COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

NEW FOE IN THE BLUEGRASS

South Alabama and Kentucky will meet for the first time Saturday at Kroger Field. Kentucky will be the seventh different current SEC program the Jaguars have faced. South Alabama closes nonconference play in Lexington before opening its Sun Belt schedule against ULM on Oct. 3.

THREE HEADED MONSTER

Keenan Phillips, PJ Martin and Trae'von Dunbar have combined for 575 rushing yards and seven touchdowns through three games. All three scored against Ohio as the Jaguars rushed for a season-high 266 yards and four touchdowns. Phillips led the way with 116 yards, while Dunbar scored twice.

OWNING THE CLOCK

South Alabama ranks second nationally in time of possession at 36:46 per game and has held the possession advantage in all three contests. The Jaguars held the ball for 40:09 against Southeastern Louisiana, 37:40 at Tulane and 32:30 against Ohio.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for South Alabama Football games must be submitted through the credential request portal at USAJaguars.com. This can be found by navigating to the football page, then selecting the media drop-down menu.

Credentials should be requested by Wednesday of the game week for a Saturday game. Credentials can be picked up at the ticket booth on the south side of Hancock Whitney Stadium.

No credentials will be issued to freelance photographers/videographers. Nobody under the age of 18 will be issued a media credential.

The South Alabama strategic communications office reserves the right to approve or deny credential requests at its discretion.

FIELD ACCESS

Media credentials must be visible in order to gain access to the field. All members of the media must have a working purpose in order to be on the sidelines.

Members of the media should never enter the field of play, or the bench area of either the home or visiting team (between the 25-yard lines).

The South Alabama locker room is closed at all times to members of the media.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Only photographers/videographers shooting for accredited media outlets will be issued credentials.

Photographers/videographers with a media credential are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines. Photographers/videographers may not shoot on the playing field until the conclusion of the game, and must stay off the field during pregame activities.

Photographers and videographers are considered working members of the media and must refrain from communicating with players, coaches or game officials.

Failure to follow any of these rules may result in immediate dismissal from the stadium.

POST GAME INTERVIEWS

After a cooling off period, selected players and coaches will be made available to members of the media in a postgame press conference. Interview requests will be taken late in the game and every effort will be made to ensure that requested players are available. Requested players and coaches will be accompanied by a South Alabama strategic communications staff member to the designated interview area (the officials locker room under the northwest corner of the stadium).

There will be no media interviews conducted on the field, except for the television network that is broadcasting the game.

Student-athletes who are injured will not be allowed to participate in post-game media interviews.

The South Alabama locker room is closed at all times to members of the media.

Visiting team postgame media availability will be coordinated through the visiting team's communications staff.

Not conforming to any of the above listed guidelines may result in the loss of credentials for future games.

PRACTICES

The South Alabama strategic communications staff encourages coverage of Jaguar Football in addition to game day. The team's practice schedule and availability will be communicated weekly. Please contact the South Alabama strategic communications office in advance if you plan on attending a practice session.

Certain South Alabama Football practices are open to credentialed members of the media for viewing on the condition that media in attendance do not report on any injuries that take place during practice. Media must also refrain from reporting on any players who do not participate in practice due to injury or any other reason.

Media wishing to report on injuries or players who do not practice must ask Coach Applewhite for a comment on said players during his media availability. If Coach Applewhite chooses not to comment on the player in question, no reporting may take place.

Media who fail to comply with this policy run the risk of losing access to practices.

INTERVIEWS

In-person interviews with members of the coaching staff and student-athletes can be arranged by contacting Seth Whitehouse or Ethan Ronan. Interviews with student-

athletes must be arranged in advance through the media relations office. Players are generally available immediately following practice

Phone interviews are also available, but will be arranged around the student-athlete's class and practice schedules. Student-athletes' phone numbers are not available under any circumstance. All phone interview requests must be made 24 hours prior.

MEDIA MEMBERS SHOULD NEVER CONTACT STUDENT-ATHLETES DIRECTLY AT ANY TIME. Student-athletes have been instructed to immediately terminate any contact initiated by a member of the media.

South Alabama conducts a weekly press conference on Mondays in the team room of the Jaguar Football Facility.

Head coach Major Applewhite, along with defensive coordinator Todd Orlando will address the media at 12:30 p.m. CT

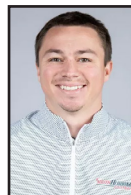

HEAD COACH | MAJOR APPLEWHITE

Major Applewhite was named the fourth head coach in the history of South Alabama Football on Jan. 18, 2024.

Applewhite wrapped up his second season as head coach of the Jaguars in 2025, guiding South Alabama to a 4-8 record with wins in three of its last-five games, including two of the final three. South Alabama hosted Southern Miss in its home finale and earned a 42-35 victory to move to 6-0 all time against the Golden Eagles. Southern Miss entered the game in first place in the Sun Belt Conference West Division, and Applewhite's South Alabama squad jumped out to a 21-point lead to secure the upset victory.

In his second year at the helm of the program, Applewhite oversaw multiple major milestones for the Jaguars. Running back Kentrel Bullock set the program's single-season rushing record, finishing the year with 1,085 yards. Bullock was later named First Team All-Sun Belt Conference. Cornerback Nehemiah Chandler also tied the program's single-season record for pass breakups with 13 on the year. His efforts also resulted in being named First Team All-Conference. In addition to Bullock and Chandler, Applewhite's efforts produced an additional seven all-conference performers.

In his first season at the helm of the program, Applewhite led the Jaguars to a 7-6 record. The season ended just up the road in Montgomery, Ala. where South won the IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl Championship by defeating Western Michigan by a score of 30-23. It was the program's second-straight bowl championship and Applewhite's first as a head coach. Applewhite became the first South Alabama head coach to make and win a bowl game in his first season with the team.

Under Applewhite's leadership in 2024, the Jags produced 11 All-Sun Belt Conference performers. Wide receiver Jamaal Pritchett and safety Jaden Voisin both earned First Team All-Conference recognition, with Pritchett becoming the third, 1,000-yard receiver South Alabama has produced since Applewhite became offensive coordinator in 2021. Pritchett was also invited to play in the 2025 Reese's Senior Bowl, held at South Alabama's Hancock Whitney Stadium.

Known for orchestrating explosive offenses, Applewhite's impact as head coach was noticeable from his very first game as the Jaguars quickly started breaking records. In the 2024 season opener against North Texas, quarterback Gio Lopez set the program's single-game record for total offense with 494 total yards on 432 yards passing and 62 yards rushing. A few weeks later, the Jags put up 87 points in a victory over Northwestern State, which was the most points scored by an FBS team since the 1991 college football season, and set a new program record. The Jags ended the year with the most rushing touchdowns in the Sun Belt Conference (32), and finished second in the league in total

offense per game at 441.8 yards per contest.

In year one at South, Applewhite continued the trend of providing his players with professional opportunities. Wide receiver Jamaal Pritchett, tight end DJ Thomas-Jones, defensive lineman Wy'Kevious Thomas and wide receiver Jeremiah Webb all signed free agent contracts at the conclusion of the 2025 NFL Draft.

Before earning to promotion to head coach, Applewhite spent three seasons with the Jaguars as the team's offensive coordinator. South Alabama went 22-16 during those three years, including a 10-win season in 2022 and a 2023 campaign that resulted in the first bowl championship in school history.

One of the best offensive minds in all of college football, Applewhite has elevated South's offensive attack since arriving on campus. In his role as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Applewhite's star pupil at USA has been Carter Bradley, who became the winningest quarterback in program history and broke multiple school records along the way. Bradley received All-Sun Belt honorable mention recognition in 2023, and accepted invitations to both the Hula Bowl and Senior Bowl at season's end.

Under Applewhite's leadership, the 2023 Jaguar offense set a program record for points in a single season with 430 on the year. South Alabama scored 55 points or more in three games throughout the course of the season, including 59 in the team's win over Eastern Michigan in the 68 Ventures Bowl. That number set a program record for points against an FBS opponent. The Jags also scored 55 points in back-to-back wins over ULM and Southern Miss.

Applewhite settles into his new role at South Alabama having already spent two seasons as the head coach at Houston. In two seasons at the helm, Applewhite guided the Cougars to a record of 15-11 with two bowl game appearances. In his first season leading the program, UH defeated nationally-ranked South Florida during the regular season on the way to a 7-5 finish and an appearance in the Hawai'i Bowl. The Cougars then improved to 8-5 the next fall while earning an invitation to the Armed Forces Bowl.

Between stops at Houston and South Alabama, Applewhite spent two seasons as an analyst on Nick Saban's staff at Alabama. In 2020, he helped guide the Crimson Tide to a perfect 13-0 season and subsequent College Football Playoff National Championship. It was Applewhite's second of two stints at Alabama, his first coming in 2007 when he served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

From 2008-2013, Applewhite coached at his alma mater, Texas, in various roles. Starting as the program's assistant head coach working with the running backs in 2008, Applewhite

was eventually elevated to offensive coordinator in 2011 and served in that capacity for three seasons with the Longhorns. While working for legendary head coach Mack Brown, Applewhite helped Texas win the 2008 Fiesta Bowl and make an appearance in the 2009 BCS National Championship game.

After starting his coaching career at Texas in 2003 as a graduate assistant, Applewhite went to Syracuse in 2005 as quarterbacks coach. Following a year in New York, he returned to the state of Texas to serve as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Rice for the 2006 season.

Before transitioning into coaching, Applewhite played quarterback at Texas for four seasons. During his playing career, Applewhite was named Big 12 Freshman of the Year and the league's co-Offensive Player of the Year in 1999. In his final appearance for the Longhorns, he was named Most Valuable Player of the Holiday Bowl after throwing for 473 yards and four touchdowns in a four-point victory over Washington.

Applewhite owns a bachelor's degree in sport management from Texas. He resides in Mobile with his wife, Julie, and children, Lila and Nash.

“I want to make this our city’s team. I want to create an atmosphere here in our stadium where it’s full. Where people are here early, they’re loud, and they stay late. I want to see 50, 60 smokestacks coming up. I want to see the top of RV’s. I want to create a situation where this stadium represents our entire city.”

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

-Saturday will mark the first meeting in program history between South Alabama and Kentucky.

- Kentucky will become the seventh different current SEC program South Alabama has faced.

The Jaguars will close their nonconference schedule against the Wildcats before beginning Sun Belt play against ULM on Oct. 3.

JAGS AGAINST THE SEC

- South Alabama has played nine games against current SEC members, posting a 1-8 record.

- The Jaguars have faced Mississippi State three times, Tennessee twice and South Carolina, Ole Miss, LSU and Auburn once each.

- Kentucky will become the seventh different current SEC program South Alabama has faced.

Saturday will mark the third consecutive season the Jaguars have faced an SEC opponent after traveling to LSU in 2024 and Auburn in 2025.

REMEMBER STARKVILLE

- South Alabama's lone victory against a current SEC opponent came on Sept. 3, 2016, when the Jaguars defeated Mississippi State, 21-20, in Starkville.

- The Jaguars trailed 17-0 in the second quarter before rallying for the victory.

- South Alabama scored 21 of the game's final 24 points to earn the road win.

CLOCK CONTROL

- South Alabama enters Week 4 averaging 36:46 in time of possession per game, ranking second nationally.

- The Jaguars held the ball for 40:09 against Southeastern Louisiana and 37:40 at Tulane before recording 32:30 of possession against Ohio.

- South Alabama has held the possession advantage in all three games and has run 228 offensive plays, compared to 147 by its opponents.

- Against Ohio, the Jaguars produced two scoring drives lasting more than seven minutes, combining to take 15:50 off the clock.

- An 18-play, 66-yard drive consumed 7:57 and ended with a Davis Little field goal before halftime. South Alabama later marched 81 yards in 14 plays over 7:53, capped by Trae'von Dunbar's five-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

THREE HEADED MONSTER

- South Alabama's backfield trio of Keenan Phillips, PJ Martin and Trae'von Dunbar has combined for 575 rushing yards and seven touchdowns on 120 carries, accounting for 83.5 percent

of the Jaguars' rushing yards.

- Phillips leads the group with 226 yards, followed by Martin with 222 and Dunbar with 127.

- All three scored against Ohio, with Dunbar recording the first multi-touchdown game of his career.

- South Alabama produced a season-high 266 rushing yards and four touchdowns on 50 attempts against the Bobcats.

- The Jaguars have rushed for 689 yards and eight touchdowns through three games, averaging 229.7 yards per contest.South Alabama has rushed for at least 180 yards in every game this season.

KP KEEP MOVING

- Keenan Phillips recorded South Alabama's first 100-yard rushing performance of the season against Ohio.

- Phillips rushed for a game-high 116 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries, averaging 6.4 yards per attempt and currently ranks 24th in the country in all purpose yards.

- He scored South Alabama's first touchdown on a six-yard run to cap a seven-play, 75-yard opening drive.

- Phillips added two receptions for 25 yards and an eight-yard kickoff return to finish with 149 all-purpose yards.

DAVENPORT'S STRONG START

- Bishop Davenport started South Alabama's first two games of the season before being inactive against Ohio in Week 3.

- Davenport has completed 40-of-59 passes for 450 yards and three touchdowns without throwing an interception this season.

- He has also rushed for 73 yards and a touchdown, giving him 523 yards of total offense and four touchdowns accounted for through two appearances.

- Davenport set a career high with 296 passing yards at Tulane, completing 22-of-32 passes with two touchdowns while adding 50 rushing yards.

HOLLINS GETS THE CALL

- With Davenport inactive, Jared Hollins made his first start as a Jaguar against Ohio.

- Hollins completed 13-of-20 passes for 192 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception. He averaged 9.6 yards per attempt and completed passes to six different receivers.

- Hollins connected with Jeremiah Jones-Thomas for 40 yards on the opening possession before finding Rod Gibbs for a 34-yard touchdown on fourth down on South Alabama's second drive.

- He later connected with Micah Woods for 49 yards, South Alabama's longest completion of the season.

- Hollins also rushed for 18 yards as South Alabama finished with 458 yards of total offense.

TAKE CARE OF THE FOOTBALL

- South Alabama has not committed a turnover through its first three games.

- Jaguar quarterbacks have combined to attempt 79 passes without throwing an interception, and South Alabama has yet to lose a fumble.

- The Jaguars have forced four turnovers, recording three

interceptions and a fumble recovery to post a plus-four turnover margin.

- D.J. Moore recorded his first interception as a Jaguar against Ohio, while Christian Ross recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchback.

- South Alabama converted those two takeaways into 10 points in the 41-36 victory.

HOT OUT OF THE GATE

- South Alabama has scored on its opening possession in all three games this season, including touchdowns in two of the three.

- Bishop Davenport connected with Brendan Jenkins for a 26-yard touchdown to cap a five-play, 55-yard opening drive against Southeastern Louisiana. It was the Jaguars' first opening-drive touchdown since 2023 against Southern Miss.

- At Tulane, the Jaguars opened with an 11-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a 40-yard field goal by Davis Little.

- Keenan Phillips capped a seven-play, 75-yard opening drive against Ohio with a six-yard touchdown run. South Alabama followed with another 75-yard touchdown drive on its second possession.

- The Jaguars scored on their first three possessions against Southeastern Louisiana and their first four possessions against Ohio.

- South Alabama has outscored opponents 43-14 in the first quarter this season.

MOVING THE CHAINS

- South Alabama has converted 25-of-48 third-down opportunities through three games, a 52.1 percent success rate.

- The Jaguars converted 10-of-16 third downs at Tulane and 8-of-15 against Ohio, going a combined 18-of-31 (58.1 percent) over their last two games.

- South Alabama also converted both of its fourth-down attempts against Ohio, including Jared Hollins' 34-yard touchdown pass to Rod Gibbs.

RED ZONE RESULTS

- South Alabama has scored points on 13-of-14 red-zone opportunities (92.9%) through three games.

- The Jaguars were a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone against Ohio, producing three touchdowns and two field goals.

- South Alabama has scored 104 points through three games, averaging 34.7 points per contest.

JENKINS JUST GETTING STARTED

- Brendan Jenkins leads South Alabama with 15 receptions for 202 yards and two touchdowns through three games, surpassing his totals in all three categories from the 2025 season.

- Jenkins finished last season with nine receptions for 117 yards and a touchdown in nine appearances.

- He matched his 2025 reception total in one game at Tulane, catching nine passes for a career-high 119 yards and a touchdown. The performance marked the first 100-yard receiving game of his Jaguar career.

- Jenkins opened the season with five receptions for 78 yards and a touchdown against Southeastern Louisiana, leading

South Alabama in receiving and catching a touchdown in each of its first two games.

JJT STEPS UP

- Jeremiah Jones-Thomas led South Alabama with six receptions for 74 yards in the victory over Ohio.

- Jones-Thomas accounted for 57 receiving yards on the Jaguars' opening touchdown drive, catching passes of 40 and 17 yards from Jared Hollins.

- Through three games, Jones-Thomas ranks second on the team with 13 receptions for 145 yards.

BLAYLOCK LEADS THE WAY

- Safety Cole Blaylock leads South Alabama with 18 tackles through three games and has added 2.5 tackles for loss.

- Blaylock recorded a career-high seven tackles and two tackles for loss at Tulane.

- He led the Jaguars with five tackles in the season opener against Southeastern Louisiana before adding six stops against Ohio.

- Blaylock has recorded at least five tackles in each game this season.

DARBY BRINGS THE PRESSURE

- Damyron Darby recorded a career-high 1.5 sacks in South Alabama's 41-36 victory over Ohio.

- Darby has made an impact in both Jaguar victories, recording his first career interception in the season opener against Southeastern Louisiana.

- South Alabama has recorded five sacks through three games.

REUNITED A DECADE LATER

- Veteran defensive coordinator Todd Orlando took over the South Alabama defense in 2026, reuniting with head coach Major Applewhite 10 years after their last season together.

- Applewhite and Orlando spent the 2015 and 2016 seasons together on Tom Herman's staff at Houston, serving as the Cougars' offensive and defensive coordinators, respectively. Houston compiled a 22-4 record during their two seasons together, including a 13-1 mark in 2015.

One of the most experienced defensive coordinators in college football, Orlando has served as an FBS defensive coordinator every season since 2005.

KICKER KNOWS BEST

- Kicker Davis Little has connected on six field goals and all 12 of his extra-point attempts this season.

- Little made all three of his field-goal attempts against Southeastern Louisiana, establishing a career high for field goals made in a game.

- After setting a career long with a 35-yard field goal in the opener, Little surpassed that mark with a 40-yard field goal at Tulane.

- Little has accounted for 30 points through South Alabama's first three games. He has made field goals from 21, 26, 30, 32, 35 and 40 yards.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT HONORS

- Four South Alabama players were selected to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team ahead of the 2026 season. All four selections came on the offensive side of the ball.

- Running back Keenan Phillips, wide receiver Anthony Eager and offensive linemen Ethan Hubbard and Kenton Jerido represented the Jaguars on the preseason squad.

#OURCITY

- South Alabama's 2026 roster features 44 players from the state of Alabama, including 13 from the greater Mobile area.

- Wide receiver Anthony Eager highlights the local contingent. The Mobile native attended McGill-Toolen Catholic High School before beginning his collegiate career with the Jaguars.

- Eager recorded his first touchdown of the season on a 43-yard reception at Tulane. The touchdown reception was the second-longest catch of his career.

MAJOR CONNECTIONS

- During his 23 years in coaching, South Alabama head coach Major Applewhite has worked with a long list of quarterbacks who went on to reach the NFL.

- That group includes Vince Young (Texas, 2003-04), Joel Armstrong (Rice, 2006), John Parker Wilson (Alabama, 2007), Colt McCoy (Texas, 2008-09), Greg Ward Jr. (Houston, 2015-16), D'Eriq King and Clayton Tune (Houston, 2018), and Tua Tagovailoa, Mac Jones and Bryce Young (Alabama, 2019-20).

- All 10 quarterbacks went on to make an NFL roster.

- Seven played in at least one NFL regular-season game, six were selected in the NFL Draft and five were selected within the first three rounds.

- Four were first-round selections: Young, McCoy, Tagovailoa and Jones.

- Three were selected among the top five picks: Young, Tagovailoa and Jones.

MR RELIABLE

- Versatility has been a defining characteristic of South Alabama offensive lineman Kenton Jerido. Jerido saw action at all five offensive line positions during the 2025 season. He appeared in all 12 games and started five of the Jaguars' final six contests.

- Jerido earned Third-Team All-Sun Belt honors following the season and enters 2026 as a Preseason Second-Team All-Sun Belt selection.

THE ROAD AHEAD

- South Alabama will play six games at Hancock Whitney Stadium during the 2026 regular season.

- The Jaguars will also face an SEC opponent for the third consecutive season when they travel to Kentucky.

- South's conference road schedule features a pair of nationally televised midweek contests against Arkansas State and Marshall.

- Louisiana Tech will make its first trip to Hancock Whitney Stadium as a Sun Belt Conference opponent when the Bulldogs visit Mobile on Oct. 31.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- South Alabama welcomed 60 newcomers to its 2026 roster, including 32 freshmen and 28 transfers.

- Freshmen account for 53.3 percent of the newcomer class, while transfers make up 46.7 percent.

- According to 247Sports, Applewhite and his staff signed the fifth-ranked class in the Sun Belt, the program's highest ranking since Applewhite took over as head coach in 2024.

- Eight true freshmen appeared in South Alabama's season-opening victory over Southeastern Louisiana.

- Linebacker Xavious Anderson Jr. earned a start in his collegiate debut and recorded three tackles.

- Ten true freshmen were listed on South Alabama's three-deep entering the season.

FAMILIAR FACES

- South Alabama enters the 2026 season returning 44 percent of its production from a season ago, ranking 105th nationally according to ESPN's Bill Connelly.

- South Alabama returns six defensive starters and six offensive starters from a year ago.

- The six returning offensive starters are Kenton Jerido (C), Ethan Hubbard (RT), Bishop Davenport (QB), Rod Gibbs (TE), Brendan Jenkins (WR) and Anthony Eager (WR).

- Defensively, South returns Tre'Mon Henry (BB), Stephen Johnson (NT), Damyron Darby (S), Cole Blaylock (SAF), Dallas Young (FS) and Jayvon Henderson (CB).

THE LEGACY OF NO. 5

There are many special numbers throughout college football and college athletics whether it be No. 12 for the 12th Man at Texas A&M or No. 38 at Ole Miss to remember former Rebel Chucky Mullins, but for South Alabama, the No. 5 will forever hold a significant place in the hearts of every Jaguar.

On June 13, 2010, the University of South Alabama lost a member of the football program when Anthony Mostella (1988-2010), a member on the inaugural Jaguar squad, passed away near his home of Oneonta, Ala., in a traffic accident. Mostella, who would have been a senior that fall, was loved and respected by all his teammates and coaches, someone whose contributions to the program on the field were exceeded by what he was able to accomplish away from the game.

Voted a team captain during the 2009 season, Mostella – a running back who came to South Alabama in order to continue his relationship with then head coach Joey Jones – displayed his selfless nature with his contributions on special teams and in the locker room, while fellow teammates racked up more yardage running the ball. In his one season, Mostella rushed for 180 yards and three touchdowns, and was also credited with seven tackles on special teams coverage units.

He came to USA and Mobile after playing for Jones at Birmingham-Southern in 2007, sacrificing a season of collegiate eligibility in order to help build the Jaguar program by taking part in its first-ever spring practice in March and April of 2009. During that time he established himself not only as a leader, but as an ambassador for the program as it established its roots in the community.

Beginning during the 2010 season, the Jaguars honored Mostella each fall as one member of the senior class was chosen by his teammates and coaches to wear his No. 5 jersey for their final season.

After a brief break from 2018-2020, the tradition was brought back, but with a new twist. Instead of a selected senior being able to wear the jersey for the entire season, it was awarded to a different individual each week throughout the season.

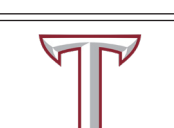
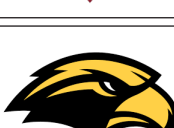

South Alabama Rolls to Season Opening Win over Southeastern Louisiana

MOBILE, Ala. – South Alabama opened its 2026 season with a strong all-around effort, using an aggressive offense, timely takeaways, and a stout defensive performance to defeat Southeastern Louisiana, 39-14, Saturday night at Hancock Whitney Stadium.

KEY MOMENTS

- Bishop Davenport and Brendan Jenkins put the Jaguars on the scoreboard on the opening drive with a 26-yard touchdown connection. The five-play, 55-yard drive lasted just 1:33 and marked South Alabama's first opening-drive touchdown since 2023 against Southern Miss.
- South Alabama quickly regained possession when Damyrion Darby recorded his first career interception at the 11:31 mark of the first quarter. The Jaguars turned the takeaway into points, putting together an 11-play, 45-yard drive that took 5:24 off the clock and ended with a 35-yard field goal from Little.
- The Jaguars added two more points with a safety at the 4:59 mark of the opening quarter, South Alabama's first safety since recording one against ULM in 2024. The ensuing free kick went out of bounds, giving the Jaguars possession at midfield.
- South Alabama capitalized on the field position as Trae'von Dunbar punched it in from one yard out to complete an eight-play, 50-yard drive. The touchdown gave the Jaguars a 19-7 advantage and capped their third consecutive scoring possession to open the game.
- The defense came up big again in the second quarter after South Alabama was stopped on fourth-and-3. Southeastern Louisiana attempted a 47-yard field goal, but the kick hit the left upright and was no good.
- Jaylen Moson added another takeaway for the Jaguar defense with his first interception in a South Alabama uniform.
- Davenport scored South Alabama's first touchdown of the second half on a short run up the middle, capping a four-play, 12-yard drive that lasted 1:39 and extended the Jaguar advantage.
- PJ Martin put the finishing touches on the victory with his first touchdown of the season, scoring on a three-yard run. The touchdown capped a 14-play, 57-yard drive that drained 8:15 off the clock and produced the final margin of 39-14.

Jags Ride Rushing Attack to 41-36 Win Over Ohio

MOBILE, Ala. – South Alabama used a balanced offensive attack and four rushing touchdowns to defeat Ohio, 41-36, Saturday night at Hancock Whitney Stadium. The victory improves the Jaguars to 2-1 on the season, while the Bobcats fall to 1-2.

Key Moments

- South Alabama opened the scoring on its first possession as Keenan Phillips capped a seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 6-yard touchdown run, his first of the season.
- After Ohio tied the game at 7-7, the Jaguars answered with their second consecutive 75-yard touchdown drive. Jared Hollins connected with Rod Gibbs for a 34-yard touchdown on fourth down to give South Alabama a 14-7 lead.
- D.J. Moore recorded his first interception as a Jaguar on Ohio's ensuing possession, returning it 13 yards. South Alabama capitalized just 29 seconds later as Trae'von Dunbar broke free for a 32-yard touchdown, the Jaguars' fastest touchdown drive of the season.
- Christian Ross recovered an Ohio fumble in the end zone for a touchback midway through the second quarter. The Jaguars followed with an 18-play, 66-yard drive that took 7:57 off the clock and ended with a 32-yard field goal from Davis Little, giving South Alabama a 24-7 halftime lead.
- Ohio scored touchdowns on each of its first two possessions of the second half to cut the South Alabama lead to 24-21.
- The Jaguars responded with a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Hollins connected with Micah Woods for 49 yards to set South Alabama up at the 1-yard line before PJ Martin punched it in to extend the lead to 31-21.
- South Alabama extended its advantage in the fourth quarter with a 14-play, 81-yard drive that took 7:53 off the clock. Dunbar capped the possession with a 5-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night, to give the Jaguars a 38-21 lead.
- After Ohio pulled within 38-29, the Jaguar defense forced a turnover on downs before Little connected on a 21-yard field goal with 1:10 remaining to make it 41-29. The Bobcats scored on the final play for the 41-36 final.

- South Alabama finished with 458 yards of total offense, including 266 yards on the ground.
- The Jaguars rushed 50 times for 266 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 5.3 yards per carry.
- Phillips led South Alabama with 116 rushing yards and a touchdown on 18 carries.
