); Minnesota Wild forward Todd White (Clarkson); Montreal Canadiens defenseman Todd Simpson (Brown) and forward Chris

Keenan and Jacques Martin serve as the Panthers' alternate governor; general manager and head coach, respectively. In addition, NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman is a Cornell graduate.

All of these players have played in each of the ECAC Hockey League rinks, rinks that are regarded as some of college hockey's finest. From the frenzy at Rensselaer's Houston Field House to Cornell's historic Lynah Rink, spectators get a feel for and become part of the league's tradition.

The ECAC Hockey League has its Hobey Baker winners, its All-Americans and its national champions, but what may set it apart from any other conference in the nation is its tradition and success in academics.

Few, if any, conferences can produce a list of influential and successful alumni like the ECAC Hockey League.

Scott Hanley (Brown) currently serves as the Director of Sports and Competition for ESPN X Games while John McLennan (Clarkson) spent his career as the CEO of Bell Canada. Some former ECAC players became inventors, like Ed Werner (Colgate) and John Haney (Colgate), who invented the board game Trivial Pursuit.

Other players have excelled in the financial world after hockey. Players like John Hughes (Cornell), a tax and real estate attorney in New York, Dino Macaluso (Rensselaer), president of The Macaluso Group, and Guy Logan (Union), an associate investment banker for SunTrust Robinson Humphrey Co. LLC.

Other former league players made it big in the entertainment world, and none bigger than David Kelley (Princeton) the writer, creator and producer of shows like Boston Legal, Ally McBeal, LA Law and

Chicago Hope and the movie Mystery, Alaska.

As a means to give fans and alumni an opportunity to remain a part of the ECAC Hockey League family, the league offers a variety of opportunities, including a television package, conference web page, and a weekly radio report during the season.

As for the future, it is clear that the ECAC shall continue to occupy its spot among ice hockey's elite conferences.

Beyond the playing surface, a plethora of former standouts now hold management positions in the world's elite league. Harvard graduate Peter Chiarelli is the general manager of the Boston Bruins; St. Lawrence alum Mike Barnett is general manager of the Phoenix Coyotes, while fellow SLU grad Ray Shero is the general manager of the Pittsburgh Penguins. Clarkson alum Taylor was senior vice president and general manager of the Los Angeles Kings; Colgate alum Mike Milbury served as general manager of the New York Islanders and is now special assistant to the owner; and Cornell's Dryden served as vice-chairman of Maple Leaf Sports and Entertainment Ltd. In Florida, St. Lawrence graduates Bill Torrey, Mike
