## THE MATCHUP

■ The No. 2 Wake Forest baseball team travels to Louisville, Ky. for a top-10 ACC series against the Louisville Cardinals on Friday, April 14-Sunday, April 16.

## OPPONENT/SERIES HISTORY

- Wake Forest trails the all-time series against Louisville, 6-19-1, with the first matchup coming in 2015.
- Last season, the Demon Deacons and Cardinals went 1-1-1 against each other inside David F. Couch Ballpark. After claiming game one by a score of 14-3, Louisville forced the rubber match with a 6-2 victory in game two. Game three ended up in a 5-5 tie due to travel constraints. Overall, Wake Forest outscored Louisville 21-14 over the three-game series.

## WAKE FOREST HIGHLIGHTS

- Wake Forest is off to the program's best start through 33 games (29-4) since 1950. The Deacs started the year 13-0, joining the 1949 Deacs, who hold the program's best open to a campaign at 20-0, as the only teams in school history to win its first 13 games.
- Wake Forest's 18-2 win against Mount St. Mary's marked Tom Walter's 800th career win as a head coach. In 27 years of coaching, Walter has posted a 823-665-1 mark at George Washington, New Orleans and Wake Forest. Overall, Walter has won 395 contests at the helm of the Wake Forest baseball program.
- The Demon Deacons' .879 winning percentage is the second best in the nation. Additionally, Wake Forest leads the ACC in conference wins while sitting in second in the conference in overall wins.
- Wake Forest is off to a 12-2 mark in conference play, the program's best start in program history. The Demon Deacons are +36 in run differential through the first five series, outscoring opponents 80-44 in 14 games.
- After taking two out of three against Duke and Notre Dame, Wake Forest has posted three-straight perfect weekends against Miami (first time ever), Clemson (first time since 2012) and NC State (second-straight season).
- Wake Forest's pitching staff ranks as one of the premier groups in the entire nation. The Demon Deacon pitching staff leads the nation in strikeouts, strikeouts-per-nine innings, WHIP and ERA, while ranking first in the ACC and top-2 nationally in every other category.
- Wake Forest's offense leads the ACC in walks while ranking in the top six of every other offensive category.
- Wake Forest has outscored opponents by double-digits in eight innings this season. Overall, the Deacs are outscoring opponents by a 306-101 mark. Wake Forest has scored in the first inning in 21 games this season, posting a 19-2 record in those games. Additionally, the Deacs are 21-2 when they score first. Wake Forest's +6.2 run differential per game is good for the second-highest in the nation behind LSU (+6.5).

13 Deacs have launched a long fly, headlined by Brock Wilken with 15, Nick Kurtz with 10, Adam Cecere with nine, Justin Johnson with five, Pierce Bennett with four, Chris Katz and Danny Corona with three, Kyle Joye and Gio Cueto with two and Tommy Hawke, Bennett Lee, Lucas Costello and Marek Houston with one.

Tommy Hawke capped off Wake Forest's eight-run first inning in Wake Forest's first midweek game of the season with the Demon Deacons' first inside-the-park home run since 2016.

Wake Forest's comeback victory against Youngstown State was fueled by 12 runs in the bottom of the fourth inning, the most runs in an inning since the top of the fifth in last year's 18-5 victory at Georgia Tech on March 19. Additionally, this is tied for the ninth-highest scoring mark in an inning in the nation.

Wake Forest has reached double-digit hits in 15 games while scoring at least 10 runs in 15 contests.

After taking two out of three against Duke and Notre Dame, Wake Forest has posted three-straight perfect weekends against Miami (first time ever), Clemson (first time since 2012) and NC State (second-straight season).

The Deacs outscored the Hurricanes 19-2 in front of the largest regular season weekend crowd at David F. Couch Ballpark ever.

In its last four ACC series (11 games), Demon Deacon pitchers have shut down opposing offenses. Overall, eight arms have combined to allow just 76 hits and 20 earned runs while striking out 128 batters.

**LOWDER DAY**

- Unanimous Preseason All-American and 2022 ACC Pitcher of the Year Rhett Lowder has totaled a 1.84 ERA through 49 innings to go along with 58 strikeouts, 39 hits, eight walks and 10 earned runs conceded this season.
- Heading into his ninth start this weekend, Lowder ranks in the top 10 in victories, strikeout-to-walk ratio, strikeouts, WHIP, wins and walks-per-nine innings.
- Over the course of his career, Lowder has won 21 games and sits just one victory away from entering the top 10 in Wake Forest history for career wins.

- The Deacs got another stellar performance from Lowder on the bump in its series-opening win against Clemson as he moved to 6-0 for the first time in his career. Lowder tossed seven innings for the third-straight weekend, allowing one earned run and one walk while striking out six. With his fourth punchout in the fifth inning, Lowder rewrote the Wake Forest record book as the Albemarle, N.C. native entered the top 10 in program history in career strikeouts. He currently sits in ninth on the list.
- With four Ks against NC State, Lowder is now nine strikeouts away from jumping into eighth on Wake Forest's career list.

- Lowder earned ACC and Perfect Game Pitcher of the Week honors after earning his fifth win of 2023 after tossing a near flawless seven innings, allowing just three hits and two walks while fanning nine batters and allowing just two Hurricanes to reach third base in Friday's 11-0 series-opening victory over No. 17 Miami. Lowder has now started the last two seasons 5-0 and is currently one of five players in the ACC with five victories.
- Dating back to last season, Lowder has allowed three earned runs or less in 20 of his last 22 starts and has gone at least six innings in 15 starts.
- The righthander won his fourth game of the season after fanning seven batters in seven strong innings in the first game of Saturday's twin bill against Notre Dame.
- Lowder earned his third win of his junior season as the Reigning ACC Pitcher of the Year tossed seven scoreless frames while striking out eight Mastodon batters in Wake Forest's last home Friday contest. This marked the fifth career scoreless outing from the Wake Forest righthander.
- Lowder earned win number two of the season after retiring the 16-straight batters, including a series of three-up, three-down innings against Binghamton on Friday, Feb. 24. In the top of the fifth inning, Lowder tallied his seventh strikeout of the contest which marked the 200th strikeout of his Demon Deacon career. The strikeout completed an immaculate inning by the right hander.
- In his first appearance of 2023, Lowder struck out 10 batters in five innings, the fifth double-digit strikeout performance of his career (NJIT-Feb. 25, 2022, Clemson-April 15, 2022, Louisville-May 6, 2022 and Coastal Carolina-Feb. 23, 2021).
- In 2022, Lowder became the first Demon Deacon in program history to be named ACC Pitcher of the Year, the third Unanimous All-American in program history and the first Demon Deacon ever to be named a finalist for the Collegiate Pitcher of the Year Award.



**BENNY BARRELS**

- Pierce Bennett heads into the weekend on a team-best 16-game hit streak as the redshirt junior has notched a base knock in every contest since Wake Forest's midweek game at Liberty on March 13.
- Bennett has posted team-highs in average (.424), hits (25), RBIs (24), doubles (10), on-base percentage (.493) and slugging percentage (.695).
- In its perfect Sunday against NC State, Bennett went 4-for-7 with two doubles, four RBIs and one walk to lead Wake Forest at the plate.

**WILKEN LOOKS TO CLIMB CHARTS**

- After setting career highs in hits (69), home runs (23), RBIs (77) and doubles (13) in 2022, Brock Wilken looks to cement himself as one of the best hitters in Wake Forest history this season.
- With his 15th home run of the season on Tuesday night, Wilken is tied for fourth in the nation while ranking first in the ACC in HRs and has hit the most career long flies among active players in Division I baseball.
- After hitting the most home runs by a Demon Deacon in their first two seasons ever, Wilken's 55 career home runs is now tied with Jake Austin (1989-92) for the second-most long flies by a Demon Deacon ever. The Valrico, Fla. native is just four home runs away from breaking the program record.

- Wilken has posted a .317 batting average with 38 hits, seven doubles, 45 RBIs, 30 walks, 46 runs scored (the most in the ACC) and a .750 slugging percentage.
- The junior has reached base in 30 games and tallied a career-high 13 game hit streak this season. Additionally, Wilken has posted a team-high 16 multi-RBI games.
- Wilken needs 42 more base knocks to join the 200-hit club.

**SULLY MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT**

- Sean Sullivan has made an immediate impact in the Old Gold and Black, registering a 1.56 ERA in 40.1 innings to go along with 71 strikeouts, seven earned runs and nine walks allowed. Additionally, opponents are batting just .138 against the lefthander. For his efforts to open the season, Sullivan received back-to-back ACC Pitcher and Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week honors to open the season.
- The lefthander leads the conference in strikeouts, strikeouts-per-nine innings, hits-per-nine innings, WHIP, while ranking in the top 10 in ERA, strikeout-to-walk ratio, walks-per-nine innings and victories.
- Sullivan earned his fifth win of the season against NC State, tossing 4.2 scoreless innings out of Wake Forest's bullpen. The lefthander struck out eight batters and allowed only two baserunners. Sullivan took over on the mound with one out and the bases loaded and proceeded to induce a pop up before fanning a batter to end the inning and keep the game knotted at three. Overall, Sullivan notched perfect 1-2-3 frames in three consecutive innings.
- Sullivan earned his fourth win of the season against Miami, tossing five innings with eight strikeouts while allowing just three hits and two walks. The sophomore struck out five of the first nine batters he faced and continued to get stronger as the game went on. With the game knotted at 1-1, Sullivan stranded two baserunners in the fourth and fifth frames with an inning-ending strikeout closing his start and helping keep the momentum in the Demon Deacons' favor.
- Sullivan earned his third win of the 2023 season, tossing seven innings while striking out a career-high tying 11 strikeouts, his fourth double-digit strikeout performance of the season.
- Sullivan earned his second win of the 2023 season, tossing five innings while striking out 10, his third-straight double-digit strikeout performance to open the season.
- Sullivan began his outing by retiring the side in back-to-back innings, fanning five of the first six batters he faced. The reigning two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week ended his performance with a pair of strikeouts to reach the double-digit mark and secure his third perfect frame.
- Behind another electric outing from Sullivan, Wake Forest defeated Mount St. Mary's 18-2 in the opening game of the second weekend. Sullivan retired the first 16 batters of the game and had a perfect game through 5.1 innings. Overall, Sullivan punched out 11 and allowed just one baserunner in his six hitless innings of work.
- Sullivan impressed in his Demon Deacon debut in Wake Forest's 8-1 victory against Illinois on Saturday as the Andover, Mass. native struck out 10 batters while allowing just two hits and one walk in four scoreless innings to earn the save.
- Sullivan tallied at least two strikeouts in all four innings, highlighted by his trio of punchouts in the seventh and ninth. Additionally, Sullivan didn't allow more than one base runner in all four relief frames.
- Sullivan and Rhett Lowder combined for 20 strikeouts in the game, the most strikeouts by a Wake Forest Saturday in almost two years (Coastal Carolina-Feb. 23, 2021).

**HAWKE 'EM**

- After leading the team with the fourth-highest batting average by a freshman in program history (.380) last year, Tommy Hawke has continued to be impactful at the top of Wake Forest's lineup.
- Hawke ranks in the top 10 among conference competitors in on-base percentage (third), doubles (fifth), average (seventh), runs (fifth), hits (eighth) and walks (eighth).
- Hawke held the second-longest reached base streak (45 games) in the nation snapped in Wake Forest's Saturday doubleheader at Duke.
- Overall, Hawke has reached base safely in 82 of his career 91 appearances and is currently third among active Division I players in on-base percentage (.497) and eighth in average (.379).
- In Wake Forest's 18-1 victory against Towson on Feb. 25 Hawke notched a career-high five hits.

**HARTLE CONTINUES TO DEAL IN YEAR TWO**

- Josh Hartle has accumulated a 1.94 ERA through 46.1 innings to go along with 69 strikeouts, a new career high. The lefthander has allowed just 10 earned runs and has only walked seven batters.
- Currently, Hartle is the ACC leader in strikeout-to-walk ratio and walks-per-nine innings while ranking in the top 10 in strikeouts-per-nine, ERA, wins and WHIP.
- In his career, Hartle has allowed two earned runs or less in 15 of his 22 starts.
- Hartle has struck out at least 10 batters in three of his four starts this season and has walked more than one batter in just two of his outings. In each of his first three appearances, Hartle either set or tied his previous career-high strikeout mark.
- Against Miami, Hartle tallied nine strikeouts over 6.0 innings to earn his fifth win of the year. The sophomore from King, N.C. allowed six baserunners (four hits and two walks) in the contest, holding the Miami offense to just one run. In his final inning of work, Hartle recorded his eighth strikeout of the contest which set his career high in strikeouts for a season (55) before punching out the final batter of his outing.
- Against Clemson, Hartle earned the sixth win of his sophomore season on Saturday, tossing a season-high tying seven innings of one run baseball. Hartle punched out eight batters while conceding just five hits and one walk. Hartle notched four-straight scoreless frames on the mound to end his start and keep Clemson's offense at bay. Hartle stranded a pair in scoring position with a strikeout and groundout in the fourth before tossing back-to-back 1-2-3 frames in the fifth and sixth innings as the lefthander retired eight-straight batters.
- Against Cornell, Hartle posted the best outing of his career, fanning a career-high 12 batters in a career-high tying seven innings.
- The Sunday prior, Hartle fanned a then-career high 11 batters in six innings while allowing no earned runs and no walks for his second victory of 2023. Hartle struckout multiple batters in his last four innings, highlighted by a trio of punchouts in the fourth and sixth.
- Hartle became just the second pitcher in Wake Forest history to make 14 starts as a freshman in 2022 as well as the sixth Deac in program history to earn seven victories of the season (second most on the 2022 squad).

**NICKY NUKES**

- After one of the greatest seasons by a Wake Forest freshman in school history, Nick Kurtz has impressed during the first half of his sophomore season.
- Kurtz ranks in the top 10 of the ACC in slugging percentage, runs per game, RBIs per game, on-base percentage and home runs. In 21 games, the Lancaster, Pa. native has tallied eight multi-hit games and seven multi-RBI games.
- Currently, Kurtz ranks in the top 15 among Division 1 players in career on-base percentage (10th) and slugging percentage (12th).
- In both of Wake Forest's wins against Notre Dame, Kurtz tallied a long fly to pace the Demon Deacon offense. In Wake Forest's 12-3 win, Kurtz went 3-4 with two RBIs, three runs scored and one walk.
- Kurtz earned the first ACC Player of the Week honors of his career after leading Wake Forest at the plate in its perfect 4-0 opening weekend with a team-high tying .500 batting average to go along with a team-high tying six hits, team-high tying four home runs, team-best 10 RBIs and team-best eight runs scored. Additionally, Kurtz led the team with a 1.500 slugging percentage, seven walks and .684 on-base percentage.
- In Wake Forest's season opener, Kurtz broke the game open with a grand slam in the second inning before pushing Wake Forest's advantage to 8-0 after another long fly to right field in the bottom of the fourth to tie his career high of two home runs while adding five RBIs total.
- Kurtz needs just one more base knock to tally 100 career hits.

**CERTIFIED STOPPER CAMDEN MINACCI**

- A staple out of Wake Forest's bullpen the last two seasons, Camden Minacci earned the eighth save of his junior season after inducing the final three outs of Sunday's series-opening victory versus NC State. The career-best mark leads the ACC and ranks third nationally.
- Over the course of his career, Minacci has registered 16 saves as the Tampa, Fla. native moved into a tie for the fourth-most saves by a Demon Deacon ever. Currently, Minacci is 10th among active players in Division I baseball in saves.

## HEAD COACH TOM WALTER



## HEAD COACH | 14TH YEAR | GEORGETOWN, 1991 | IN THE DUGOUT | WEARS NO. 32

A proven program builder and player developer, Tom Walter enters his 14th season as the head coach of Wake Forest baseball in 2023.

With 366 wins as the Demon Deacon skipper, he sits as the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only George Greer (608 wins).

Additionally, Walter is one of just two active head coaches in the country to lead three different programs to the NCAA Division I Tournament, becoming just the seventh coach all-time to do so. He joins the ranks of Larry Cochell, Augie Garrido, Sunny Golloway, Andy Lopez, Ron Polk and Jack Stallings, while Randy Mazzy joined that group after Walter.

On April 10, 2022, Walter picked up the 350th win at the helm of the Demon Deacon baseball program as Wake Forest swept Big Four rival Duke for the first time since 2008.

Walter has helped 44 players get drafted or sign pro contracts over the last eight years, including six Deacs drafted among the top 50 picks and back-to-back first rounders in 2021 (Ryan Cusick) and 2020 (Jared Shuster).

#ProDeacs in the major leagues include Gavin Sheets (2021), Stuart Fairchild (2021) and Nate Mondou (2022), who all have made their MLB debuts in the last two seasons. In addition to Sheets, Fairchild and Mondou reaching the Major Leagues, active professional players Walter coached at Wake Forest include Parker Dunshee (AAA, A's), Connor Johnstone (AAA, Braves), Jared Shuster (AAA, Braves), Johnny Aiello (AAA, Blue Jays), Morgan McSweney (AAA, Orioles), Ryan Cusick (AA, A's), Patrick Frick (AA, Mariners), Colin Peluse (AA, A's), Griffin Roberts (A, Cardinals), Will Simoneit (AA, A's), William Fleming (AA, Royals), Shane Muntz (AA, Diamondbacks), Bobby Seymour (High A, Rays) and Antonio Menendez (High A, Rays).

While at Wake Forest, Walter has overseen the development of 2016 National Player of the Year Will Craig, 2019 ACC Player of the Year Bobby Seymour and Wake Forest's first-ever ACC Pitcher of the Year Rhett Lowder in 2022. Additionally, Walter has guided Craig, Nate Mondou, Stuart Fairchild, Gavin Sheets, Ben Breazeale, DJ Poteet, Seymour, Chris Lanzilli, Brock Wilken, Eric Adler, Lowder, Brendan Tinsman, Nick Kurtz and Tommy Hawke to All-America selections as well as a total of 26 All-ACC honorees.

Walter guided the Demon Deacons to one of the best baseball seasons at Wake Forest ever in 2022. The Deacs finished the campaign with 41 victories, the fifth most in program history and increased its win total by 21 games (41 wins to 20 wins), the largest year-to-year turnaround in program history.

Wake Forest was selected to the 2022 NCAA Baseball Tournament, the program's 14th appearance in the national playoffs and the third tournament appearance in Walter's tenure, after posting the program's seventh 40-win season.

Wake Forest ended the regular season with 39 wins, tying the 1999 Demon Deacons for the second-most regular season wins in program history won their first 11 games. At that point of the season, Wake Forest stood as one of five unbeaten teams in Division I.

- Bill Cilentio enters his 14th year at Wake Forest in 2022, after being promoted to Associate Head Coach in January 2019. He works primarily with the Demon Deacon hitters and infielders.

- In his time as a coach, 65 of his student-athletes have gone on to play professionally, including seven big leaguers.

- Cilentio mentored former San Francisco Giant Mac Williamson, who was recruited to Wake Forest as a pitcher. After transitioning to outfield, Williamson went on to earn All-ACC honors and was drafted in the third round before working his way to the MLB.

- He also oversaw the development of National Player of the Year Will Craig, the first-round pick of the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2016. After not making an all-conference team his freshman year, Craig's improvement earned him ACC Player of the Year honors in 2015 and made him a unanimous first team All-American in 2016. Stuart Fairchild and Gavin Sheets were both All-Americans and top-50 overall selections in the 2017 MLB Draft.

- Cilentio guided Bobby Seymour en route to ACC Player of the Year honors in 2019 as Seymour led the ACC in hitting and led the nation with 92 RBIs. The 2019 Deacs led the ACC with 7.84 runs per game, also batting .289 as a team with 77 homers.

- Wake Forest has had 19 hitters earn all-ACC honors the last five seasons, including All-Americans Craig, Fairchild, Sheets, Seymour, Nate Mondou, Ben Breazeale, Chris Lanzilli, Brendan Tinsman and Nick Kurtz.

- The Demon Deacons have developed into one of the nation's top offenses under Cilentio's watch. Wake Forest has ranked in the top 50 nationally in home runs in six of the past seven seasons, also ranking among the nation's leaders in batting average, doubles, walks, slugging and OBP every season. In 2018 after losing six offensive starters, Cilentio guided three rookies (Bobby Seymour, Chris Lanzilli and DJ Poteet) Freshman All-America honors.

- The 2022 Deacs combined for one of the best offensive seasons in program history and across Division I baseball. Wake Forest broke program records for home runs (122), walks (364), RBIs (535), runs scored (561), runs per game (9.1), slugging percentage (.548), 20-run games (four), 20-run games in ACC play (two), runs in ACC game (27) and hits in an ACC game (28) while ranking in the top-10 nationally in every offensive category and leading the conference in walks, hits, home runs and runs.

- Corey Muscara begins his second season with the Demon Deacons after being officially added to the staff on July 2, 2021. Muscara works directly with the Wake Forest pitching staff.

- The Wake Forest arms made a drastic improvement in 2022 under Muscara's guidance as the Demon Deacons dropped their team ERA by a whole run per game from 2021 to 2022 and finished in the top half of the ACC in runs allowed per game. Wake Forest's pitching staff got off to a hot start, giving up just 11 runs through the first four games, the fewest number of runs the Deacs have allowed in the first four games in head coach Tom Walter's tenure. Additionally, Wake Forest held ACC opponents to three runs or less in 13 games, highlighted by victories over Louisville and Virginia, top-five scoring offenses in the nation.

- Under Muscara's guidance, Rhett Lowder posted one of the best seasons by a Wake Forest pitcher in program history. Lowder became the first pitcher and the third Deac ever to be named a Unanimous All-American and the first Demon Deacon ever to be named ACC Pitcher of the Year. Additionally, Lowder was selected as a finalist for the Collegiate National Pitcher of the Year Award as well as a First Team All-ACC and ABCA/Rawlings First Team All-Region selection. The sophomore finished the season with a 11-3 record in 99.1 innings, becoming just the fifth pitcher in program history and the first since 2002 to reach 11 victories in a season. Overall, Lowder entered the NCAA Tournament as one of four pitchers in the nation with 11 wins, which was also an ACC best.

- Muscara also instructed Josh Hartle to one of the best freshman seasons for a Wake Forest pitcher ever. Hartle made 14 starts as Wake Forest's Saturday starter, just one of two pitchers in program history to do so and became just the sixth freshman in program history to earn seven victories in a season. Hartle conceded just one earned run in six starts, while fanning at least six batters in five outings.

- Muscara guided Teddy McGraw's seamless transition to the weekend rotation as the sophomore earned a career-high five wins, good for third on the team, and held opponents to a batting average of .203, the lowest on the squad. McGraw ended the 2022 campaign on a high note, allowing one run or less in six-straight appearances to end the season.

- Out of the bullpen, Camden Minacci became one of the best closers in the nation, finishing with lowest ERA on team (2.18) as well as six saves. Minacci was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason and Midseason Watch Lists.

- Matt Wessinger was officially added to the Wake Forest baseball coaching staff on Aug. 25, 2022. Wessinger joins the Deacs with a wealth of experience as a coach and player, most recently serving as an assistant coach at Hofstra for the last five seasons. Wessinger will focus on the Demon Deacon baserunning and defense.

- Wessinger was instrumental in Hofstra's magical 2022 season as the Pride earned the program's first ever berth in the NCAA Baseball Tournament, compiling 30 wins and winning the team's first ever Colonial Athletic Association Championship.

- Hofstra finished the 2022 campaign third in the CAA in batting average while finishing in the top half of the league in hits, doubles, triples and fielding percentage.

- Overall, Wessinger has seen seven student-athletes drafted or signed during his time at Hofstra.

- Wessinger was a three-year letterwinner and two-time captain at St. John's from 2009-12 and put together one of the best careers in Red Storm program history. St. John's made three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2010-12, highlighted by a Super Regional appearance in 2012, and won two Big East Championships (2010 and 2012).

- Wessinger, who was a Third Team All-America as a senior, holds several St. John's records as he is the all-time leader in games played (229), at bats (874), and hits (278). He also ranks second in runs scored (194), third in RBIs (173), third in doubles (60) and second in total bases (406).

- Following Wessinger's illustrious collegiate career, he played five seasons in the professional ranks. After being selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 37th round (1,116th overall) in 2011, Wessinger was drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the fifth round the following year.

- The Liverpool, N.Y. native hit the diamond in 63 games with the Grand Junction Rockies during his rookie season, batting .274 with four home runs, eight doubles, three triples and 27 RBIs.



## DAVID F. COUCH BALLPARK &amp; CHRIS HURD PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTER

- David F. Couch Ballpark is home to the Demon Deacon baseball team. The Deacons moved in to the facility before the start of the 2009 season after playing the previous 28 seasons on campus at historic Gene Hooks Stadium.
- Formerly known as Ernie Shore Field, the park was home to Winston-Salem's Carolina League minor league team for more than 40 years. Wake Forest purchased the facility after the team, now known as the Winston-Salem Dash, moved in to a new downtown ballpark.
- In February 2016, Wake Forest baseball park was renamed David F. Couch Ballpark in honor of former baseball player David Couch ('84). A longtime supporter of Wake Forest Athletics and the baseball program, Couch made the lead gift toward a new \$12 million facility, which opened in February 2017, and included construction of a new dugout and bullpen, locker room, equipment room, training room, team lounge, nutrition area, and pitching lab.
- The latest phase of the Chris Hurd Player Development Center was made possible, in part, thanks to the generosity of Chris and Nancy Hurd who made the lead gift toward the project. It features a team meeting room, dedicated video room, coaches' offices, a biomechanist's office, a conference room, game day suites, and a baseball heritage area. It was dedicated on Oct. 12, 2018, and the construction wrapped up in January 2019.
- With the completion of the pitching lab inside the Chris Hurd Player Development Center at David F. Couch Ballpark, the state-of-the-art biomechanics lab is used to develop Wake Forest student-athletes and transform the game of baseball. Wake Forest Athletics is partnering with Wake Forest Baptist Health on a historic agreement, which combines the two units to enhance player safety and development. On Wake Forest's side, pitching coach Corey Muscara, pitching lab coordinator Mike McFerran, athletic trainer Jeff Strahm and strength coach Mark Seaver works with Wake Baptist's Dr. Brian Waterman, the team physician specializing in shoulder and elbow care, and biophysicist Dr. Kristen Nicholson.
- Wake Forest players also have access to state-of-the-art technology with the Trackman Pro video system with cameras set up on both the first and third base dugouts, center field and behind home plate. The system allows hitters to view their swings and pitchers their pitching motions following each game, and tracks 27 different data points varying from pitch velocity to spin rate to launch angle.
- Other renovations include:
  - 2020: New FieldTurf DoublePlay Classic surface installed prior to the season.
  - 2015: Visiting clubhouse converted into state-of-the-art weight room facility.
  - 2013: Multi-colored chairback seats replaced with modern all-black seats.
  - 2012: 18' x 24' LED video board installed.
  - 2011: AstroTurf GameDay 3D52H Grass installed, as well as the manual scoreboard in left field.
  - 2010: Indoor hitting facility built beyond left field.
  - 2009: Wake Forest purchased and moved into stadium. It previously belonged to the Winston-Salem Dash since it was built in 1956.

With the help of 10th inning heroics from Michael Turconi, the No. 23 Wake Forest baseball team tied the series against Clemson at a game a piece, winning 12-9 in extra innings Saturday at David F. Couch Ballpark.

Down two strikes with two outs and runners on first and second, Turconi blasted the ball over the wall and into the second set of bushes. The three-run home run, which traveled 404 feet, was his seventh round-tripper of the season and the third of the game for the Demon Deacons.

It marked the first walk off for Wake Forest since March 7, 2020 when Will Simoneit helped the Demon Deacons beat No. 3 Louisville, 3-2, with a home run in the bottom of the ninth.

The Deacs jumped on the Tigers early with the help of two long balls in the opening frames. With the bags juiced, Brendan Tinsman deposited the ball over the right field wall to give Wake Forest a 4-1 lead.
